






Market Report : 19 May 2023

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Periods of rain are still slated for portions of South Africa during the coming week. The rain may slow harvesting in eastern South Africa, though most producers will have ample opportunities to get into the fields. Winter wheat planting will also advance around the rain. Western Cape, Northern Cape, and Free State will either have enough moisture to support favorable establishment and growth for the wheat. 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



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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Much of the Midwest remained dry and likely saw good planting progress Wednesday with light rain noted in some northwestern locations Wednesday evening. The late-season freezes and frost that occurred this morning were not likely in areas where little corn or soybeans have emerged and the cold should not have a significant impact on crops. Planting should advance rapidly during the next two weeks as rain will be infrequent and often light in most areas with today's forecast wetter for parts of the western Corn Belt May 25-26.

U.S. DELTA : Most areas from east-central and southeastern Mississippi to northern Florida and southern and central into eastern Georgia and western, southern and eastern South Carolina received rain Wednesday while most other areas were dry and saw improving to favorable conditions for planting. The Delta and the Southeast will see regular rounds of rain through Sunday with some of the moisture beneficial from northern Florida to central and southern Georgia. Much of the rain should not be heavy enough to cause more than temporary disruptions to fieldwork and planting should quickly accelerate when drier weather returns Monday through June 1.





Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will be greatest in the southern half of the region. This includes Spain and Portugal as well which will be very beneficial; however, the rain in this part of the region will be coming a bit too late for unirrigated crops due to how long the dryness has lasted. Follow-up rain will be needed in Spain and Portugal. Rain farther east in Italy and the Balkan Countries is not nearly as welcome and the area is becoming too wet. Drying is needed in south-central parts of the continent to improve spring planting conditions. Rain in the north will be mostly light allowing fieldwork to advance around it. AUSTRALIA : Any shower activity in the next seven days will be limited mainly to southern coastal areas and even this will likely be minimal. The dry-biased weather will be great for fieldwork progress, but more rain would be good for ensuring the best planting, emergence, and establishment conditions. In the second week of the outlook, rain is likely to increase in southwestern Western Australia.



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
