

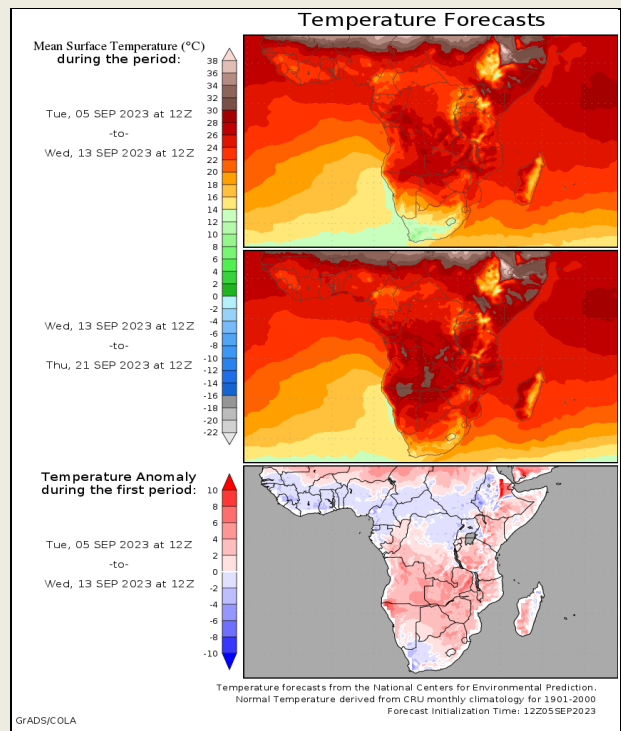
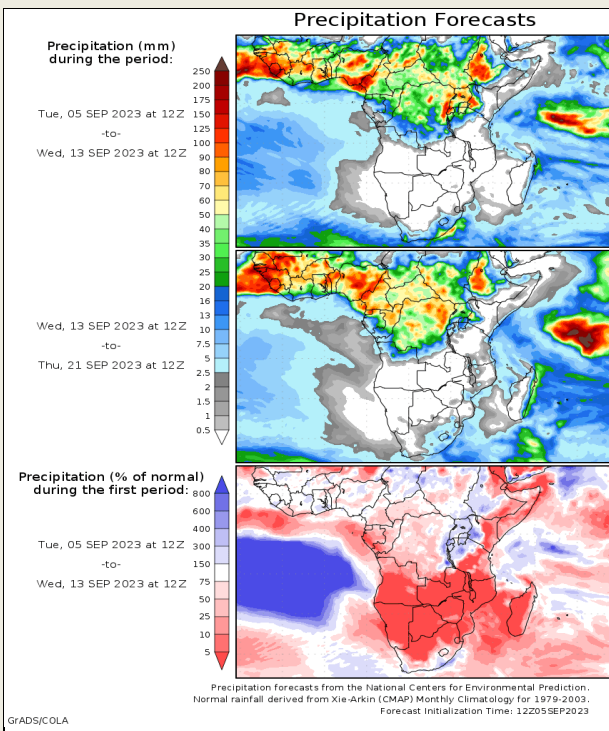
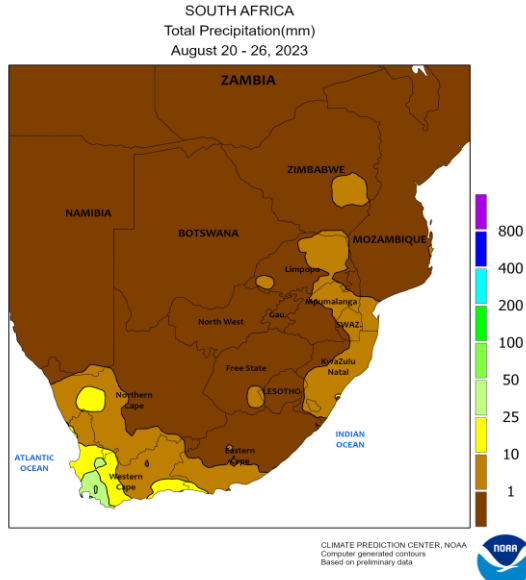
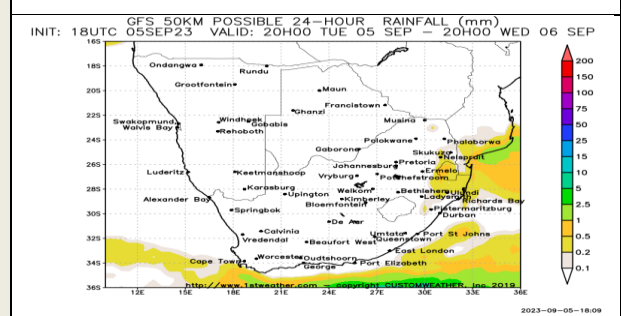
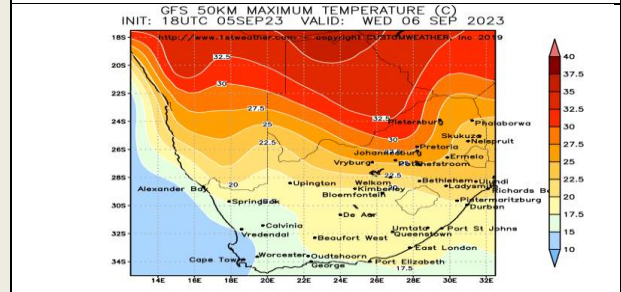
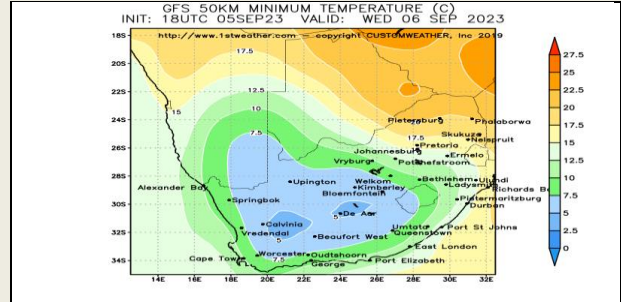


Weather Report

06 September 2023

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Western and southern South Africa will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week while the remaining locations are dry or mostly dry. The rain in Western Cape will continue to support a good environment for the winter wheat. Irrigated wheat will remain in good condition for Northern Cape and Free State despite the lack of significant rain. Rain-fed wheat in Free State would otherwise benefit from a boost in rain later this month. South Africa will generally trend drier than normal during the coming week. A frontal boundary will still promote light rain in southern and western South Africa today. Another front will generate rain in western and southern South Africa later this weekend and early next week. Portions of Western Cape, western Northern Cape, Eastern Cape, and southern Natal will receive 0.10-1.00" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Tuesday morning. Most other locations will be dry or not receive enough rain to counter evaporation. South Africa will remain drier biased September 13 – 19. Periods of light rain will still be possible in western, southern, and eastern South Africa.

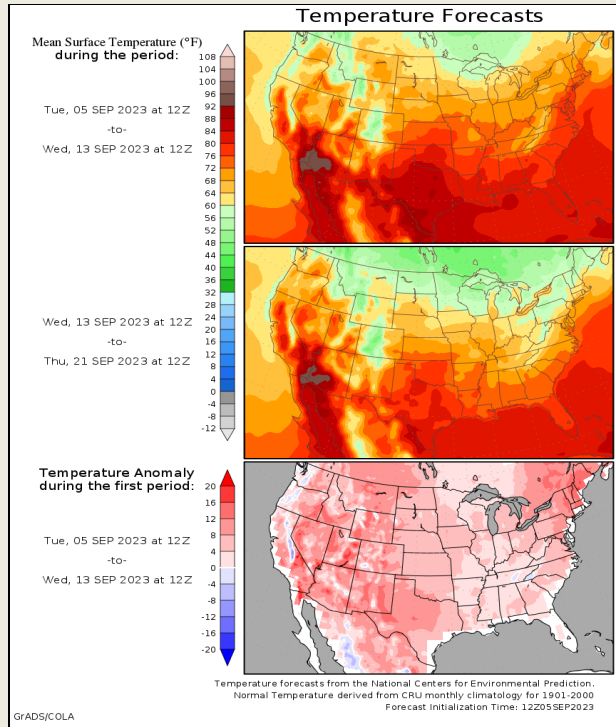
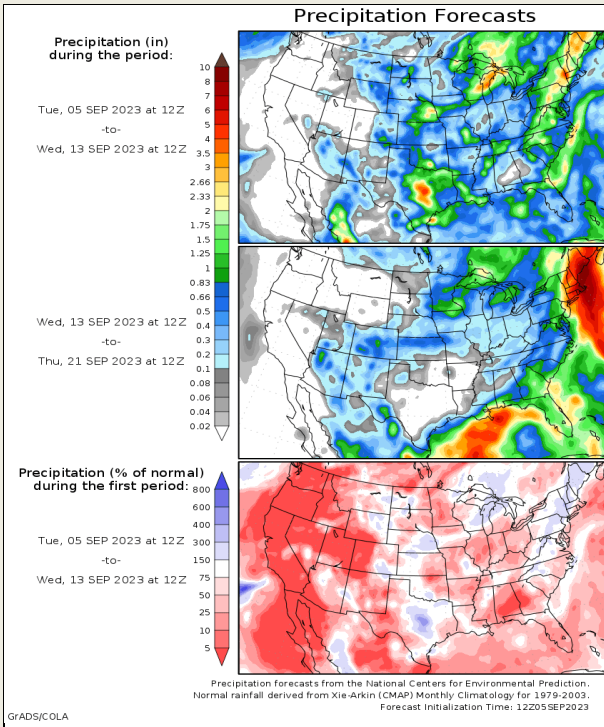
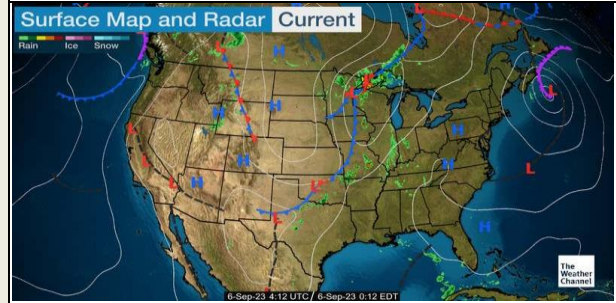
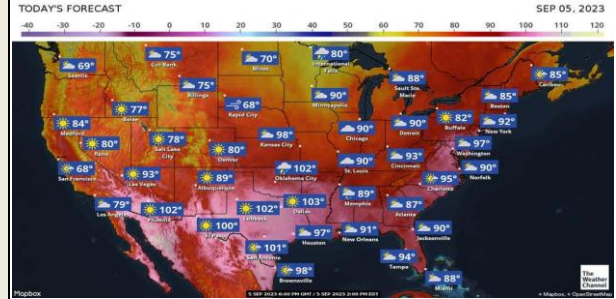
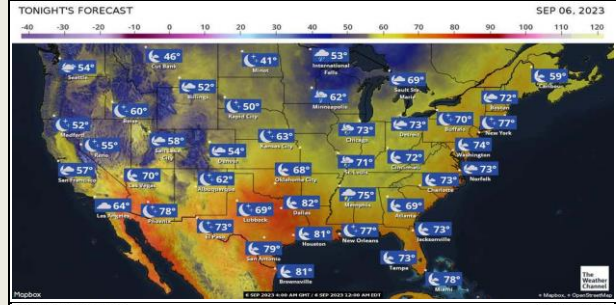

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Two rounds of precipitation during the next week will result in at least some rain for nearly all of the Midwest with the moisture mostly welcome, but likely to come too late to have much of an impact on crops before rain becomes infrequent Sep. 13-19. o Corn maturation and early harvesting should occur favorably around the rain expected during the next two weeks.

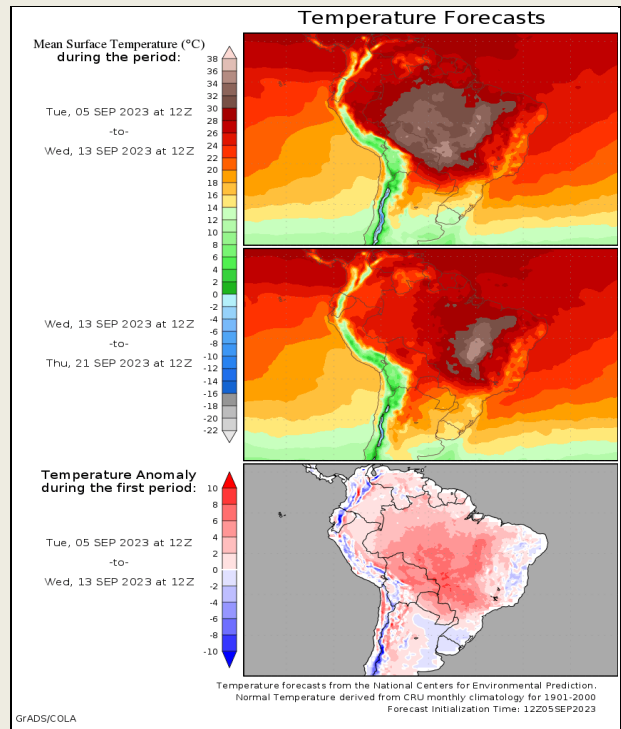
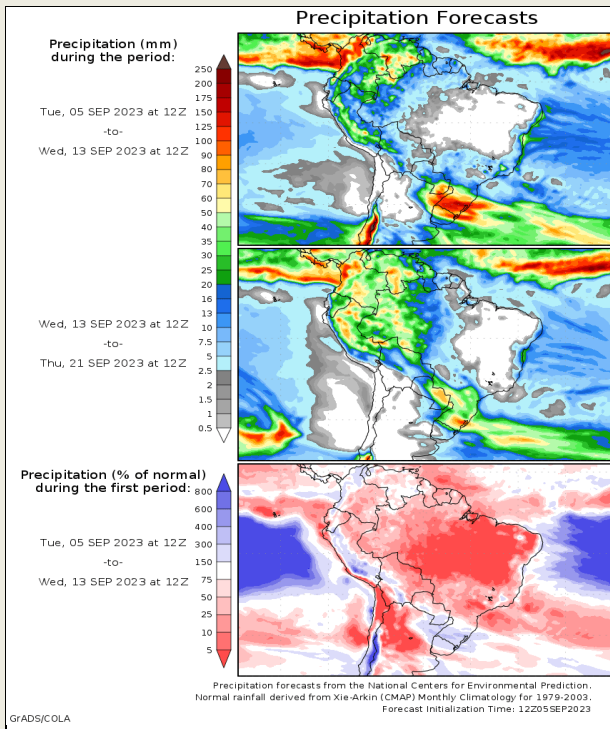
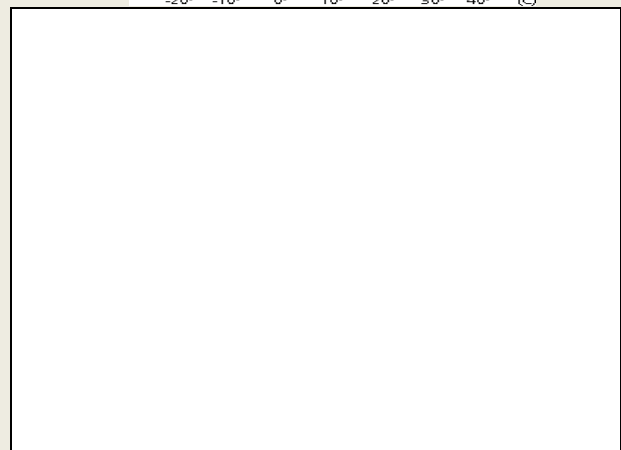
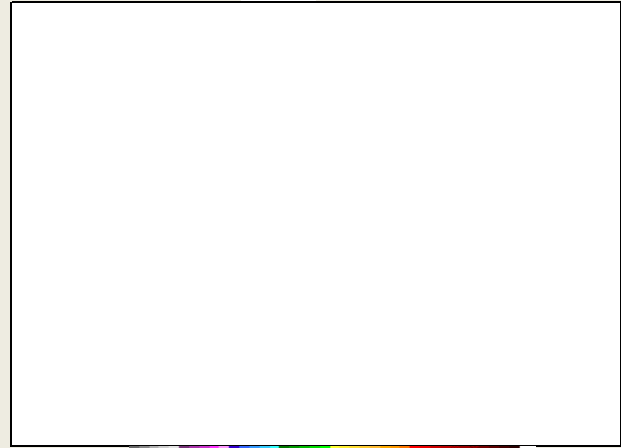
U.S. DELTA : Infrequent and often light rain during the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast will allow crop maturation and harvesting to occur in a mostly favorable environment while stress to immature crops should rise soon once moisture from recent rain is lost to evaporation.



South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Paraguay and southern Brazil will see two more rounds of moderate to heavy rain during the next ten days and additional flooding is likely and some low-lying wheat may be damaged by flooding with concerns over wet weather diseases likely to increase for wheat as well. Rain will be less frequent and lighter Sep. 15-19, but showers will continue and drier weather will be needed to reduce concerns over wet weather diseases.

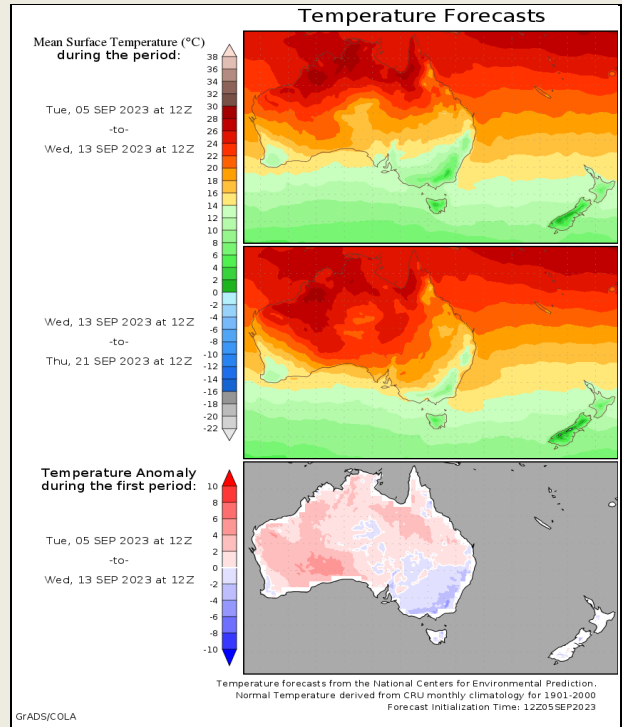
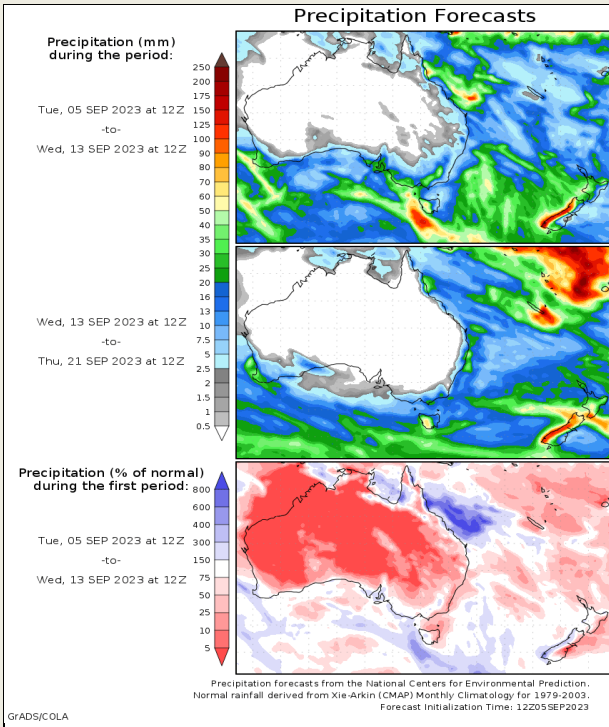
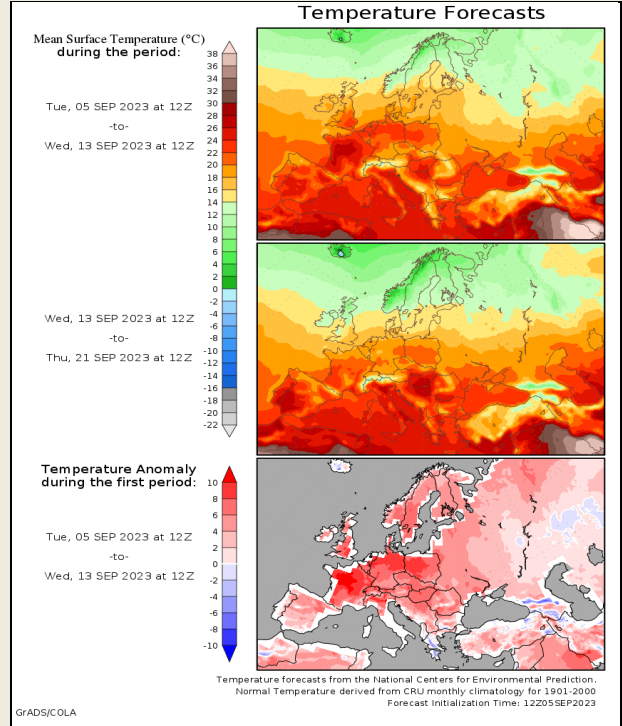
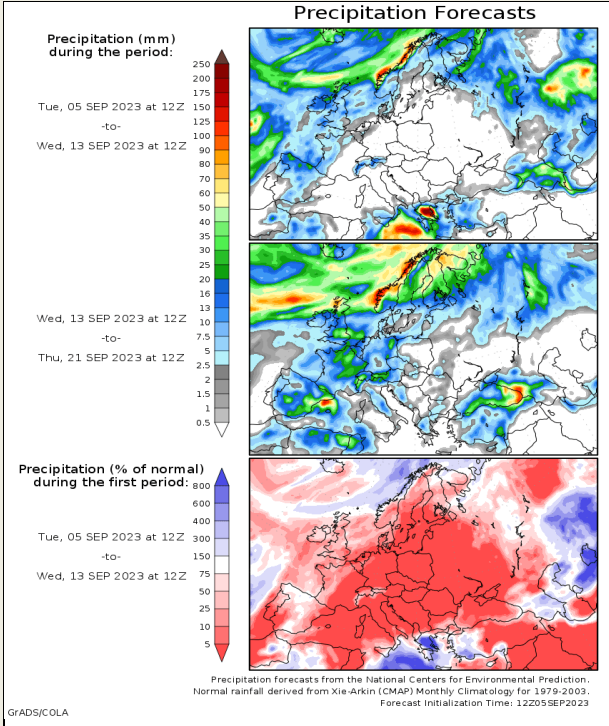
ARGENTINA: Most days during the next two weeks will be dry with some light showers on occasion and two rounds of rain that will disfavor the driest areas from western into northern Cordoba and Santiago del Estero where greater rain is needed to improve conditions for winter wheat.



Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will still be enough to cause some fieldwork delays, especially in central production areas. Some needed rain is expected in Italy and the Balkan Countries though. Localized flooding may occur near the Alps. The rain will be a benefit to late season, immature crops, but drier weather would benefit harvesting progress. Hot temperatures in southern France, northwestern Italy and Spain continue to stress crops and cooling expected soon should bring at least some relief, although it is doubtful that much rain of significance will fall from France into Spain until late this weekend into next week.

AUSTRALIA : Rainfall will be mostly favorable in southern production areas in the next seven days, from southwestern Western Australia through Victoria and southern New South Wales. Queensland and northern New South Wales will receive some erratic showers with the need for much more rain continuing in this part of the region. Temperatures Friday and Saturday morning will be in the 20s in Victoria, New South Wales, and in pockets of southeastern South Australia. T
