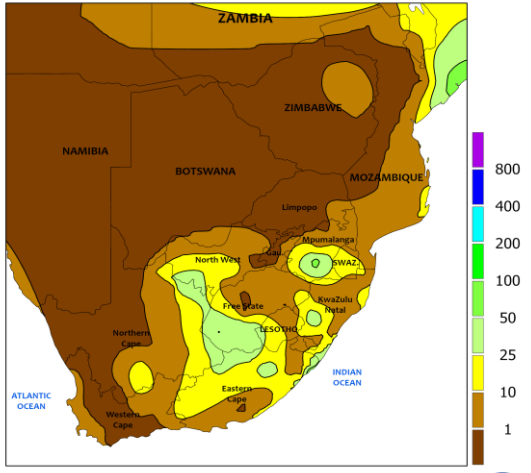

SOUTH AFRICA : South Africa will trend mostly dry this week. The lack of rain and warm weather will support a good environment for aggressive maturation and harvesting. Early-season winter wheat planting will also advance with few disruptions. South Africa will trend mostly dry this week o Any rain that does occur will be rapidly lost to evaporation o Dry or mostly dry weather will persist for much of South Africa May 7 – 13 o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation

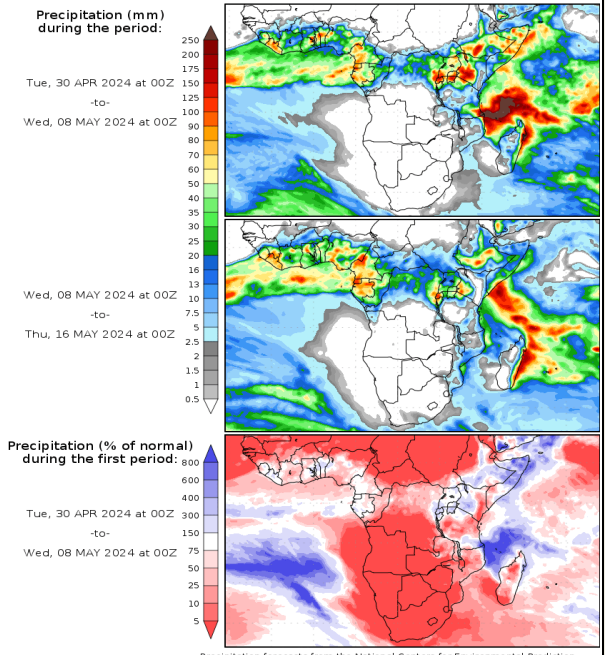


SOUTH AFRICA

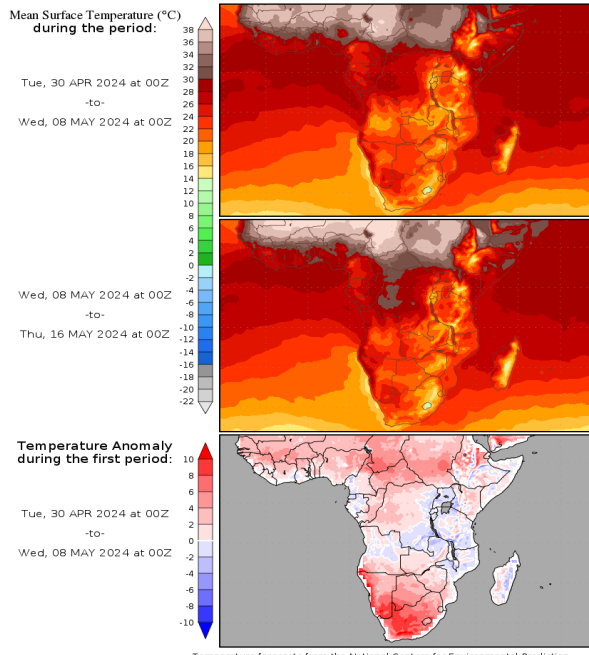
Precipitation Forecasts

Forecast Initialization Time: 00Z30APR2024

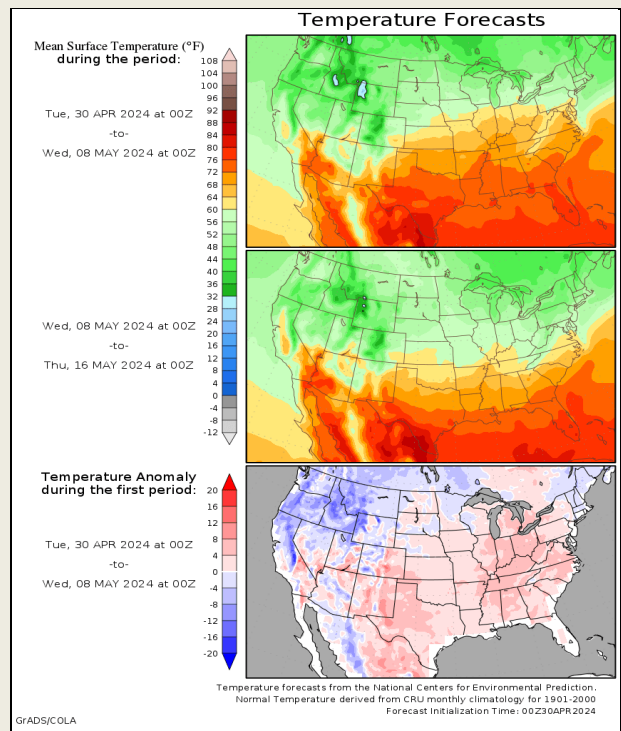
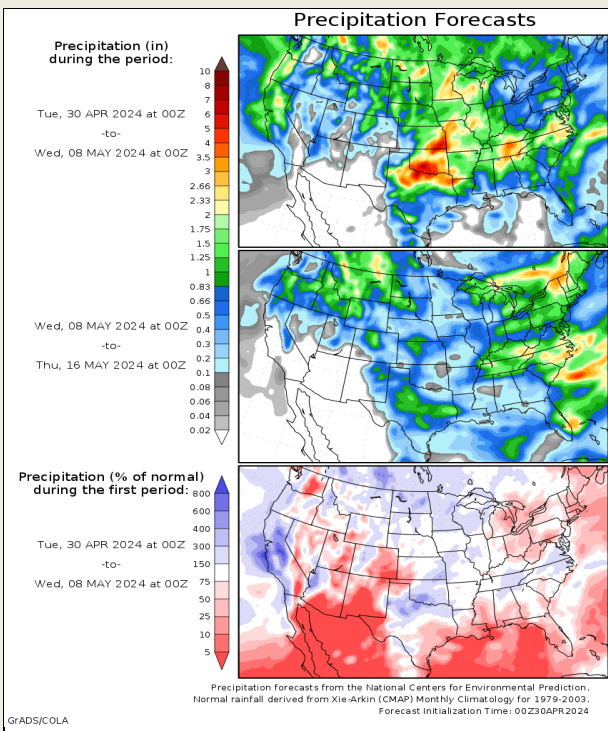
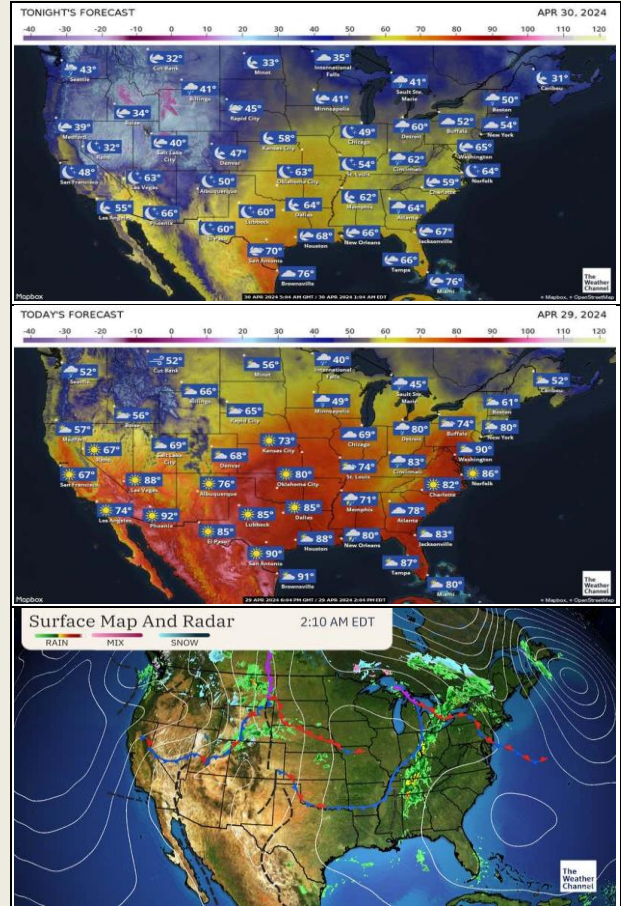
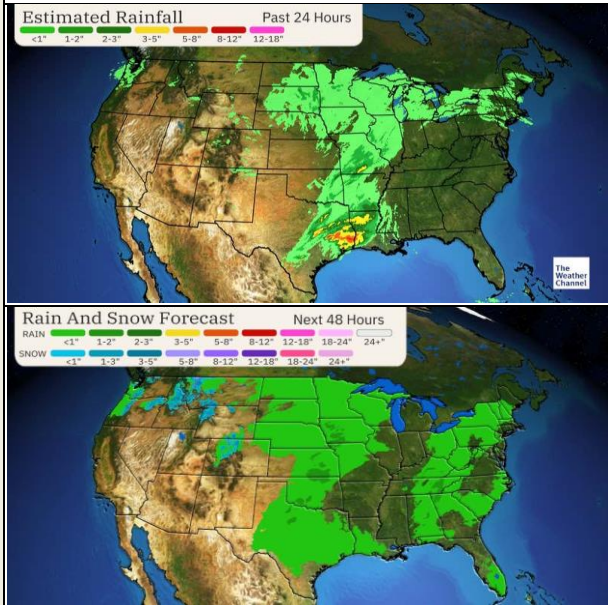

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Heavy rain and some flooding occurred during the weekend from portions of eastern Kansas to central and northern Missouri into parts of central and northeastern Missouri while significant rain and interruptions to fieldwork were common much of the remainder of Midwest outside of the Ohio River Basin. Regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur through May 9 slowing fieldwork across the Midwest with eastern Nebraska and eastern Kansas to Wisconsin seeing the poorest conditions for fieldwork and central and eastern Michigan to Ohio seeing the best conditions for fieldwork.

U.S. DELTA : Rain and some interruptions to planting occurred during the weekend in the Delta while much of the Southeast was dry and likely saw good planting progress. The two-week outlook is wetter overall for the Delta and the Southeast and planting should occur at a slower pace than what was advertised late last week while rain in the Southeast should restore some of the topsoil moisture recently lost to evaporation keeping conditions for crop development favorable.

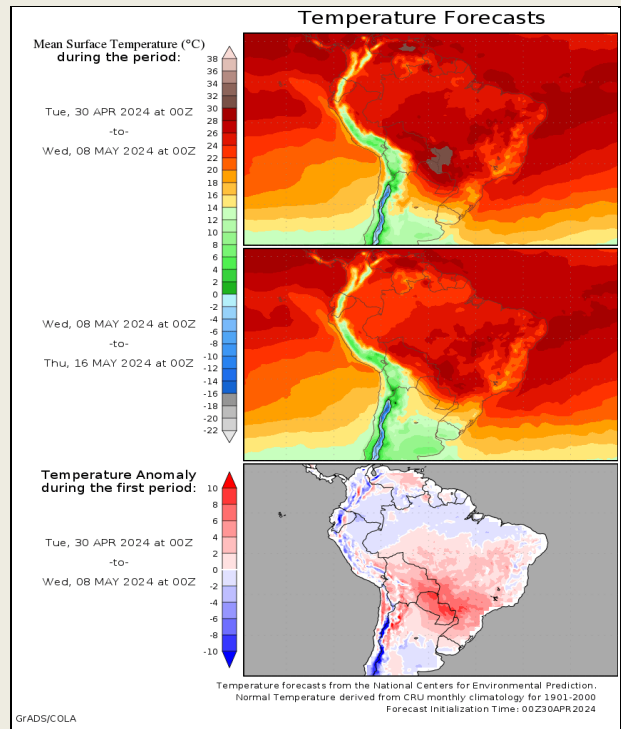
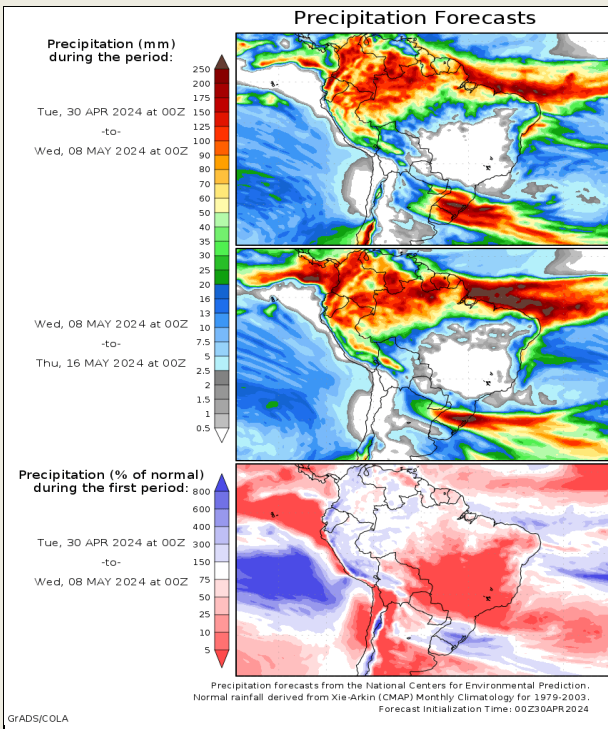
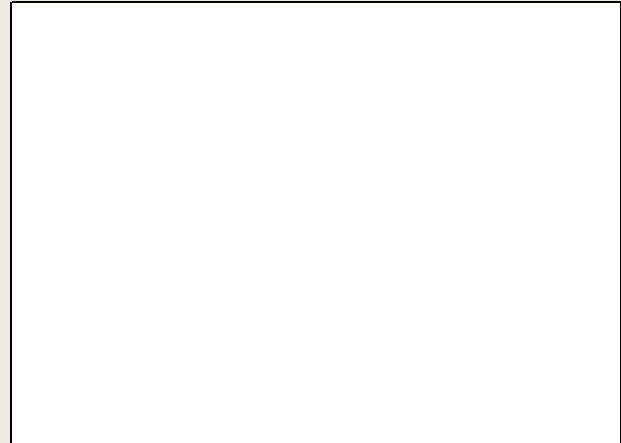

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain during the weekend was greatest from Rio Grande do Sul to interior eastern Parana while rain fell on southern Paraguay and parts of northeastern Brazil with welcome rain noted in parts of western and south-central Mato Grosso as well. Rain of significance during the next two weeks will be mostly confined to far southern Brazil and southern Paraguay leaving most Safrinha corn dependent on subsoil moisture in place to support the crop while harvesting of summer crops advances well elsewhere.

ARGENTINA : Additional rain fell on a large part of eastern Argentina during the weekend possibly causing some quality declines to the rice, cotton, and soybean crops while little rain fell on central and western Argentina. Frequent rounds of rain will impact northeastern and east-central Argentina through May 10 slowing fieldwork and some local flooding may occur while some rice, cotton, and soybeans could suffer from quality declines. Much of the remainder of the northern and eastern halves of Argentina will see occasional rounds of rain through May 10 with the precipitation not likely great enough to cause more than temporary interruptions to fieldwork.

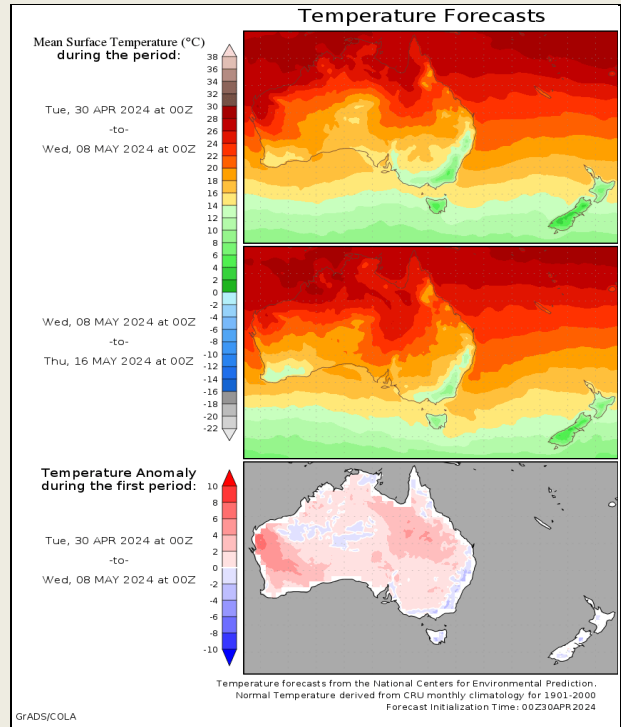
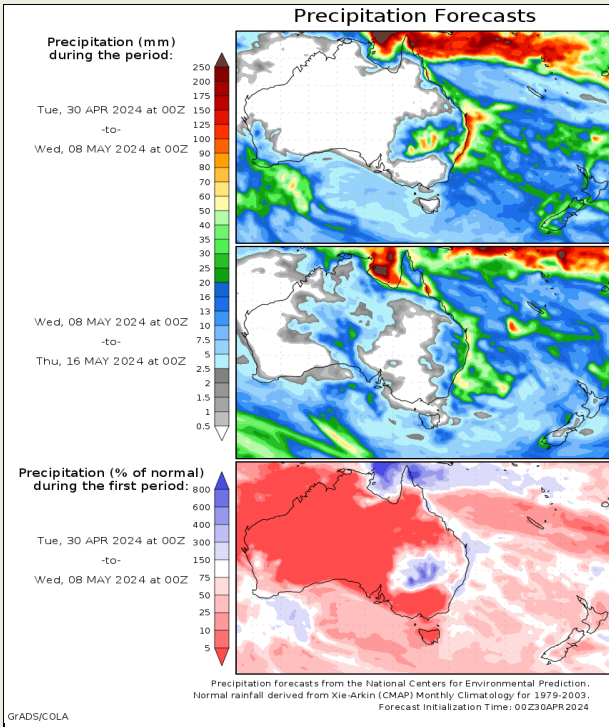
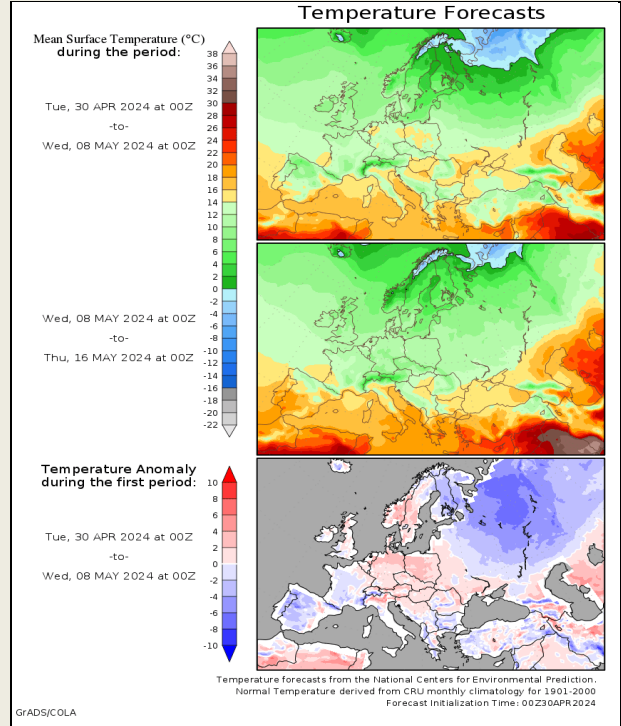
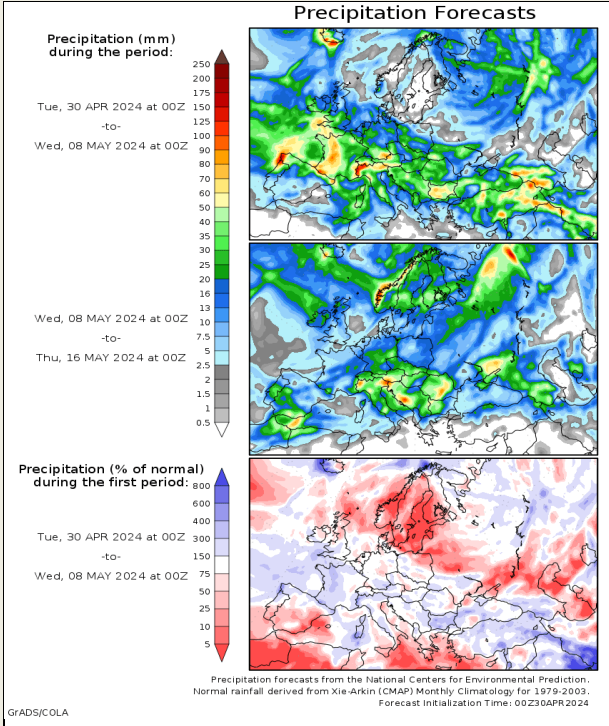

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will favor western and south-central production areas. Some beneficial rain shower activity will occur in eastern Spain; however, eastern France may receive too much rain leading to areas of flooding. Some beneficial rain shower activity will also occur in Balkan Countries. Areas in and near Poland will be driest.

AUSTRALIA : Rain shower activity in the next seven days will be greatest in New South Wales, especially Friday into Saturday. The rain may be enough to interfere with some fieldwork progress. Some rain showers will also occur in Western Australia; though, this is unlikely to be enough to greatly affect soil moisture, leaving a need for more rain. Rain showers will occur in parts of the production region most days through Sunday. The rain will be greatest Friday into Saturday in New South Wales. Total moisture through Sunday will vary from: 0.25 to 1.00 inch in New South Wales, locally more possible. Mostly 0.10 to 0.35 inch in Queensland and Western Australia. Little to none elsewhere. Some occasional shower activity is likely in the second week, May 6 – 13, mainly in eastern production areas
