
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
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
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South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : The main production areas in South Africa will see a good mix of rain and sunshine his week. Rainfall will be enough to keep soil moisture at adequate to excessive levels. Localized looding will be possible in Natal and immediate neighboring areas, which may disrupt fieldwork and cause minor crop damage. Production losses should be minimal. The environment will otherwise emain favorable for aggressive growth. Eastern and central South Africa will have several opportunities for rain this week o The most widespread and significant rain will occur through Thursday o Scattered showers will persist Friday and this weekend, most notably for eastern South Africa o Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 2.00-5.00" with local amounts of 7.00" or more in Natal, Mpumalanga, and eastern fringes of Eastern Cape and Free State o Other ocations will receive 0.75-3.00" of rain Western South Africa will have a few opportunities for erratic rain as well this week o Much of the rain will occur through mid-week o Eastern Northern Cape will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain and locally greater amounts by next Monday morning o Western Cape and ther areas in Northern Cap







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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : A mostly light mix of rain and snow fell on much of the region from eastern Kansas to Wisconsin and the eastern Corn Belt during the weekend with a large part of the eastern Dakotas in to Ainnesota seeing light precipitation as well. Two powerful winter storm systems will impact the Midwest today into Saturday with heavy snow and travel delays expected from each storm system before precipitation becomes less frequent and lighter Sunday through Jan. 22 while a surge of artic air impacts the region Saturday into early next week

U.S. DELTA : Widespread rain fell on the Delta and the Southeast during the weekend inducing some mprovements in drought conditions in the drier areas. The Delta and the Southeast will see a frequent succession of storm systems through the next week and significant relief from drought will occur in the drier areas while some areas see flooding as well with the heaviest rain occurring today into Tuesday.






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
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Colder, drier air in the first week of the outlook will lead to a general lack of much precipitation. Completely dry conditions are not expected, but shower activity will be more limited compared to the previous week. The colder air is partially the result of an ongoing Sudden Stratospheric Warming event; however, the coldest air will be located east of the region in Russia, at least in the next seven days. In the second week of the putlook, greater cooling could occur in northern or northeastern Europe

AUSTRALIA : Conditions in eastern Australia will be mostly favorable through the first week of the outlook. A favorable mix of rain and sunshine is expected; though, some pockets will be left a little drier than preferred, especially with the erratic nature of the rain. A general decrease in rain is also expected after Tuesday. Daily erratic shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in eastern areas through Thursday o Total moisture will vary mostly from 0.35 to 2.00 inches with a few greater amounts 🗈 Drier conditions are then likely Friday through Sunday o A few more erratic showers and thunderstorms are expected.
