South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Western Cape will continue to see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week. Winter wheat conditions will remain favorable. The remaining locations in South Africa will remain drier biased during this time. Fieldwork will advance swiftly. Winter wheat prospects will also remain favorable for Northern Cape and the irrigated areas in Free State. Rain-fed wheat areas in Free State would otherwise benefit from a good soaking of rain. South Africa will generally be drier biased through the end of next week o Disturbances tracking near the country will still generate rain for portions of western and southern South Africa @ Western Cape will receive 0.2

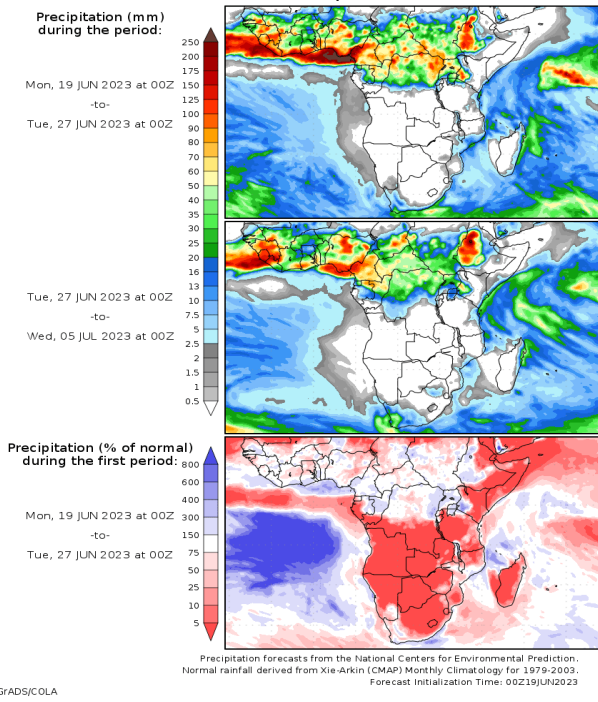


SOUTH AFRICA

June 4 - 10, 2023



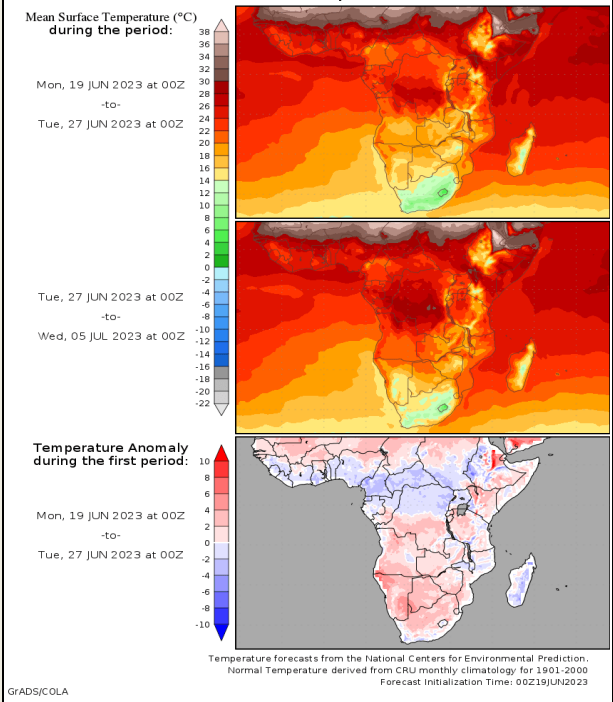

Temperature Forecasts



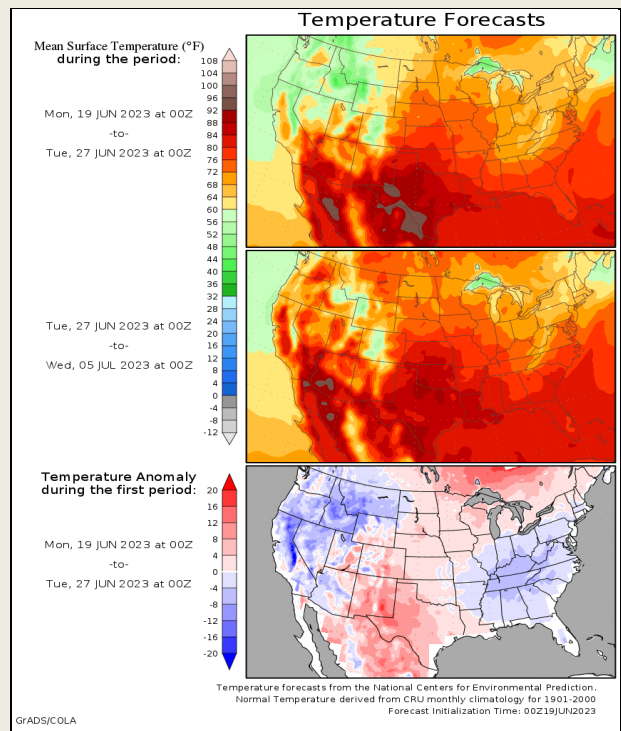
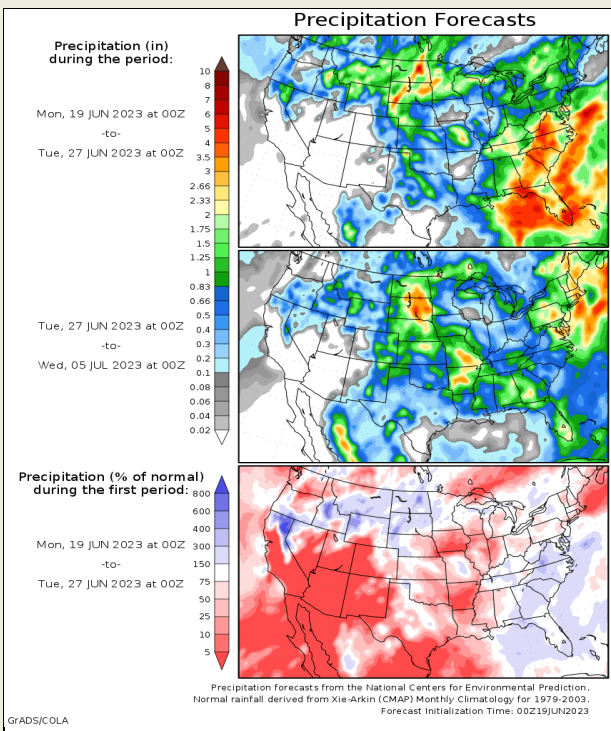
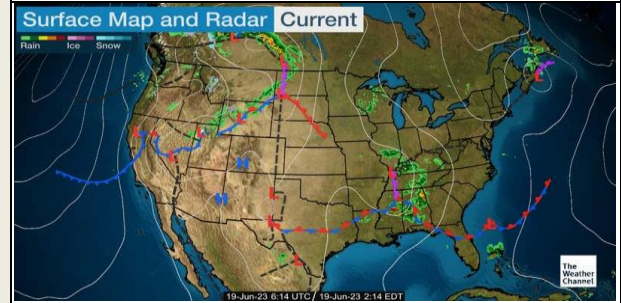
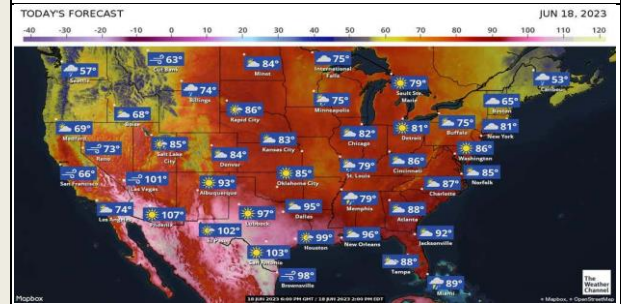
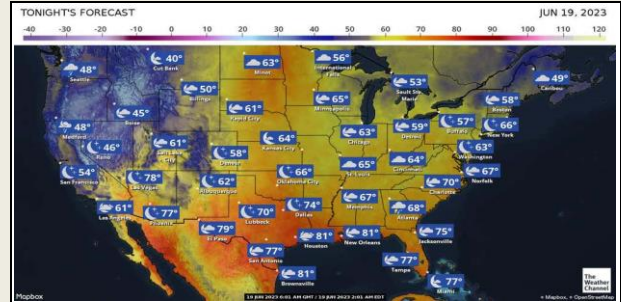
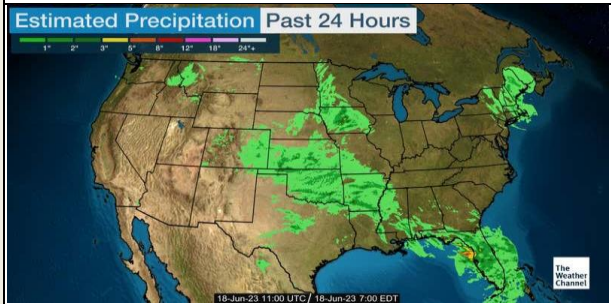

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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Continued drying occurred in much of the Midwest Thursday while beneficial rain fell on eastern Michigan as well as most of the eastern and southern halves of Ohio. Important rain events tonight into Sunday and June 24-26 will ensure most areas west of the Mississippi River have adequate soil moisture to prevent serious crop stress during the next ten days, but rain will be light enough that some areas see increasing crop stress during the period. Most areas east of the Mississippi will be dry or mostly dry through June 24 and stress to crops will steadily increase with soil moisture in place and a lack of heat likely to prevent serious crop stress and major declines in yields through June 24.

U.S. DELTA : Additional heavy rain and some flooding occurred from southern Alabama to northern Florida and southern Georgia Thursday while lighter and beneficial rain fell on parts of the remainder of the Southeast and a few locations in the Delta. Frequent rain through June 24 in the Southeast will induce additional and significant relief from dryness while today's forecast is wetter than what was advertised Thursday for the Delta where additional rain is expected into Sunday and again Thursday through the following Saturday.

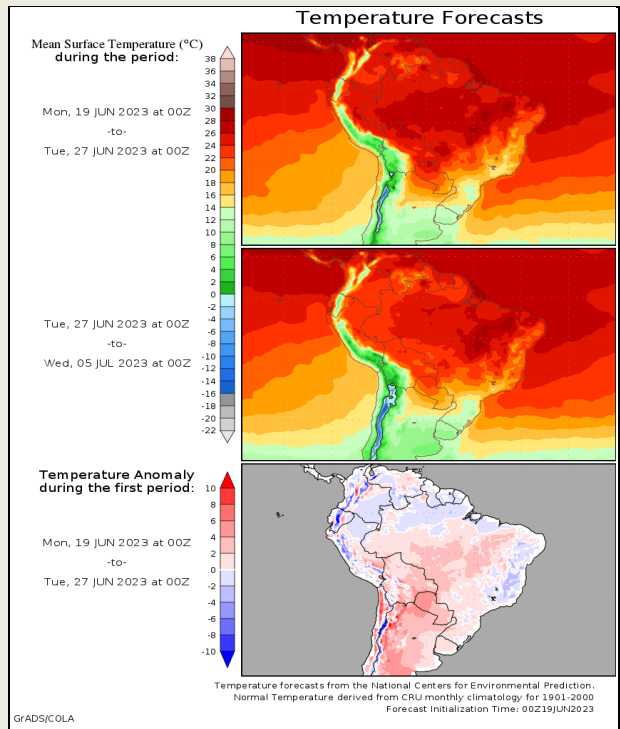
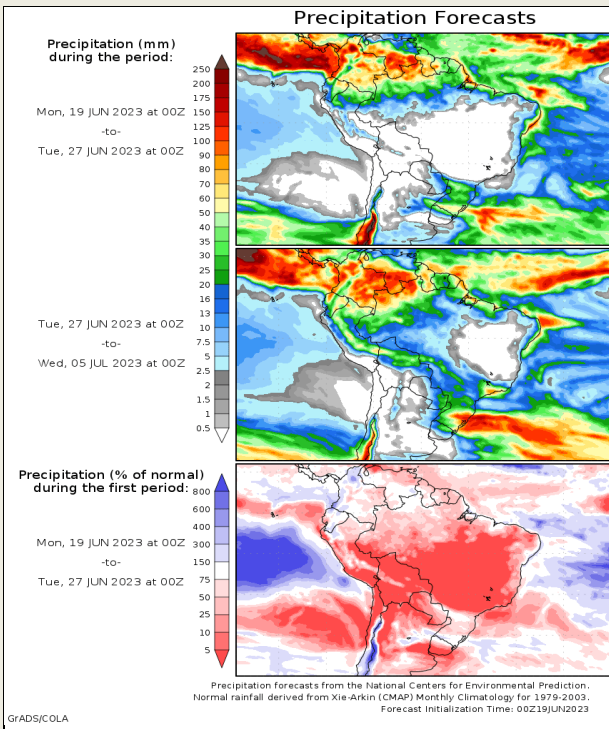
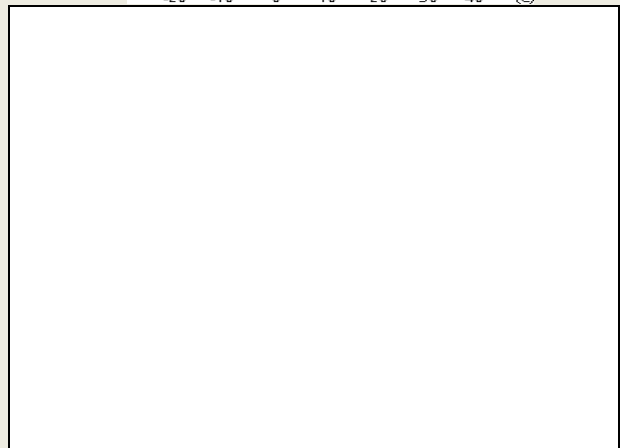
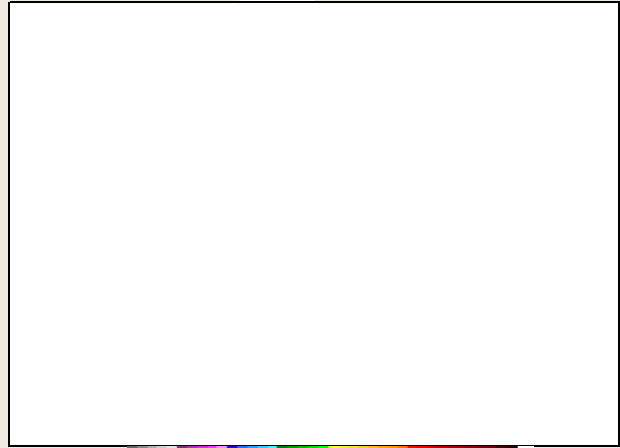


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain continued from Rio Grande do Sul to eastern Parana to Sao Paulo to eastcentral Mato Grosso do Sul Thursday while light rain fell on a few other locations and most other areas were dry. Dry weather will be most common through the next two weeks with Paraguay and southern Brazil seeing another round of significant rain Monday through Thursday while portions of north-central and northeastern Brazil see rain today into Sunday

ARGENTINA : Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork through much of the next two weeks with a few light showers on occasion that should not bring enough rain to significantly impact crops or field conditions while winter wheat areas in western Argentina will be left in need of greater rain.

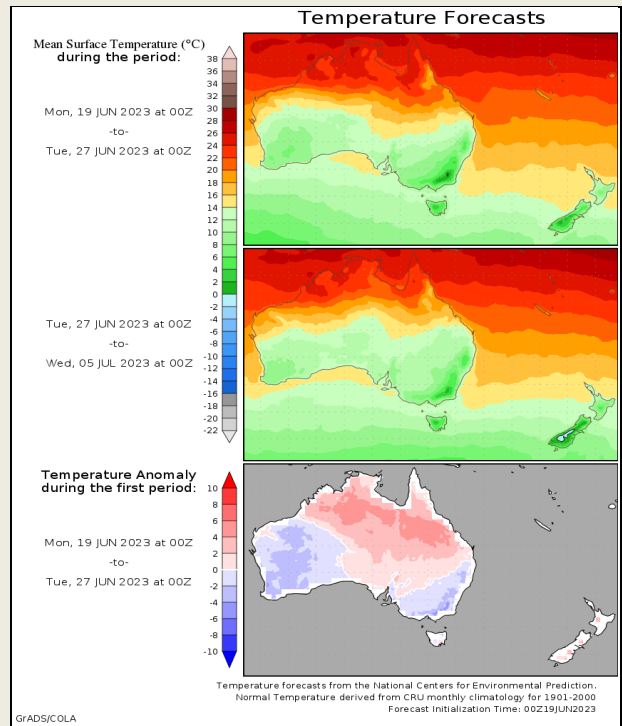
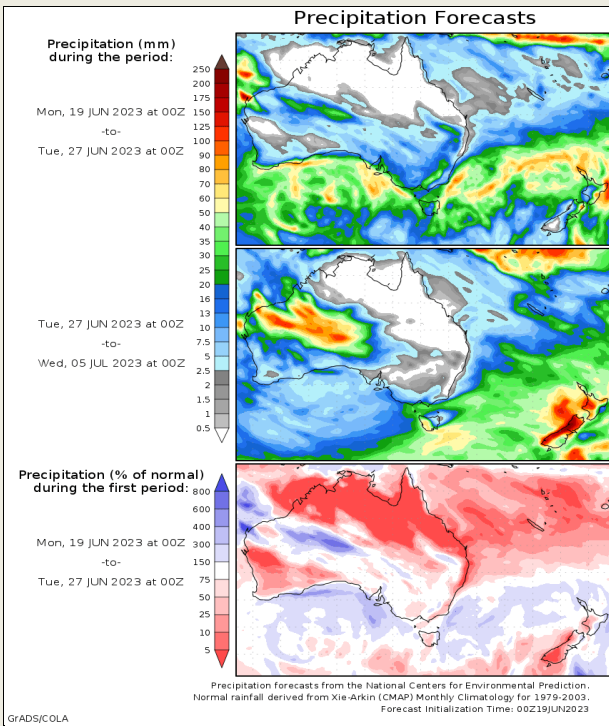
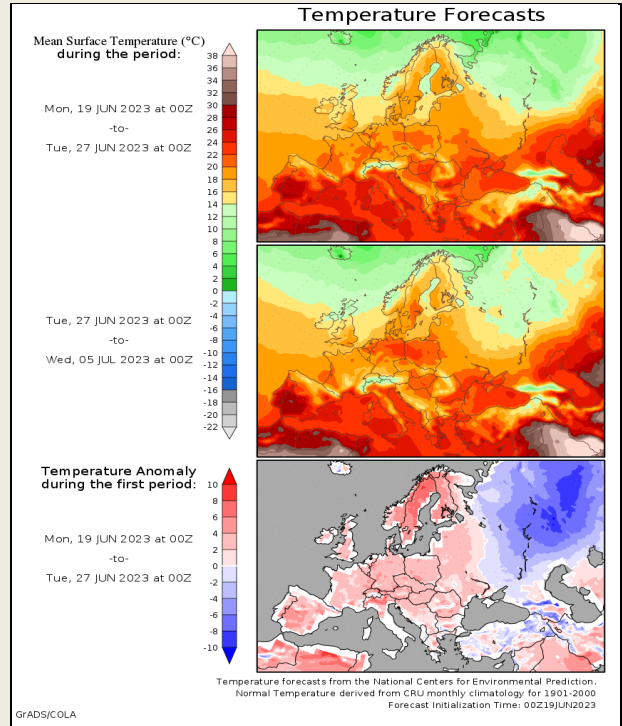
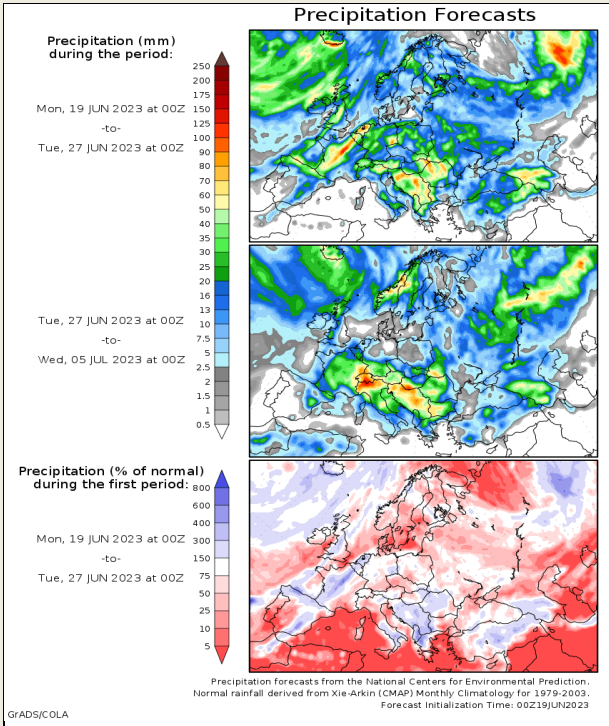


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Some needed rainfall will occur in the northern half of the region in the next seven days which will raise topsoil moisture and reduce crop stress. Much of the south will be trending drier which is also a needed change after recent heavy rain; although, there are a few pockets of the south that could still use more rainfall.

AUSTRALIA : Rain shower activity in the next seven days will likely increase some, particularly next week, with greater coverage of showers reaching into some farther north areas such as Queensland and northern New South Wales. More rain will be needed in these farther north areas, but the shower activity that does occur will be beneficial.



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
