
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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will remain drier biased through the end of next week. Net during is slated for most locations, though Western Cape will still have enough moisture to support favorable conditions. Irrigated fields in Northern Cape and Free State will also continue to experience favorable wheat conditions. Dryland wheat in Free State would benefit from a boost in rain late this month into September. ® South Africa will be drier than normal through the end of next week o Disturbances will still produce light rain in southern and eastern South Africa this weekend into the middle of next week o Portions of Western Cape and southern fringes of Eastern Cape and Natal will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain with local amounts of 1.50" or more in southwestern Western Cape by next Friday morning o Any rain that occurs elsewhere will be lost to evaporation ® South Africa will remain drier biased August 19 – 25 o Periods of light rain will still be possible in western and southern South Africa









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Yield potentials in nearly all of the Midwest will be maintained or improved during the next week as soil moisture is adequate to favorable in much of the region while rain will be nearly widespread by Monday and a lack of heat will continue through late next week. o A close watch will be made on the rainfall distribution from northeastern North Dakota to south-central and southeastern Minnesota to eastWORLD central and northeastern lowa where soil moisture is still short in parts of the region and rain is needed to improve conditions for crops.



U.S. DELTA: Occasional rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks from the central and northern Delta into the Southeast will maintain mostly favorable soil conditions while warm to hot temperatures and high evaporation rates will prevent many areas from seeing large increases in soil moisture during the period. o Timely rain will be needed through the end of the month to maintain the best possible conditions for crops.










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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Showers and thunderstorms will continue through Saturday from southern Paraguay into parts of southern Brazil where increases in soil moisture will result while harvesting is interrupted. o Sunday through Aug. 25 will be drier and harvesting should increase around some showers Thursday into next Friday.

ARGENTINA: Rain during the next two weeks will be infrequent leaving most areas with favorable conditions for fieldwork while many winter wheat areas in western Argentina will be left in need of greater rain. O Showers will occur Wednesday into next Friday with and much of eastern and parts of central Argentina will receive up to 0.65" of rain and locally more while western Argentina misses much of the rain.










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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: An active weather pattern in the next seven days will lead to some areas receiving too much rain, mainly in central and northeastern parts of the region. Fieldwork delays and some localized flooding will likely result. The driest part of the region will be southwestern areas such as Spain and Portugal; though, this is typical for the time of year.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions in the region continue to be mostly unchanging. Rain will continue to affect mainly southern production areas through the next seven days and likely through the second week of the outlook as well. Some beneficial rain will occur in South Australia; however, Queensland and northern New South Wales will continue to need more rain before spring arrives.









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
