



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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa's main production areas will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine this week. The precipitation will be enough to support good late-season development conditions for the more advanced coarse grains, oilseeds, sugarcane, and other crops. However, portions of Northern Cape and western sections of Free State and North West will not receive enough rain to significantly impact long-term soil conditions. A good shot of rain may be needed later in March to maintain favorable late-season growth. Beastern and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine this week o A disturbance will initially generate light rain through Wednesday before more significant rain evolves later this week and weekend o Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 0.50-3.00" in much of Natal, Mpumalanga, Limpopo, and eastern sections of Eastern Cape, Free State, and North West o Other areas in central South Africa will receive 0.10-1.00" of rain with locally greate amounts \(\textit{ Western South Africa will bed dier biased during the coming week o Any rain that occurs will be lost to evaporation \(\textit{ Eastern and central South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain March 7 – 13 o Western South Africa will be drier biased









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see several rounds of precipitation during the next two weeks that will saturate the soil in many southern and eastern areas while improvements in soil moisture in the driest in and around northeastern Nebraska and northwestern lowa will be limited due to the precipitation in that region being mostly light. o A band of heavy snow will occur from east-central and southeastern Nebraska and nearby Kansas to northern Illinois southern into eastern Wisconsin and west-central Michigan today and travel delays are likely.

U.S. DELTA: The Delta and the Southeast will see a tranquil weather pattern through most of the next two weeks with one round of nearly widespread rain expected Wednesday into next Friday. o A close watch will be made on next week's rain event as there is some potential for moderate to heavy rain in many areas that could cause local flooding. o Mar. 4-10 will be drier and conditions for fieldwork will improve.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Paraguay and much of Brazil outside of some northeastern and far southern areas will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will maintain favorable conditions for crop development while causing interruptions to fieldwork. o Some fieldwork will advance around the rain, especially through Friday when rain is limited in northern Brazil, with additional stretches of drier weather needed soon to ensure soybeans are harvested in time to allow the Safrinha corn crop to be planted during the favorable period.

ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter overall for central and northern Argentina during the next two weeks than what was advertised earlier this week, but with temperatures expected to be warm to hot through at least the next week and soil moisture already short in many areas, overall increases in crop stress should occur in many areas. o Stress to crops will be eased by each round of rain, but outside of areas where rain is locally heavy, improvements in crop and soil conditions should be temporary. o Southern Argentina is likely to be disfavored for significant rain during each of the two rain events and most areas should see steady increases in crop stress and declines in yield potentials.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: The need for greater precipitation still continues to increase as spring gets closer. Precipitation will continue to be below average in a majority of the region through at least the next seven days with above to well above average temperatures. Greater precipitation is likely in the second week, particularly in southern areas.

AUSTRALIA Rainfall in eastern Australia will continue to be quite limited through at least the next seven to ten days. There may be some increase of rain after March 2; though, confidence is a little low. The dryness and hot temperatures will continue to stress unirrigated crops in both Queensland and New South Wales; though, southern Queensland has been particularly dry lately.









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
