



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
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
#### South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine during the coming week. The periods of rain may slow late-season harvesting and general fieldwork, though most producers will have several opportunities for aggressive fieldwork. No significant quality declines are expected for the unharvested crops. Winter wheat planting will also advance swiftly around the rain. Western and central South Africa will have enough moisture to support establishment and growth for the wheat as well. B South Africa will experience alternating periods of rain and sunshine during the coming week o An upper-level disturbance will promote the most widespread rain today and Wednesday o Portions of western and southern South Africa will also receive light rain late Friday and this weekend o Natal, Mpumalanga, Free State, Eastern Cape, and southwestern Western Cape will receive 0.50-2.00" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning









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
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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will see two more weeks of below-normal rain and the drying expected will raise the risk for crop stress during the early to middle part of June in some of the drier areas with a larger part of the Midwest likely see to crop stress by the middle of June if greater rain does not evolve. O Some showers will occur and the northwestern Corn Belt will benefit from at least some rain during the next few days with most of the western Corn Belt seeing rain Friday through Sunday.

U.S. DELTA: The Delta and the Southeast will dry down overall during the next two weeks with two rounds of timely rain advertised for June 6-8 and June 10-12 likely to keep most areas from becoming excessively dry during the period. B Much of the region will be left in need greater rain to ensure crops can withstand periods of hot and dry weather during the summer. B Soil moisture is great enough in much of the region to keep crop conditions favorable through the next two weeks while topsoil moisture is already short in the southern Delta where some areas may soon see increasing crop stress









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



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
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
#### South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Paraguay and Brazil will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through the next two weeks with notable exceptions occurring today into Wednesday when Mato Grosso do Sul to Sao Paulo receive significant rain and June 7-9 when Paraguay and southern Brazil receive rain. o Northeastern Brazil will see regular rounds of mostly light showers through the period. ARGENTINA: Fieldwork should advance well through most of the next two weeks with light showers through Sunday not likely to cause much disruption to farming activity before nearly widespread rain Monday into Thursday of next week interrupts fieldwork while benefitting winter wheat areas.









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
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
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
# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Dryness relief will continue in Spain and Portugal in the next seven days. In other areas of southern Europe though, the rain will not be as welcome due to fieldwork delays and some additional flooding. Rain will be significant in the south but barely any rain in the northern half of the region. The topsoil will continue to dry out in the north, but for now, this is good for aggressive fieldwork advancement. Northern areas will need more rain in early June.

AUSTRALIA: Improved rain potentials for much of the nation during the coming ten days will be a boon for winter wheat, barley and canola emergence and establishment. Rain is needed most in Queensland, northern New South Wales, interior South Australia and interior Western Australia.









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
