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

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
South Africa - Weather


SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa's main production areas will receive rain on a frequent basis through the middle of next week. Rainfall will be enough to keep soil moisture near current levels or bolster soil moisture. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive development. Fieldwork may otherwise be sluggish. • Eastern and central South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week o Disturbances will often generate scattered showers during this time with some of the most significant rain occurring late Thursday into early next week o Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.75-3.00" with drier pockets in western sections of Free State and North West • Western South Africa will receive variable rainfall during the coming week o Western Cape will have several opportunities for rain with totals ranging from 0.50-2.00" and locally greater amounts by next Wednesday morning o Northern Cape will receive little to no rain • Eastern and central South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain March 9 – 15 o Western South Africa will be drier biased



Precipitation Forecasts







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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see two rounds of well-organized precipitation during the next two weeks while relatively tranquil conditions occur during the remainder of the period. o The first significant precipitation event will occur Thursday into Friday and some heavy rain and local flooding is likely from west-central Missouri to Kentucky, Ohio, and Michigan. 2 A band of heavy snow is likely as well with northeastern Missouri to southeastern Wisconsin and Michigan favored for the heaviest

U.S. DELTA: The Delta and the Southeast will a few rounds of precipitation during the next two weeks that will slow fieldwork, but precipitation will be lightest in the south where some early-season fieldwork should advance. O A large area of moderate to heavy rain will occur from the central and northern Delta to North Carolina and southern Virginia today into Friday and some local flooding will likely result.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Paraguay and much of Brazil outside of some northeastern and far southern areas will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will maintain favorable conditions for crop development while causing interruptions to fieldwork. o Some fieldwork will advance around the rain, especially through Friday when rain is limited in northern Brazil, with additional stretches of drier weather needed soon to ensure soybeans are harvested in time to allow the Safrinha corn crop to be planted during the favorable period.

ARGENTINA: Much of northern Argentina will benefit from rain today into Saturday while much of central and southern will be warm to hot and mostly dry and will see rising levels of crop stress and declining yield potentials. Sunday through Friday of next week will be warm to hot and dry in most areas and stress to crops and declines in yield potentials will steadily increase with some temporary relief likely to result most days in a few western areas where some showers will occur. • Rain may increase Mar. 11-13, but confidence for this event is low and the precipitation will come too late for some crops and without follow-up rain stress to crops should quickly return.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Coverage of precipitation will start to increase in the upcoming week which should be good for the upcoming growing season. Precipitation in the second week of the outlook is expected to be greater than the first week and possibly above average in a large portion of Europe.

AUSTRALIA: Dryness will continue to be an issue for unirrigated fields in eastern Australia the next two weeks. Completely dry conditions are not expected; however, unusually hot temperatures will cause net drying to continue which will be stressful for unirrigated crops.









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
