

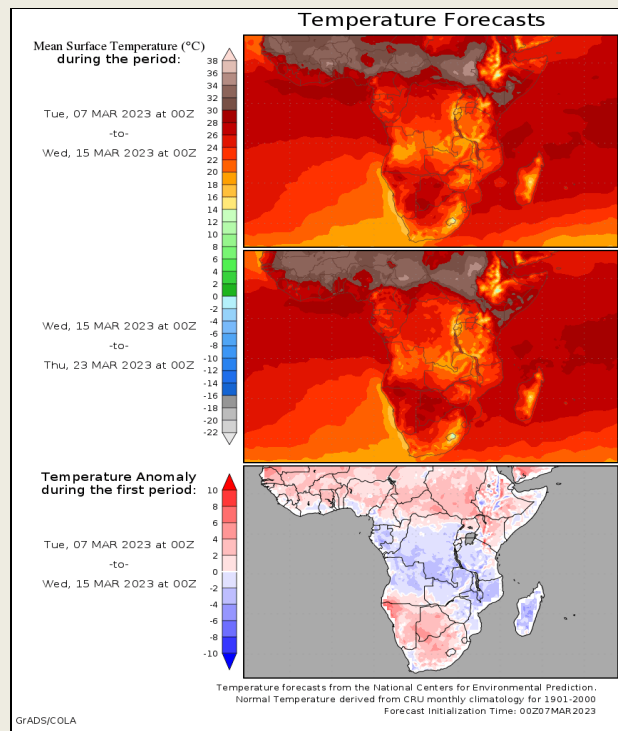
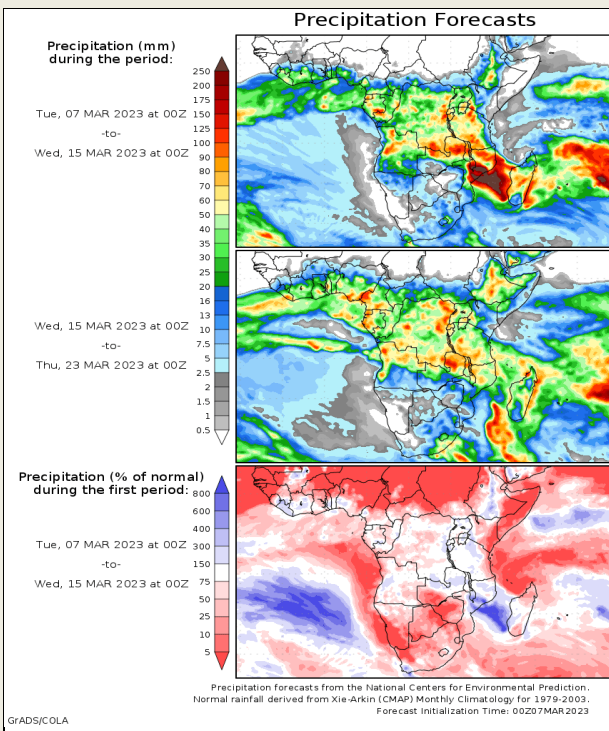
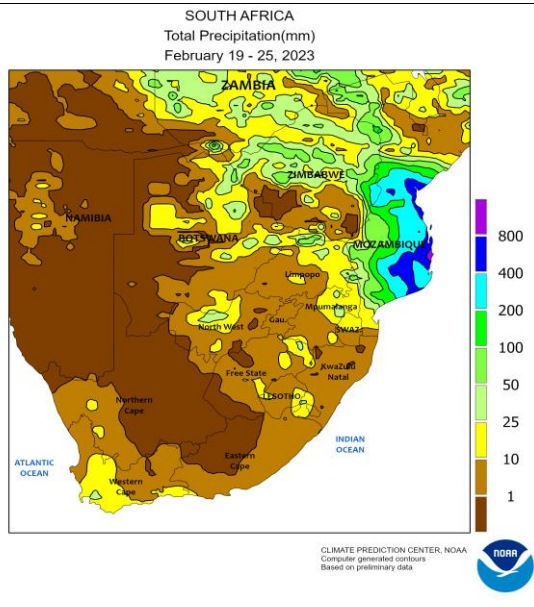
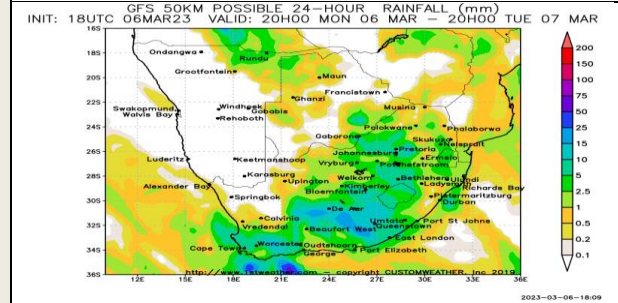
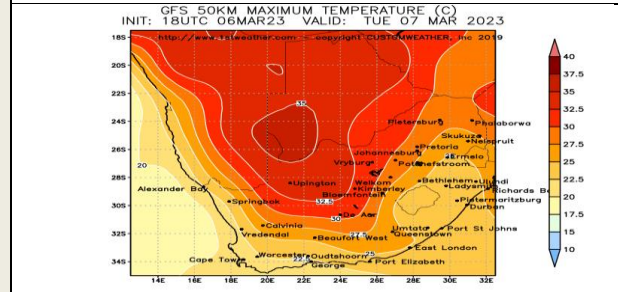
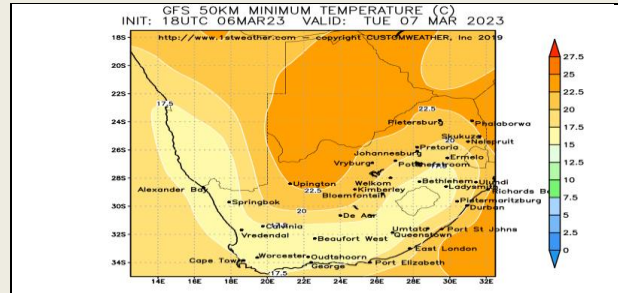


Weather Report

07 March 2023

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : The main production areas in South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine this week. Many areas will not receive enough rain to significantly bolster soil moisture, though most fields will still have adequate amounts of moisture in the coming days. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive crop development despite several areas drying down later in the week. Early season crop maturation conditions will be mostly good as well. South Africa will see a mix of erratic rainfall and sunshine this week. A disturbance will generate the most widespread rain through mid-week. Periods of light rain will continue for southern and eastern South Africa later this week and weekend while drier weather is slated for most other locations. Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 0.10-1.00" with drier pockets in Northern Cape. South Africa will again see a mix of rain and sunshine March 14 – 20. Rainfall will likely be greatest in the eastern production areas.

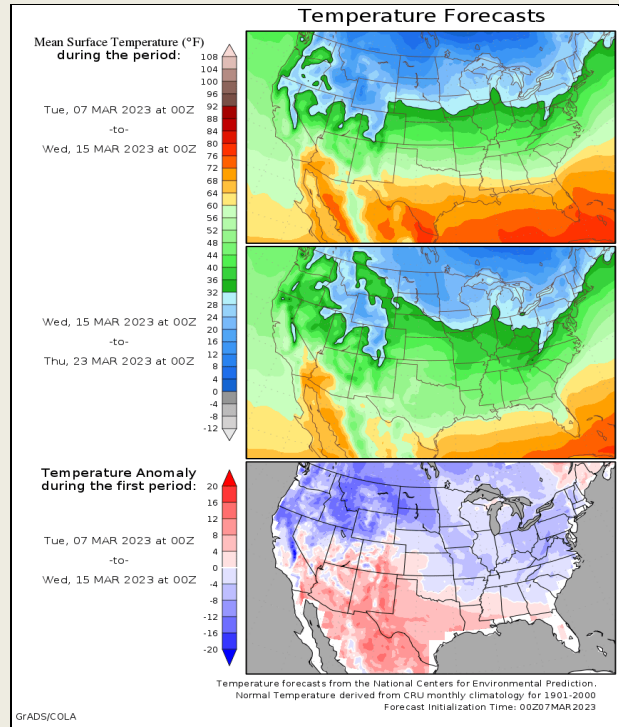
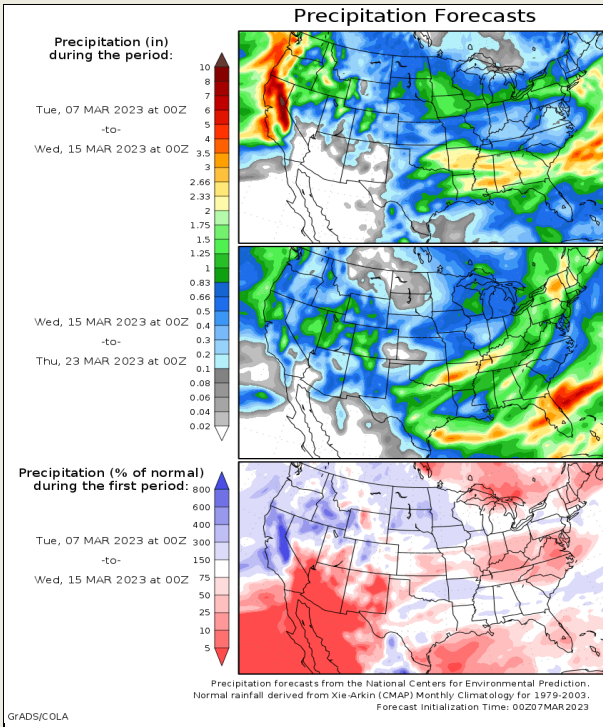
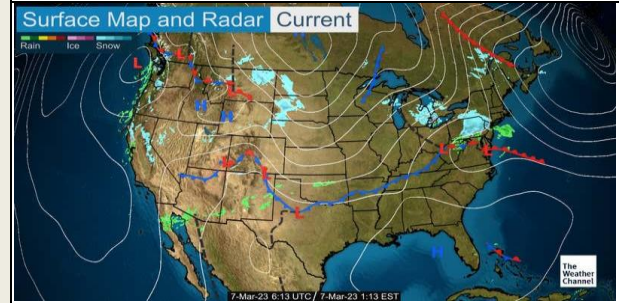
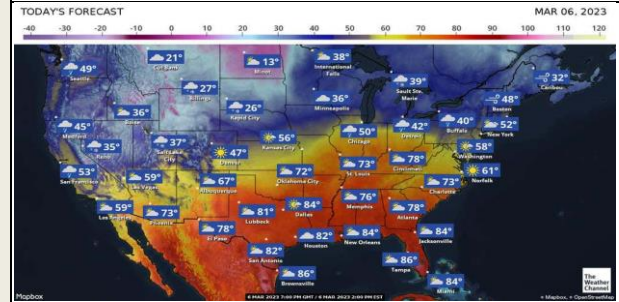
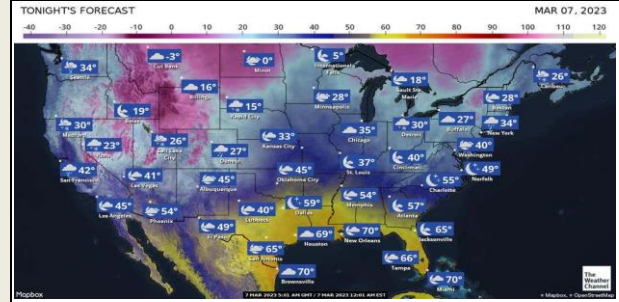
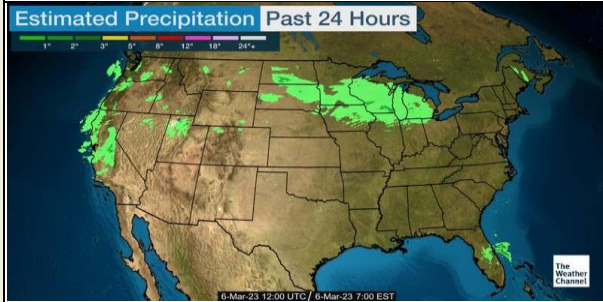

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Rain and snow fell during the weekend from eastern Kansas to the eastern Corn Belt with heavy rain reported from central Illinois to central and southwestern Ohio as well as in northern Kentucky and southern Indiana while snow and some rain fell from eastern South Dakota to east-central Iowa and southern Wisconsin. Today's forecast is wetter than what was advertised late last week and a frequent succession of disturbances will cross the Midwest during the next two weeks keeping soil moisture high in much of the region and leaving many areas vulnerable to flooding if a heavy rain event were to occur soon.

U.S. DELTA : Rain fell during the weekend from northeastern Louisiana to the northern Delta through northern to eastern to southern Georgia and the northern Florida Panhandle with much of the Carolinas and southern Virginia also see rain. The Delta and the Southeast will regular rounds of precipitation during the next two weeks that will slow fieldwork, but precipitation will be lightest in the south where some early-season fieldwork should advance.

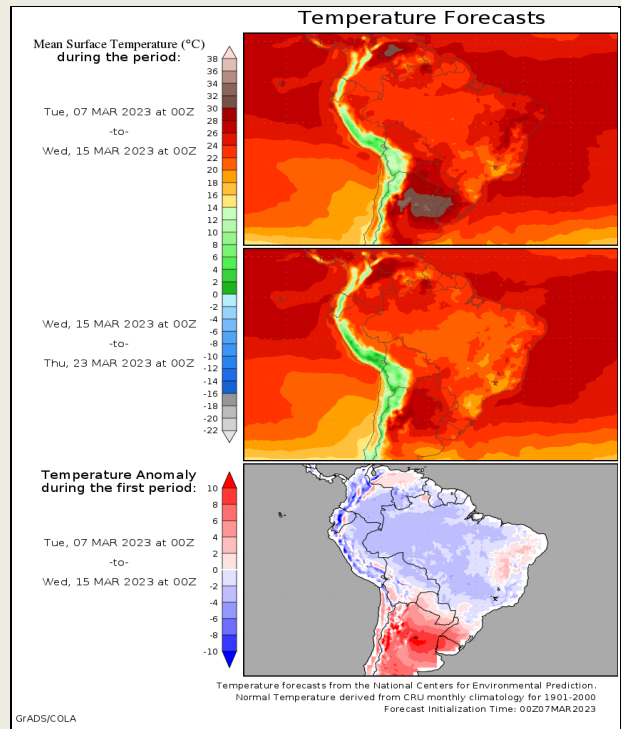
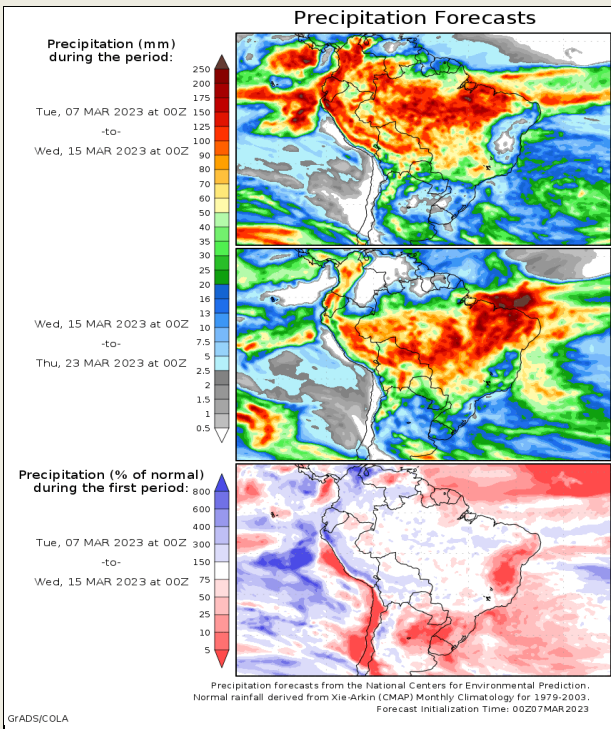
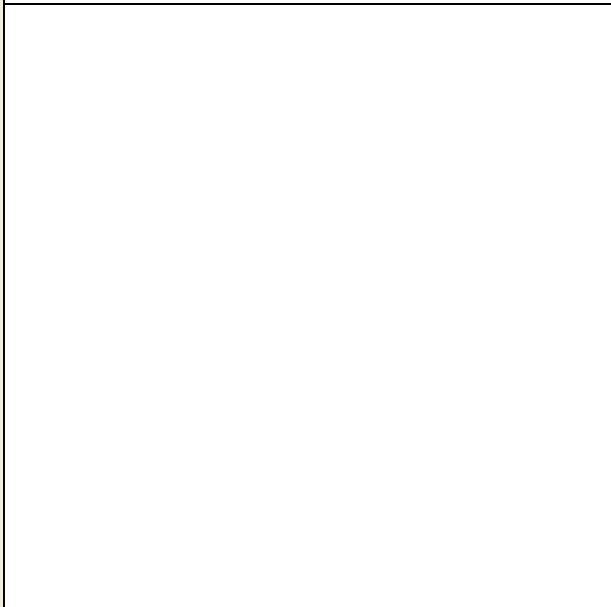
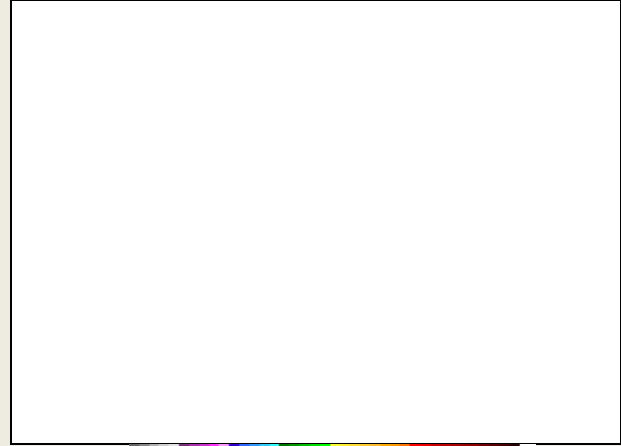

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain and interruptions to fieldwork were common during the weekend from central and southern Paraguay and Rio Grande do Sul to southern Goias and west-central and southern Minas Gerais as well as from western through central Mato Grosso. Paraguay and much of Brazil outside of some northeastern areas will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will maintain favorable conditions for crop development while causing interruptions to fieldwork

ARGENTINA : Much of Argentina was hot and dry and saw rising levels of crop stress during the weekend with rain reported in southern and east-central Buenos Aires, northeastern Entre Rios to Corrientes, and west-central Cordoba. Portions of western and southern Argentina will benefit from regular rounds of showers through this weekend while warm to hot and mostly dry conditions elsewhere should cause further increases in crop stress and reductions in yield potentials.

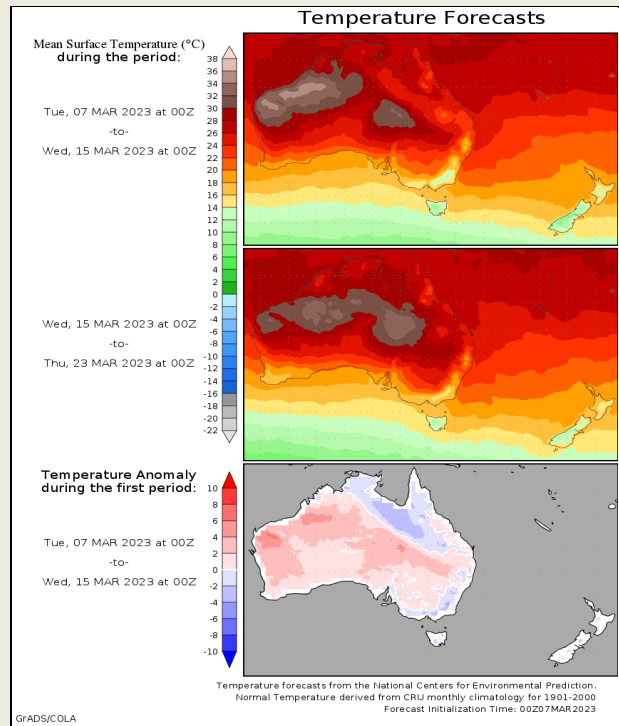
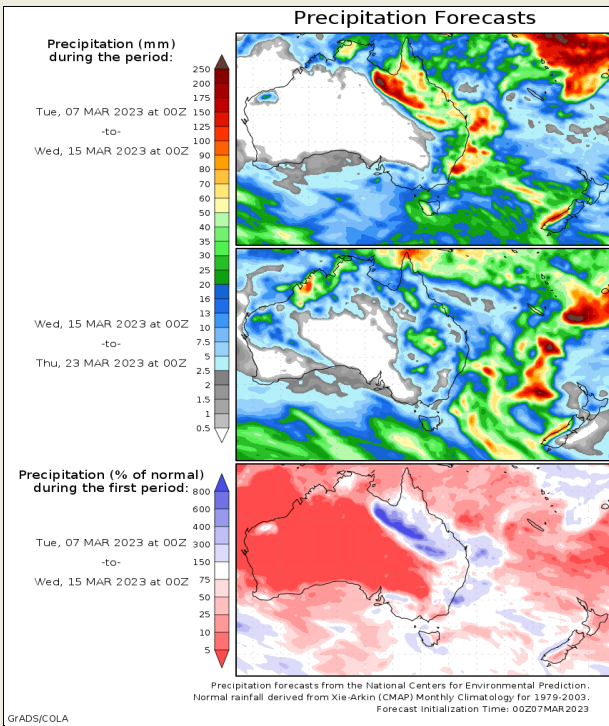
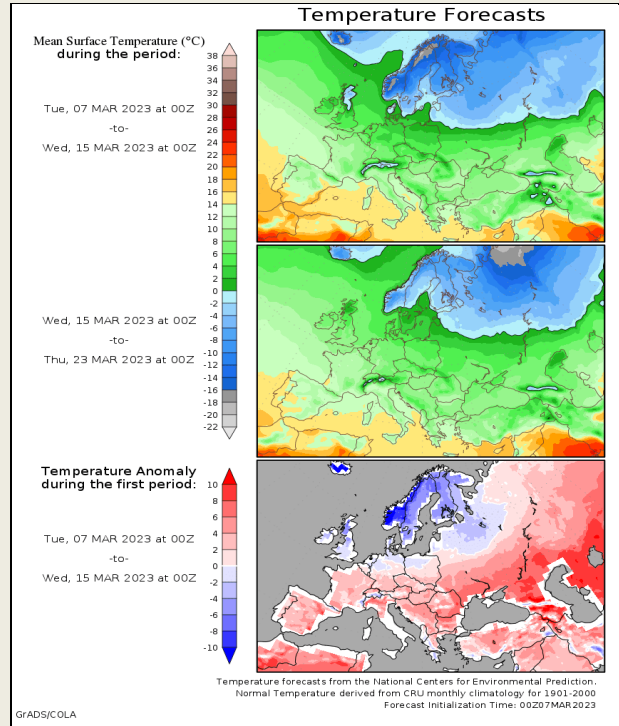
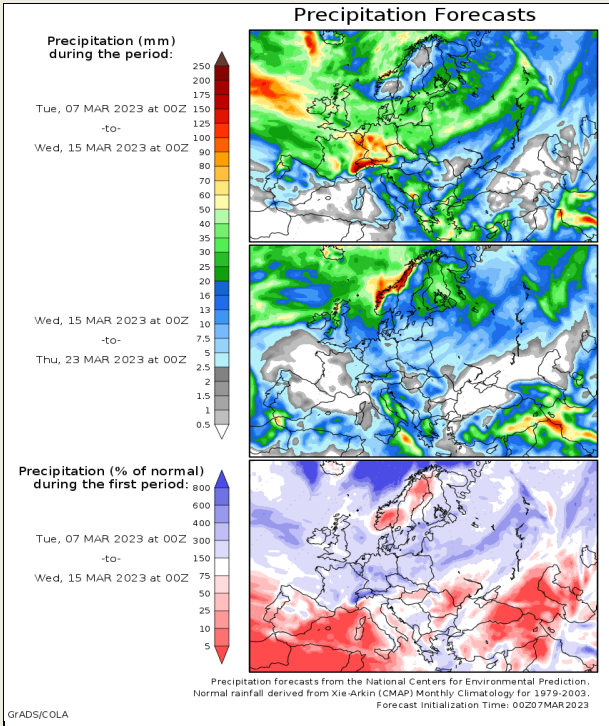

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Precipitation will significantly increase in northern production areas in the first week of the outlook. Southern production areas will trend drier. Rain and some snow will occur in parts of the region daily through Sunday. The precipitation will be greatest and most frequent in the north. Total moisture will vary from: 1.00 to 4.00 inches in the northern half of the region to 0.50 inch in the southern half, locally more than 1.00 inch. Frequent precipitation will occur in the second week, March 13 – 20. The precipitation will be near to above average in most of the region.

AUSTRALIA : Central Queensland will receive some welcome rain during the middle part of this week. Today's forecast model runs have changed allowing some of the moisture to advance southward into southeastern Queensland and northern New South Wales during the Friday through Tuesday period. All of the rain will be welcome and it should benefit dryland crops as well as the irrigated crop.
