



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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: frontal boundary will promote mostly light rain for western, southern, and eastern South Africa through early next week. The rain will be welcome in the winter wheat areas, most notably Western Cape. The precipitation will otherwise be too light to significantly impact fieldwork.
South Africa will see a mix of erratic rain and sunshine through the end of next week o A frontal boundary will promote mostly light rain for western, southern, and eastern South Africa today into Monday \(\mathbb{D} \) Little follow-up rain is expected later next week o Portions of Western Cape will receive 0.25 1.50" of rain with locally greater amounts in the southwest by next Friday morning \(\mathbb{D} \) Western Northern Cape and much of Eastern Cape into Natal, Mpumalanga, and Limpopo will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts o The remaining locations will be dry or mostly dry \(\mathbb{D} \) South Africa will trend drier biased July 15 – 21 o Light rain will still be possible in western and southern South Africa









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Mild temperatures through most of the next ten days and regular rounds of showers into July 15 will allow corn pollination and other crop development to occur in a mostly favorable environment through the next two weeks. O A close watch will continue on the rainfall distribution from eastern Kansas to central and southeastern Missouri where soil additional rain is needed to restore the soil moisture to favorable levels.

U.S. DELTA: Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast will maintain or improve crop conditions across the region and the soil should be left with enough moisture to support crops into at least late this month if drier weather were to evolve. o The most organized rain event during the period will occur Saturday through Monday with some areas from the Delta through Alabama and the Florida Panhandle see heavy rain that may result in local flooding.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Southern Brazil and Paraguay will see regular rain through Thursday that will interrupt fieldwork with longer lasting interruptions to fieldwork in Rio Grande do Sul where some heavy rain will fall and local flooding may result before July 14-21 is drier. o Eastern Bahia and nearby areas will see regular rounds of light showers through the next two weeks while rain falls as far north as central Mato Grosso do Sul to Sao Paulo Monday into Thursday.

ARGENTINA: Winter wheat areas in western Argentina will benefit from showers in parts of the region most days through Wednesday and although much of the rain will be light some improvements in crop conditions should result. o Much of the remainder of Argentina outside of some southeastern areas will receive rain as well with mostly temporary interruptions to fieldwork likely to result.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Pockets of dryness will continue in various locations across the continent, though there will not be any generalized region of serious moisture shortages. Warm temperatures and erratic rainfall in the next ten days will lead to some areas of moisture stress.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions in the next seven days will be mostly favorable. Recent rainfall in Queensland and northern New South Wales has increased topsoil moisture and should support the needs of crops for a little while longer; though, more rain will be needed soon. Shower activity into the middle of next week will be limited mainly to far southern production areas. Winter crops are favorably rated for this time of year with the possible exception of a few Queensland crops due to persistent dryness.









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
