

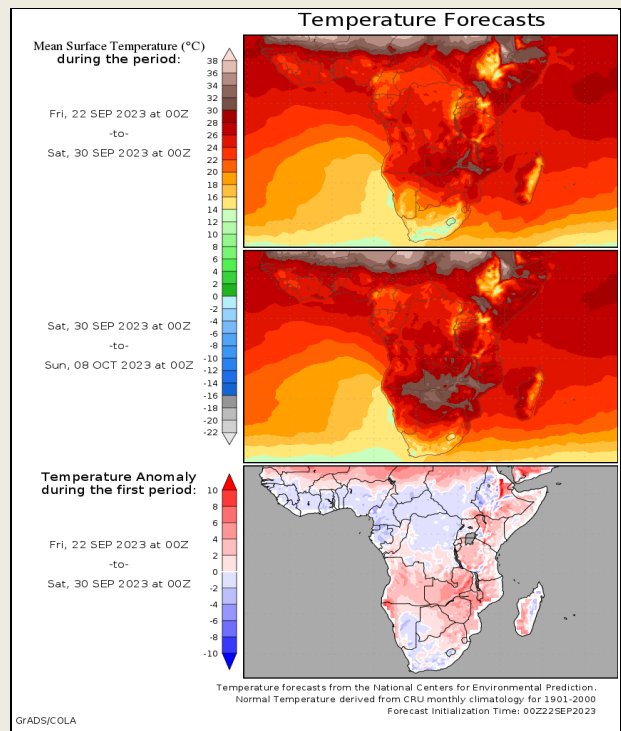
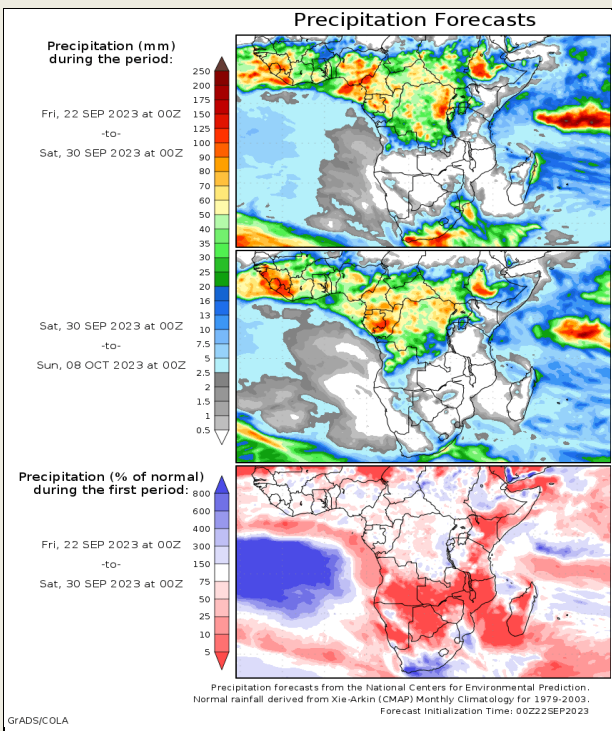
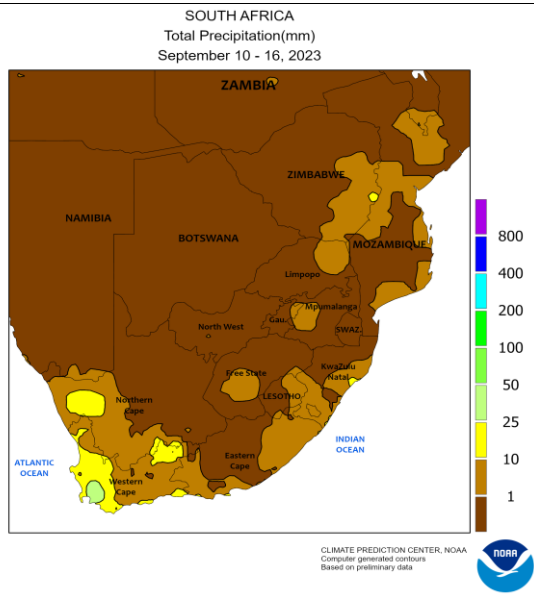
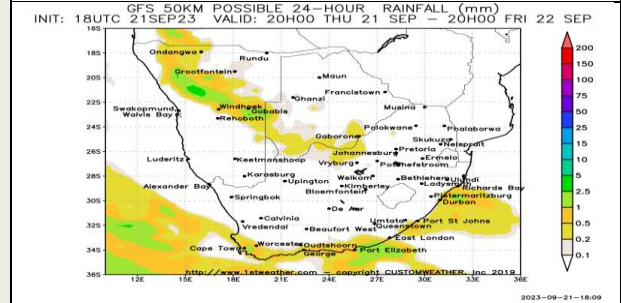
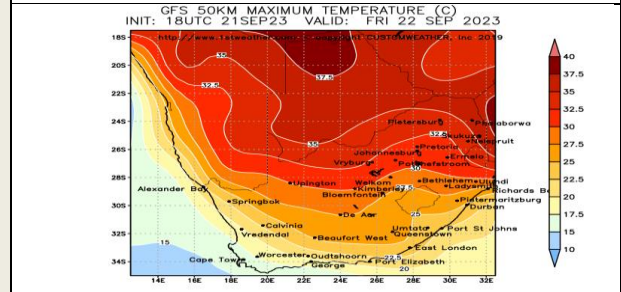
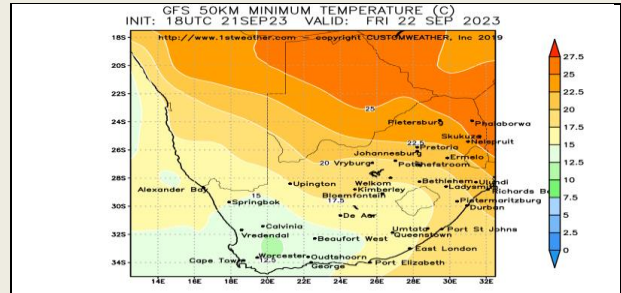


Weather Report

22 September 2023

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : A disturbance will promote rain for portions of South Africa over the weekend and early next week. Western Cape, Eastern Cape, and neighboring areas in Northern Cape and Free State will receive the greatest amount of rain that will bolster soil moisture. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable for Western Cape and the irrigated areas in Northern Cape and Free State. The rain will be welcome for the dryland wheat in Free State as well. South Africa will initially trend mostly dry today and Friday, though pockets in Western Cape and Eastern Cape will receive light rain. A disturbance will promote more widespread rain in portions of South Africa over the weekend and early next week. Drier weather will return Tuesday and Wednesday. Portions of Western Cape, Eastern Cape, southern Northern Cape, and western Free State will receive 0.50-3.00" of rain with local amounts of 5.00" or more in southwestern Eastern Cape and southern Western Cape by next Thursday morning. Other locations in Northern Cape and Free State into portions of Natal and Mpumalanga will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts. Little to no rain is slated for the remaining areas in South Africa.

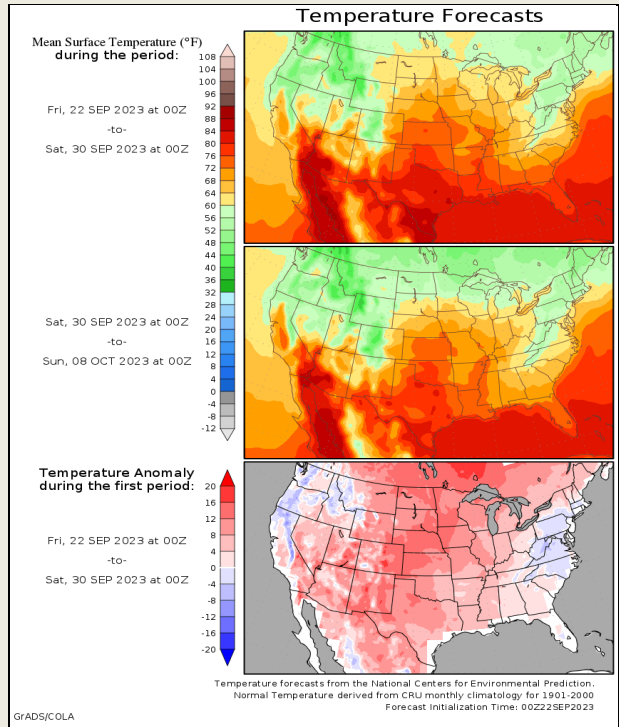
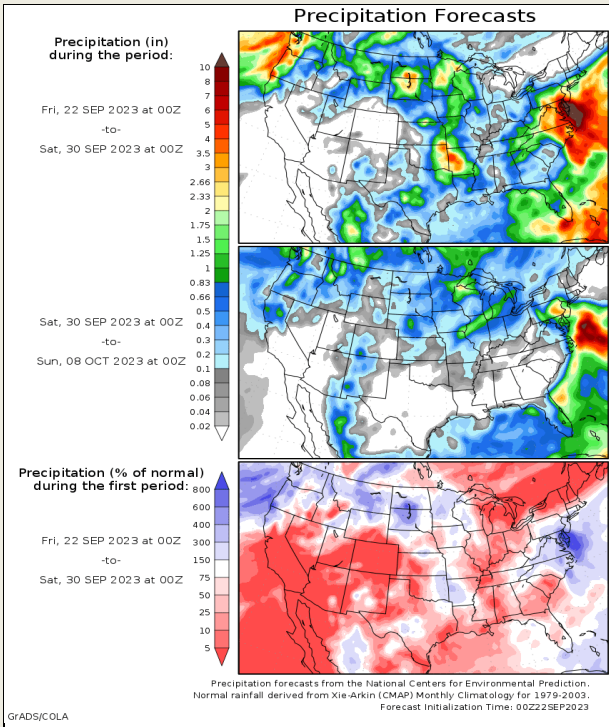
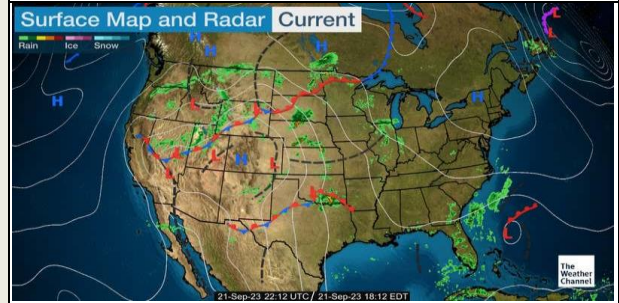
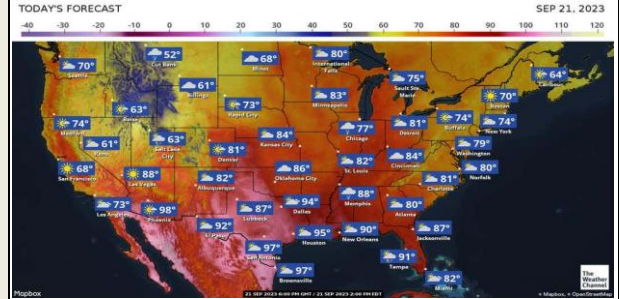
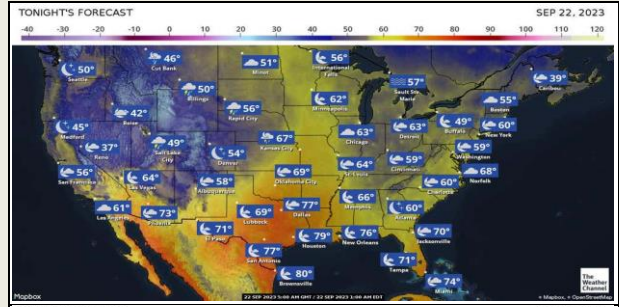

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Another day of dry and favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting occurred in much of the Midwest Wednesday with pockets of mostly light rain in several locations across Illinois and a few nearby areas as well as in parts of northcentral Iowa and southeastern North Dakota. Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur west of the Mississippi River into Monday and fieldwork will be temporarily interrupted while the moisture will be highly beneficial for winter wheat planting and establishment.

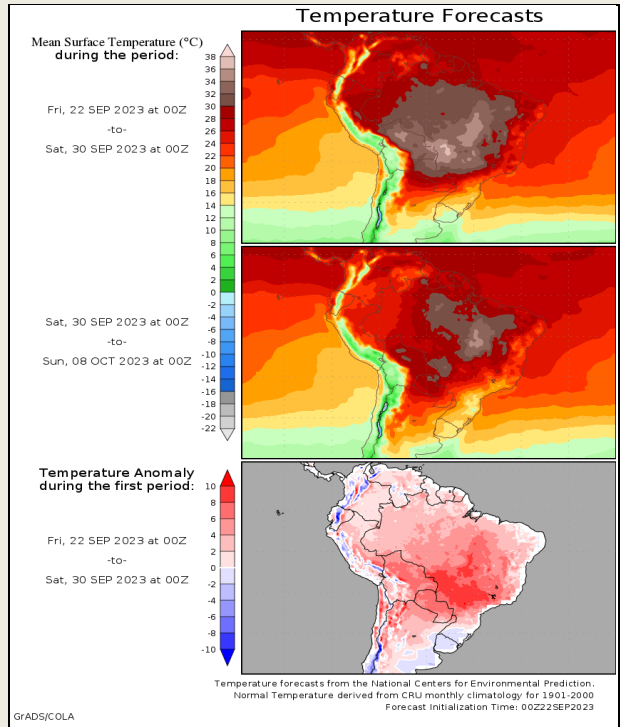
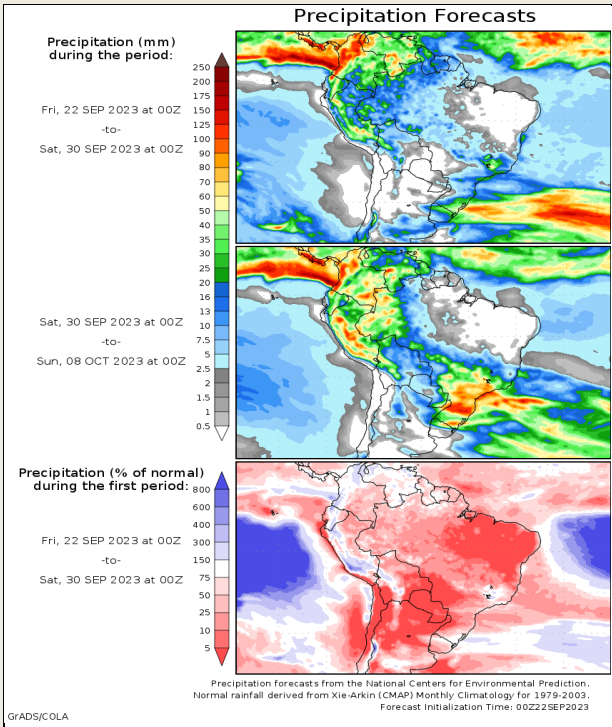
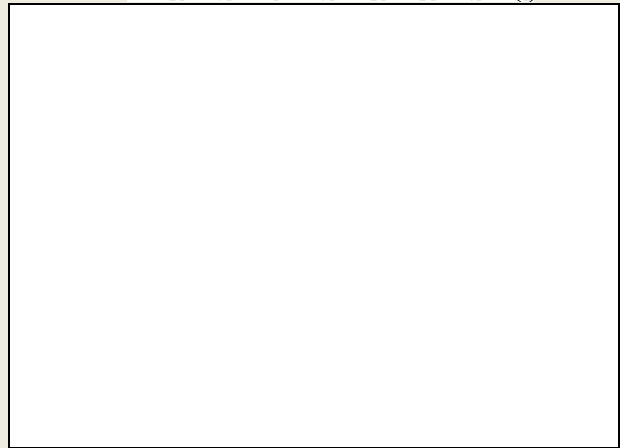
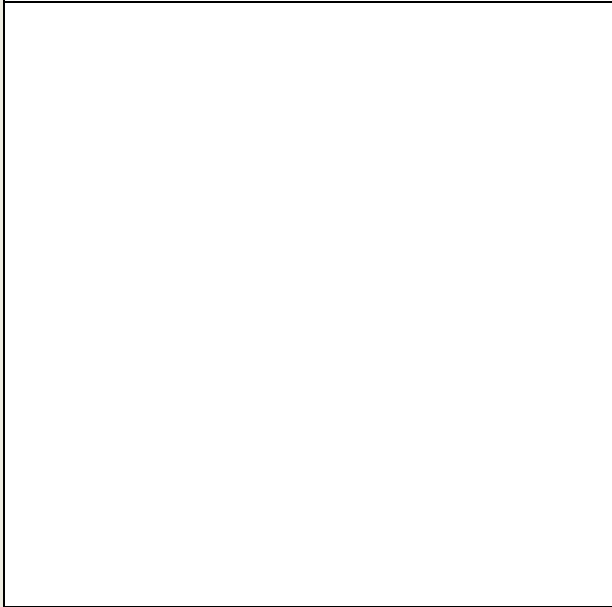
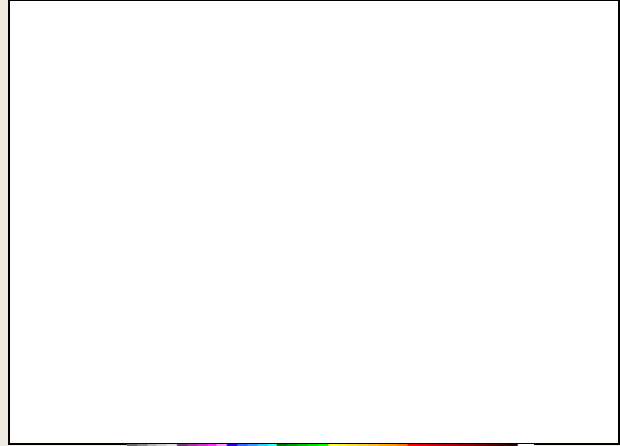
U.S. DELTA : Mostly dry and favorable conditions for crop maturation and fieldwork continued in much of the Delta and the Southeast Wednesday with rain noted in a few locations in the northern Delta, northeastern Florida, and southeastern Georgia. Two rounds of significant rain are expected during the next two weeks and with little rain outside of these rain events conditions for crop maturation and harvesting should be mostly favorable. Rain from the Delta into northwestern Alabama Sunday into Tuesday will be beneficial in winter wheat areas.



South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain fell on parts of Mato Grosso do Sul Wednesday with the moisture mostly too light to induce lasting improvements in soil moisture while a few other areas also received rain and most other areas were dry. Daily showers and thunderstorms through Monday in Rio Grande do Sul and additional showers into next Thursday in the north should cause the winter wheat crop to suffer from increasing wet weather diseases while the rain should not be heavy enough to cause widespread flooding.

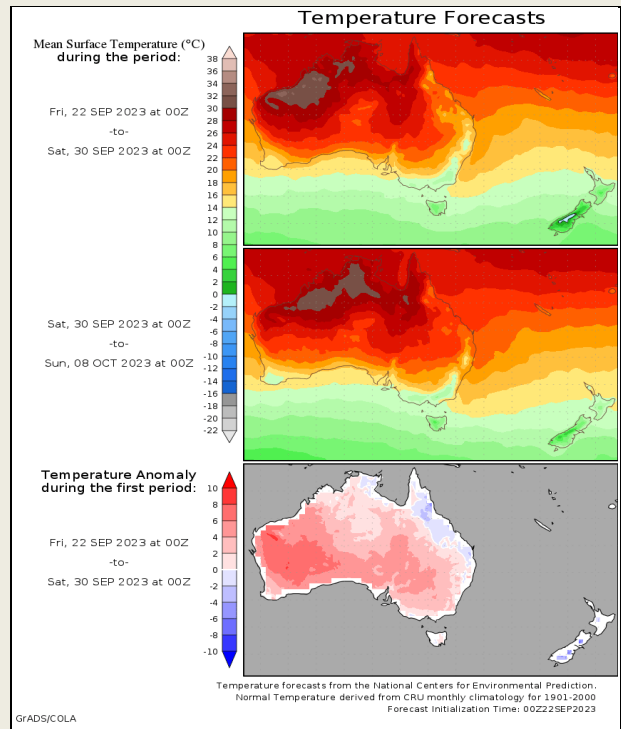
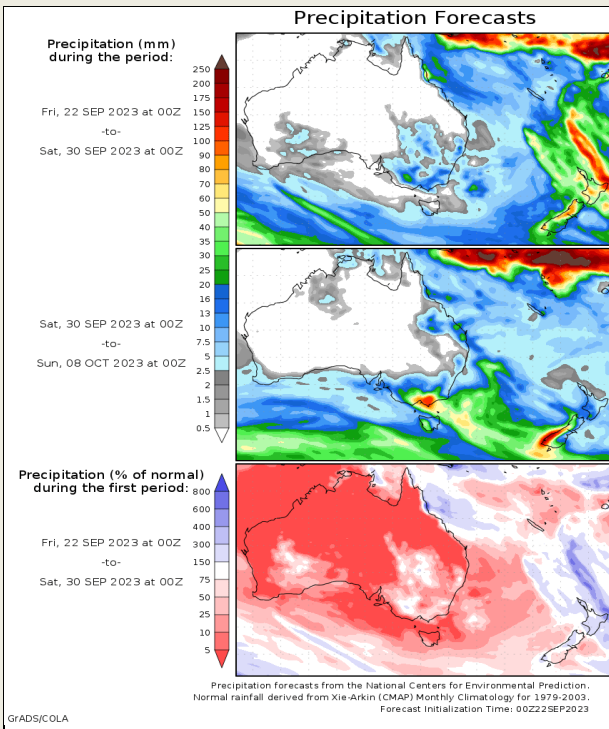
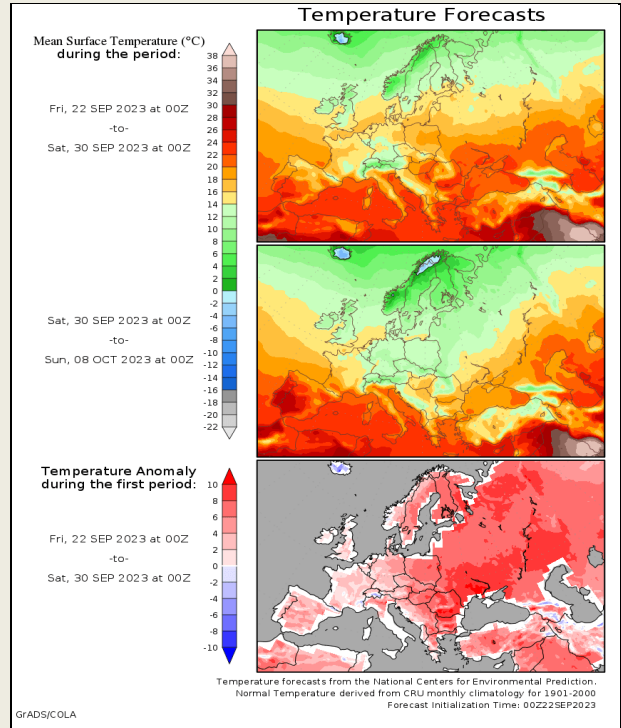
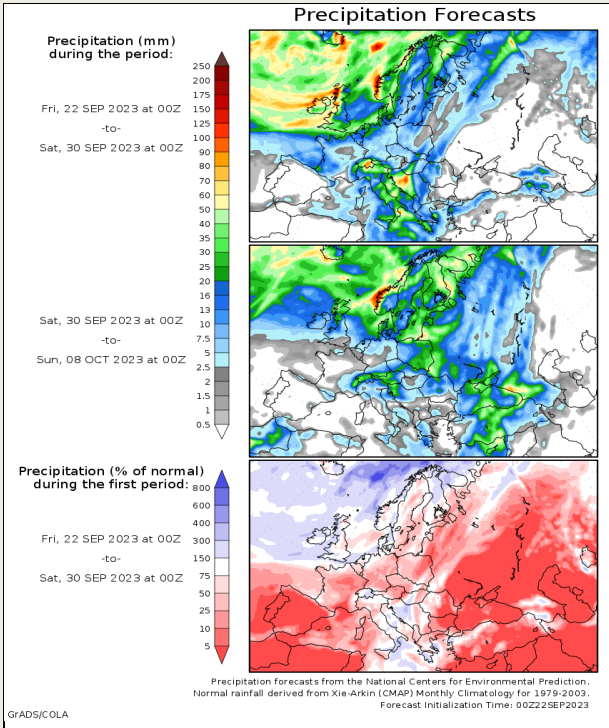
ARGENTINA: Rain fell on parts of Buenos Aires and Corrientes Wednesday while most other areas were dry. Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur through Monday favoring northeastern Argentina where some heavy rain is likely and parts of southwestern Argentina where some areas will see significant rain before drier weather resumes Tuesday through Oct. 5. Winter wheat in west-central and northwestern Argentina will miss much of the significant rain and will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for the crop.



Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rainfall in the next seven days is still expected to be enough from the United Kingdom and France through Italy and the western Balkan Countries to disrupt harvesting and crop maturation; however, the rain will be good for eventual winter crop planting. Conditions elsewhere will continue to be mostly favorable. Rain Wednesday and early today was most significant in northwestern France and the United Kingdom where 0.08 to 0.79 inch resulted in general with a few amounts to nearly 1.50 inches. A few other showers occurred in coastal areas of southeastern France in a few areas of southern Italy as well as eastern Belarus and north-central coastal areas of Spain where rainfall varied up to 0.57 inch. Dry weather dominated most of the continent.

AUSTRALIA: Limited shower activity in the next seven days with temperatures often above average will lead to widespread net drying and a continued rise in the need for more rain in areas such as Queensland, northern New South Wales, South Australia, and northeastern production areas of Western Australia. A similar weather pattern is likely in the second week of the outlook.
