



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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week. The lack of rain next week will help firm the ground in eastern South Africa. However, the ground will remain saturated during the next few days due to the additional rain. New crop development may be sluggish until the ground has a chance to firm in the wettest locations. The outlook for this season remains generally favorable, though recent flooding may have slightly production potentials in areas that experienced flooding in eastern South Africa. Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week o Disturbances will continue to generate scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms through the end of the weekend o Light rain will continue early next week before drier weather evolves later next week o Moisture totals by next Friday morning will range from 0.50-2.00" with locally greater amounts • Western South Africa will also have a few opportunities for rain during the coming week o Much of the precipitation will occur through Saturday, though a frontal boundary will also bring light rain to Western Cape late Sunday and Monday









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see several rounds of precipitation during the next two weeks that will saturate the soil in many southern and eastern areas while improvements in soil moisture in the driest in and around northeastern Nebraska and northwestern lowa will be limited due to the precipitation in that region being mostly light. o A band of heavy snow will occur from east-central and southeastern Nebraska and nearby Kansas to northern Illinois southern into eastern Wisconsin and west-central Michigan today and travel delays are likely.

U.S. DELTA: Today's forecast includes less rain overall for the Delta and the Southeast during the next two weeks with little rain starting this weekend from Georgia and northern Florida to southern Virginia while other areas see little rain Feb. 24-Mar. 2. o Additional rain today from the far southern Delta to western Alabama and west-central and northern Georgia will cause some local flooding with the Delta to northern Alabama seeing additional rain Tuesday into next Thursday.









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
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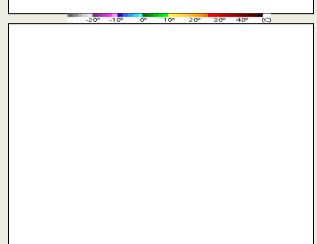
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Paraguay and much of Brazil outside of some northeastern and far southern areas will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will maintain favorable conditions for crop development while causing interruptions to fieldwork. o Some fieldwork will advance around the rain, especially through Friday when rain is limited in northern Brazil, with additional stretches of drier weather needed soon to ensure soybeans are harvested in time to allow the Safrinha corn crop to be planted during the favorable period.

ARGENTINA: A drier weather pattern will occur through Feb. 24 and despite cooler temperatures along with recent rain, some crops will likely become stressed again as many areas did not receive enough rain to induce more than temporary increases in soil molsture. • A close watch will be made a rain event advertised for Feb. 25-27 as that event may arrive in time to maintain some of the improvements in crop conditions that result from recent rain.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: The need for greater precipitation still continues to increase as spring gets closer. Precipitation will continue to be below average in a majority of the region through at least the next seven days with above to well above average temperatures. Greater precipitation is likely in the second week, particularly in southern areas.

AUSTRALIA: Rainfall in the next two weeks is not expected to be enough to counter evaporation in eastern Australia which will lead to more crop stress in unirrigated fields. Completely dry weather is not expected though too. There will be some erratic showers and thunderstorms.









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
