

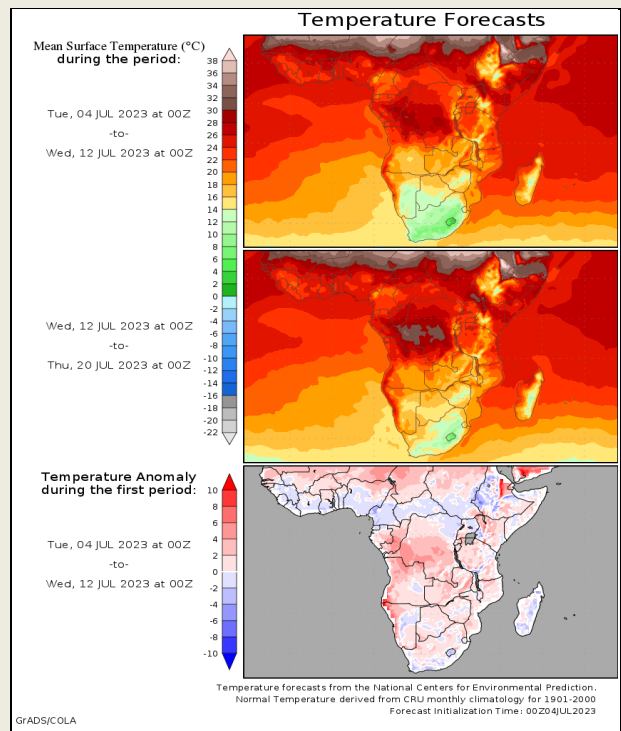
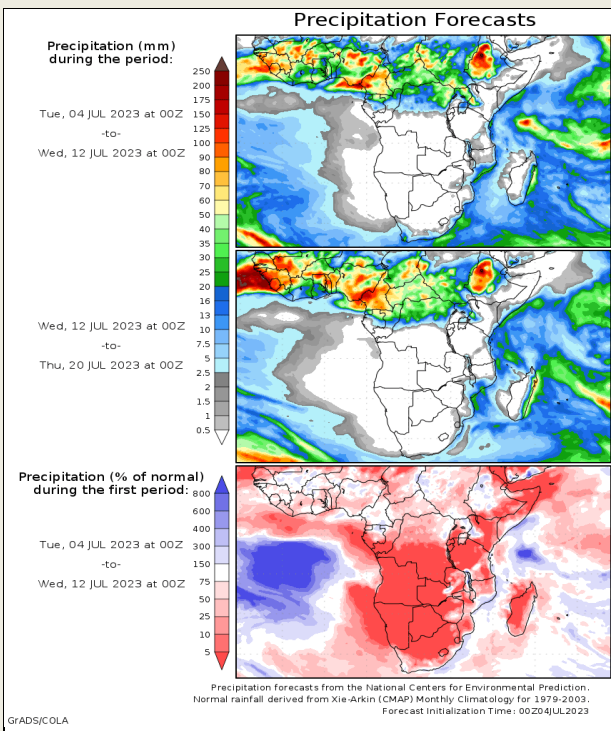
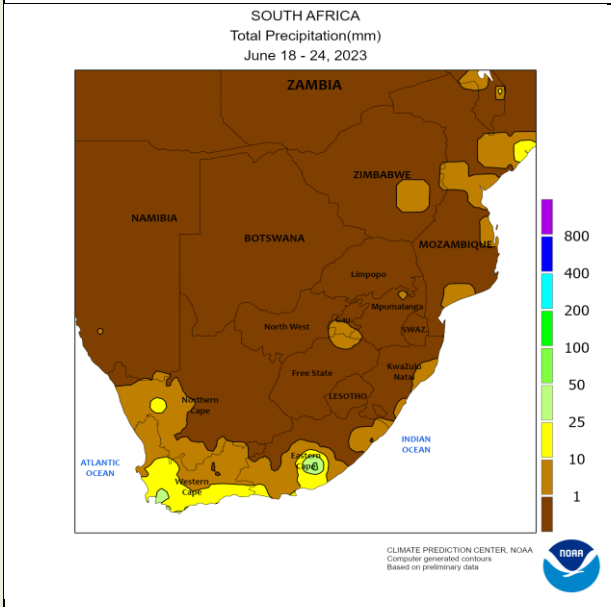
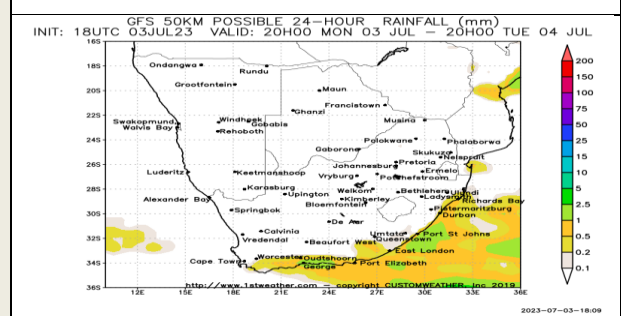
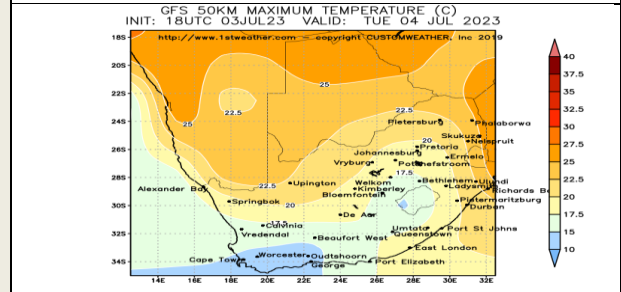
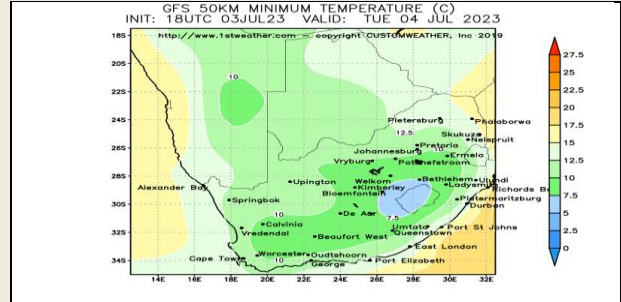


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : South Africa will trend dry or mostly dry this week. The lack of rain will promote a good environment for late-season harvesting and general fieldwork. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable as well despite the lack of rain. The rain-fed wheat in Free State will still need a good shot of rain later this month. South Africa will trend dry or mostly dry this week. A frontal boundary will produce light rain in portions of southern and eastern South Africa Tuesday and Wednesday. Another front will also generate rain in western and southern South Africa Friday and Saturday. Resulting rainfall will generally be lost to evaporation. South Africa will remain drier biased July 11 - 17. Light rain will still be possible in a few locations, most notably southern and western South Africa.

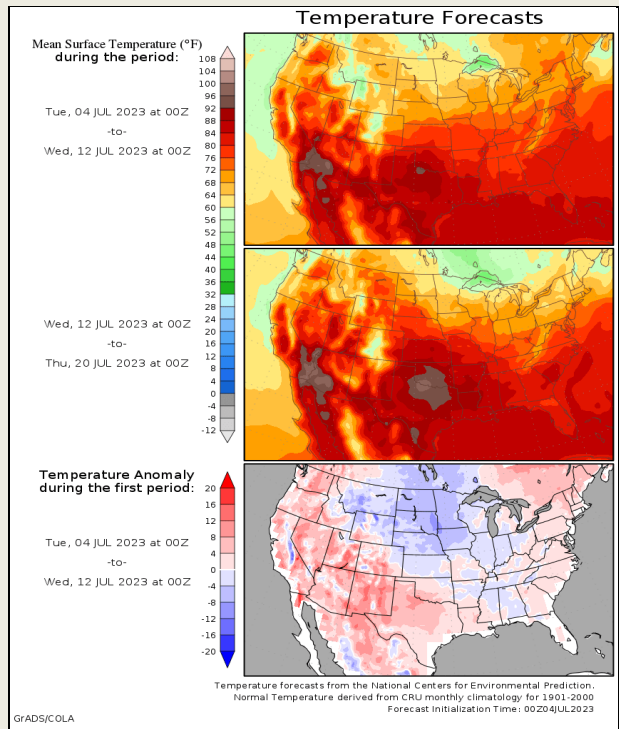
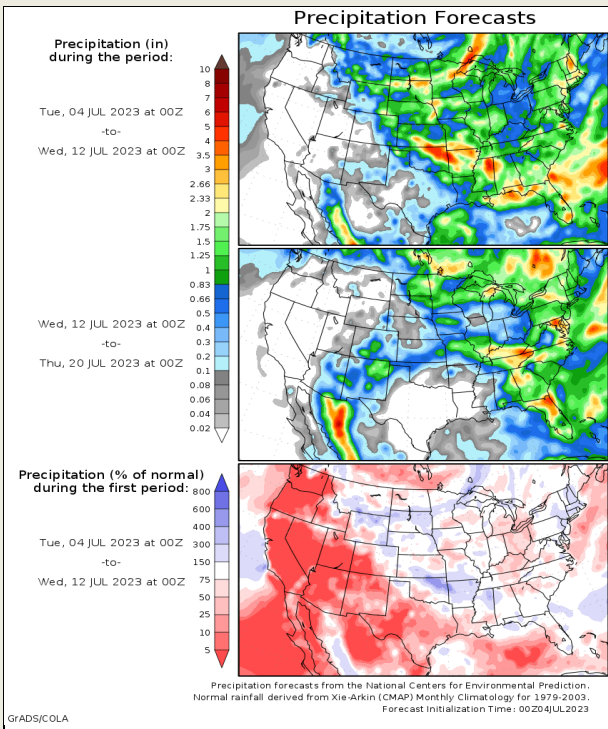
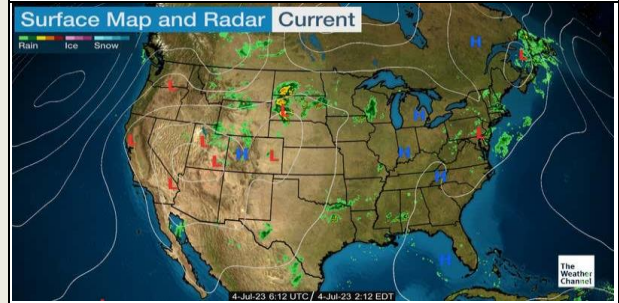
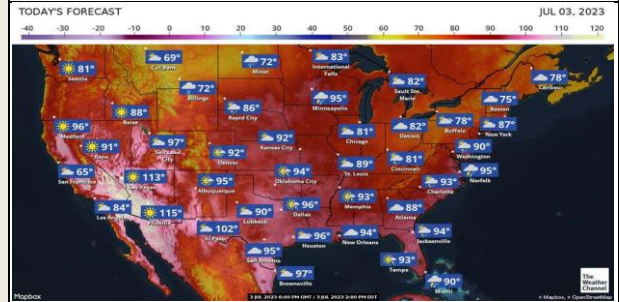
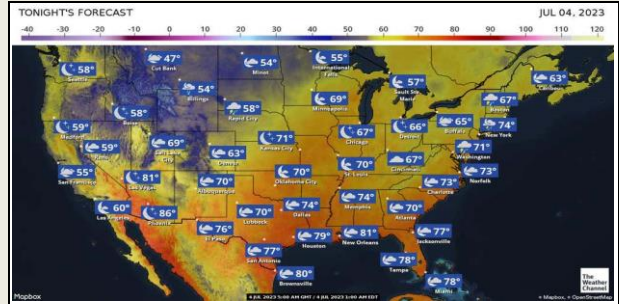
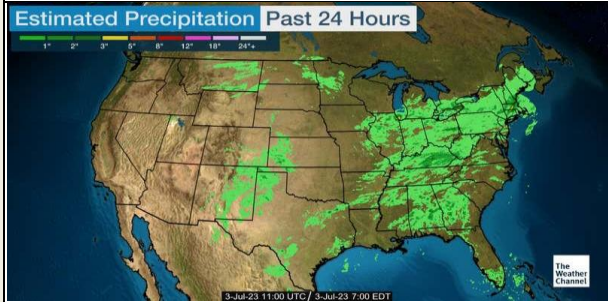

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : The bottom line to the two-week outlook has not changed since late last week and regular rain through the next ten days and a lack of persistent heat will support corn pollination while maintaining or improving overall crop conditions across the Midwest. A close watch will continue on the rainfall distribution from eastern Kansas to central and southeastern Missouri where soil moisture is still short and temperatures will be warm to hot into Tuesday.

U.S. DELTA : The Delta will see daily showers through Friday that will improve conditions for crops in the drier areas before a drier weather pattern begins Saturday and continues through July 17. Temperatures are expected to warm next week and stress to crops should rise as the soil dries out again with serious stress to crops possible if rain does not increase soon. The Southeast will see daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will bring enough rain to keep conditions for crop development mostly favorable.

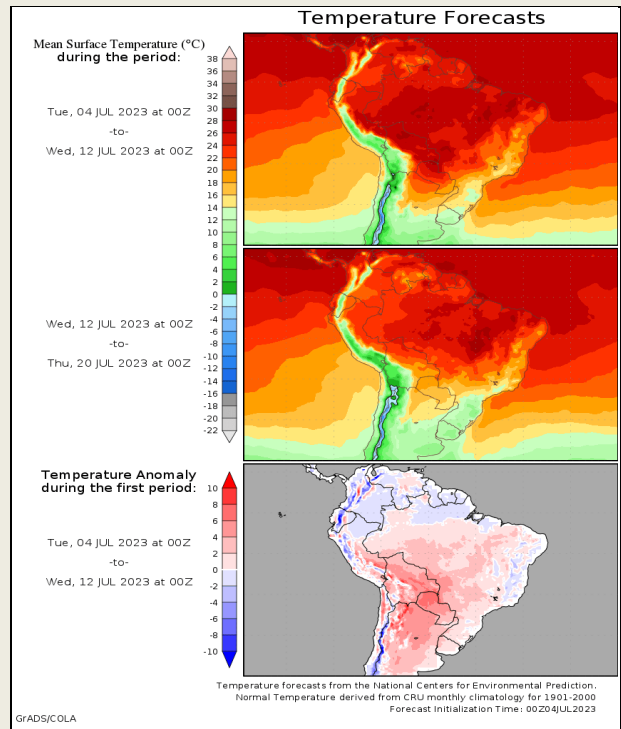
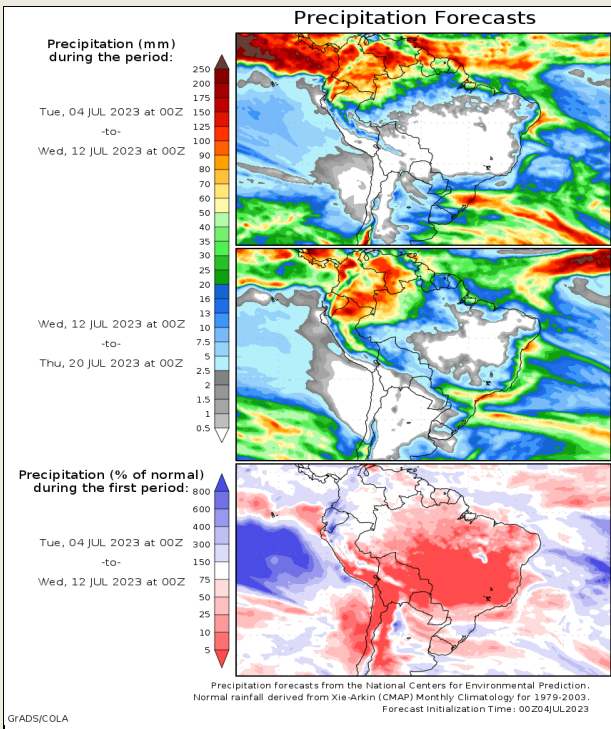
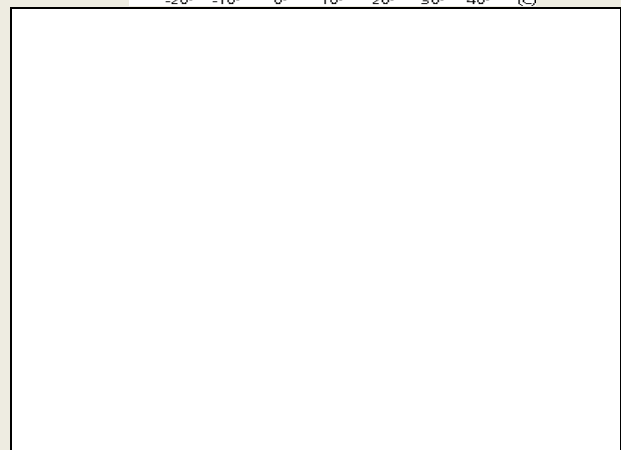
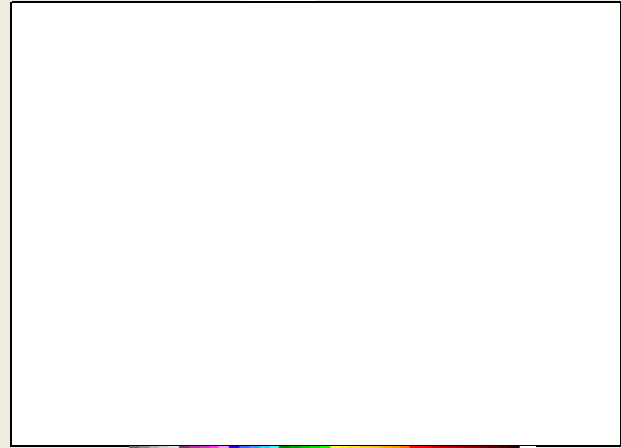

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Today's forecast is wetter for southern Brazil and Paraguay than what was advertised late last week and regular rounds of showers Thursday through July 17 will slow fieldwork while rain is restricted in most of the remainder of Brazil where fieldwork should advance swiftly. Eastern Bahia and nearby areas will see regular rounds of light showers through the next two weeks.

ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for winter wheat areas in western Argentina than what was advertised late last week and the crop will benefit from showers in parts of the region most days from Wednesday through the following Wednesday and although much of the rain from central Cordoba northward will be light some improvements in crop conditions should result.

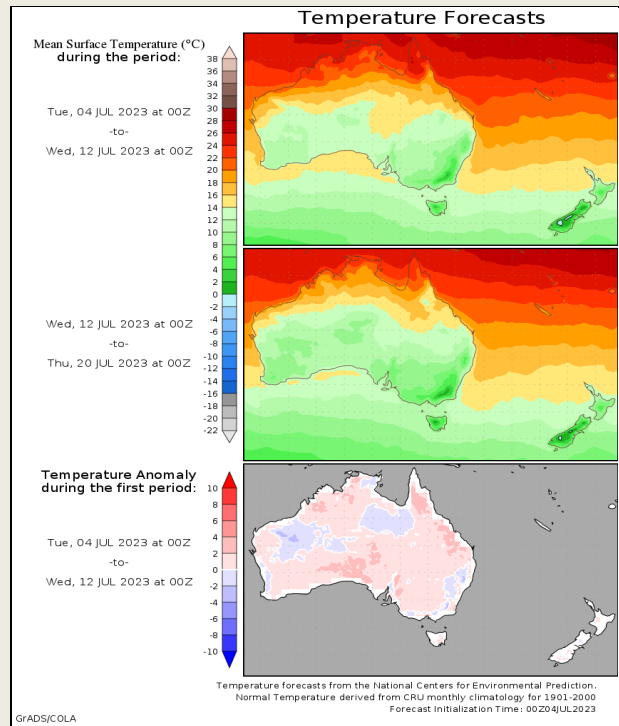
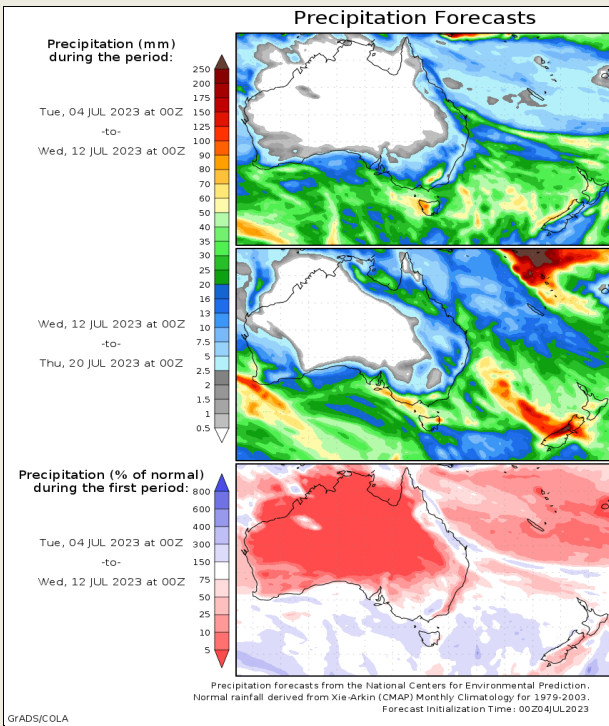
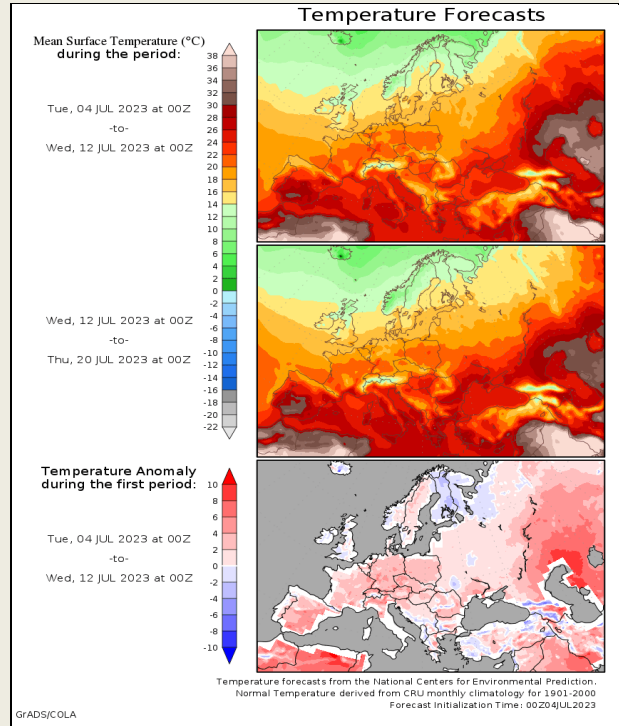
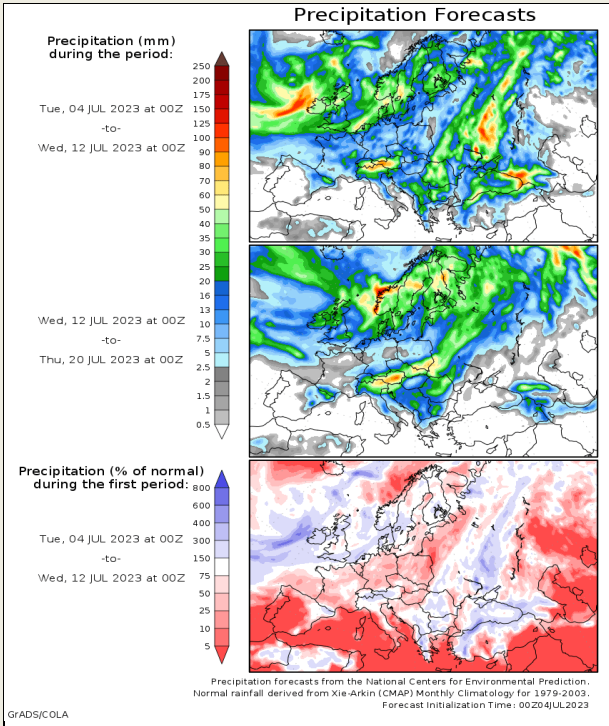

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Some needed rainfall will occur in the northern half of the region in the next seven days which will raise topsoil moisture and reduce crop stress. Much of the south will be trending drier which is also a needed change after recent heavy rain; although, there are a few pockets of the south that could still use more rainfall.

AUSTRALIA : Occasional rain will occur in the region through Sunday. The rain will be greatest today into Tuesday in Queensland. Shower activity Wednesday through Sunday will be limited to southern production areas. Total moisture will vary from 0.35 to 1.25 inches. Some amounts of more than 1.50 inches in northeastern production areas of Queensland and in southern coastal areas. Some occasional shower activity is likely in the second week, July 10 – 17, mainly in southern production areas. Less rain is expected, in general, compared to that of the first week.
