



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South Africa - Weather



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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST : Planting should advance relatively well during the next two weeks around a few rounds of rain with most of the rain not likely to be heavy enough to cause lasting delays to fieldwork n most areas. o Cool temperatures Friday into Sunday will slow drying rates and the resumption of fieldwork in the wetter areas.

U.S. DELTA : Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will impact portions of the Delta and the Southeast through this weekend and planting will be slowed in some areas, but much of the rain is no likely to be heavy enough to cause lasting delays to fieldwork in most areas. o The Delta into central and northern Georgia will be wettest and showers will occur in parts of the region each day through Sunday and some parts of the region should receive rain often enough that planting is put on hold intil drier weather returns.









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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain will diminish today and areas in western and southern Brazil and Paraguay that have	
recently seen frequent rain will begin to dry down and will see improving conditions for fieldwork	
while soil moisture should be high enough to support much of the Safrinha corn crop into at least early	
May. o Totally dry weather is not expected and Paraguay and most of southern Brazil will receive at least some rain Sunday into Tuesday that will allow Safrinha corn to develop deeper into May if	
followup rain does not occur.	
ARGENTINA : Argentina is still expected to see an overall improving trend for harvesting during the	
next two weeks, but today's forecast is wetter for Apr. 24-26 and rain events Saturday into Monday and Apr. 24-26 will slow fieldwork in eastern Argentina while rain is lighter and interruptions to	
fieldwork will be shorter elsewhere. o Recent rain has likely left soil moisture high enough to favorably	
support immature crops through the next two weeks in nearly all of the country.


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rain in the next seven days will still occur mostly in northwestern production areas of the region, leaving a rising need for greater rainfall in areas such as the Balkan Countries and central and southern Italy. Above to well above average temperatures will also still cause higher than usual evaporation rates in the drier areas as well.

AUSTRALIA : Net drying will continue in a majority of eastern Australia through Sunday which will be beneficial for crop maturation and harvesting. Completely dry conditions are not expected, with some erratic shower and thunderstorm activity today through Wednesday along the Queensland/New South Wales border; though, this should not have a negative impact on the region other than delaying harvest progress briefly.



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
