



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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will only have a few opportunities for light rain through the middle of next week. Western Cape will receive enough rain to maintain a good environment for aggressive winter wheat growth. Northern Cape and Free State's irrigated wheat areas will remain in good shape as well despite receiving little to no rain. Late-season fieldwork may otherwise be slowed in eastern South Africa due to the periods of rain. B South Africa will generally trend drier than normal through the middle of next week o However, a frontal boundary will generate rain for portions of western, southern, and eastern South Africa Friday into Monday o Portions of Western Cape, Natal, Mpumalanga, and Limpopo will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain with local amounts over 1.00" by next Wednesday morning B Most other locations will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation or impact long-term soil conditions B South Africa will remain drier biased July 13 – 19 o Light rain will stil be possible in a few locations, most notably southern and western South Africa









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Mild temperatures through the next ten days and regular rounds of showers into late next week will allow corn pollination and other crop development to occur in a mostly favorable environment. o A close watch will continue on the rainfall distribution from eastern Kansas to central and southeastern Missouri where soil additional rain is needed to restore the soil moisture to favorable levels.

U.S. DELTA: Today's forecast is wetter overall, and especially for the Delta, than what was advertised earlier this week with frequent rain expected through Monday and regular rounds of showers Tuesday through July 17. o The driest areas from the Delta to central and northern Alabama will see notable improvements in soil and crop conditions while conditions for crops remain mostly favorable elsewhere.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Southern Brazil and Paraguay will see rain events Thursday through Sunday and Monday into next Wednesday that will cause mostly temporary interruptions to fieldwork with longer lasting interruptions to fieldwork in Rio Grande do Sul where rain will be greatest. o Eastern Bahia and nearby areas will see regular rounds of light showers through the next two weeks. ARGENTINA: Winter wheat areas in western Argentina will benefit from showers in parts of the region

ARGENTINA: Winter wheat areas in western Argentina will benefit from showers in parts of the region most days through Tuesday and although much of the rain will be light some improvements in crop conditions should result. o Rain will be greater from Santa Fe to Entre Rios and southern Corrientes. o Fieldwork will be interrupted, but rain is not expected to be heavy enough to cause prolonged delays to fieldwork.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Some needed rainfall will occur in the northern half of the region in the next seven days which will raise topsoil moisture and reduce crop stress. Much of the south will be trending drier which is also a needed change after recent heavy rain; although, there are a few pockets of the south that could still use more rainfall.

AUSTRALIA: Rainfall the past two days in New South Wales and Queensland will prove to be quite helpful in establishing wheat and barley fields after an extended period of dry weather. There will be an ongoing need for additional moisture, though. Shower activity in the coming week will be mainly limited to southern areas and will be good for supporting winter crops. Temperatures will be near to slightly above average.









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
