



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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: Frequent rainfall will resume over eastern South Africa through the end of next week. The rain will help improve the moisture profile in most locations. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive crop development in most locations. Drier-than-normal weather will persist for western South Africa through the end of next week. Western sections of Free State and North Wes will still see periods of rain that may marginally bolster soil moisture. A few fields may remain too dry to support ideal crop conditions, though the rain should be enough to support some new growth. Eastern South Africa will see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week o Precipitation will be limited today and Saturday, though a few light showers will still occur o More widespread and significant rain will evolve Sunday into next week o Moisture totals by next Friday morning will range from 0.75-4.00" with drier pockets in Limpopo • Western South Africa will be drier biased during the coming week o Light rain will still occur at times in Western Cape and western sections of Free State and North West










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
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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Today's forecast includes less precipitation than what was advertised Thursday and the only well-organized precipitation event during the next ten days will occur tonight into Sunday when some heavy snow will fall from northeastern Nebraska and southeastern Nebraska to Michigan. U.S. DELTA: Today will be mostly dry before much of the Delta through Alabama to central and southern Georgia and northern Florida to southeastern North Carolina receive 0.75-2.0" of rain and locally more Saturday into Sunday while most of the remainder of the Southeast receives up to 0.75" and locally more. • Widespread precipitation will fall on the Delta and the Southeast Monday through next Friday and much of the region will receive 1.30-3.50" of rain and locally more.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Paraguay to Rio Grande do Sul will benefit from regular rounds of rain Sunday through Saturday, Feb. 4 and notable improvements in crop and soil conditions will result. o Some crops will likely be stressed by warm to hot and dry conditions in advance of the coming rain, but serious stress may not occur in most areas as long as rain occurs as advertised. • Much of the remainder of Brazil wil see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will bring enough rain to favorably support crop development while causing interruptions to soybean harvesting and Safrinha corn planting.

ARGENTINA: Regular rain is expected in much of the country through Thursday and further improvements in crop and soil conditions will result, but a full restoration of yield potentials will not occur as some crops were permanently damaged by hot and dry weather earlier in the season. o Corrientes will miss much of the rain other areas receive through Sunday and stress to crops will rise while yield potentials decline in the hot temperatures expected.










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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Some rain and snow will occur in parts of the region daily through Thursday o Much of this will still be erratic with limited coverage o Total moisture will vary from 0.10 to 0.75 inch with around 50% coverage 3 Some local amounts of 1.00 to 2.00 inches mainly in eastern areas • Not much precipitation is likely in the second week, Feb. 3 – 10 o Below average total moisture is expected across most of the region AUSTRALIA: Erratic shower and thunderstorm activity in eastern Australia will continue to help improve topsoil moisture for pockets of unirrigated summer crops in the next seven days. Meaningful rain will be localized which will leave a need for more rain; however, the rain that does occur will be beneficial and needed. Greater rainfall is still expected in New South Wales and Queensland during the second week of the forecast and it will be quite beneficial for sorghum and cotton, especially in unirrigated areas.









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
