South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : The main production areas in South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week. The periods of rain will potentially slow late-season harvesting, though producers will have several opportunities to get into the fields between rain events. Winter wheat planting will likely advance around the rain, as well. Much of Western Cape, Northern Cape, and Free State will have enough moisture to support favorable establishment and growth. South Africa will experience alternating periods of rain and sunshine through the end of next week. Other than a few isolated showers, the country will be mostly dry today. Light rain will be scattered across portions of eastern and central South Africa Saturday. A disturbance and frontal boundary will promote more widespread rain Sunday into Wednesday before drier weather returns Thursday. Western Cape, southern Northern Cape, and Eastern Cape will receive 0.75- 3.00" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Friday morning. Natal, Free State, Mpumalanga, North West, and southern Limpopo will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain. The remaining locations will receive 0.10-0.50" of moisture.




SOUTH AFRICA

May 14 - 20, 2023





Temperature Forecasts








Temperature forecasts from the National Centers for Environmental Prediction.

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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : The Midwest will see much more sunshine than rain during the next two weeks and planting should soon be completed in much of the region. o Much of the region will dry down significantly leaving many areas in need of rain to keep soil conditions favorable. o No well-organized precipitation events are expected with shower activity minimal through Monday before showers become more numerous Tuesday through Sunday, June 4.

U.S. DELTA : The Delta through Georgia and northern Florida will see dry weather through much of the next two weeks and planting should soon be completed in much of the region while the drying will lead to a growing need for rain, especially in the southern Delta where topsoil moisture is already marginal to short. o A few light showers will occur on occasion with most areas seeing welcome rain June 3-5, but greater rain will be needed soon to bolster soil moisture so that crops can withstand periods of hot and dry weather during the summer.





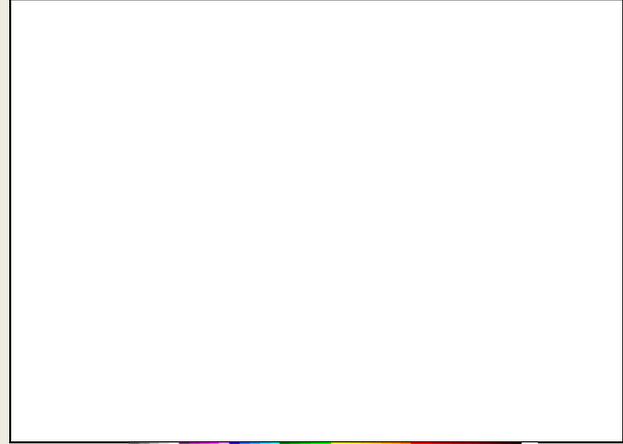


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Paraguay and Brazil will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through the next two weeks with notable exceptions occurring Friday into Wednesday when Paraguay and Mato Grosso do Sul to Sao Paulo, Parana, and far southern Brazil receive significant rain. o Northeastern Brazil will see regular rounds of mostly light showers through the period.

ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina will receive rain today into Friday that will benefit winter wheat areas before drier weather this weekend through June 7 allows fieldwork to quickly increase and become aggressive.







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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Dryness relief will continue in Spain and Portugal in the next seven days. In other areas of southern Europe though, the rain will not be as welcome due to fieldwork delays and some additional flooding. Rain will be significant in the south but barely any rain in the northern half of the region. The topsoil will continue to dry out in the north, but for now, this is good for aggressive fieldwork advancement. Northern areas will need more rain in early June.

AUSTRALIA : Any rain shower activity in the next seven days will occur mostly in far southern areas, especially near the coast. The limited rainfall will be good for fieldwork advancement; however, soil moisture is decreasing and the need for greater rainfall is increasing.



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
