

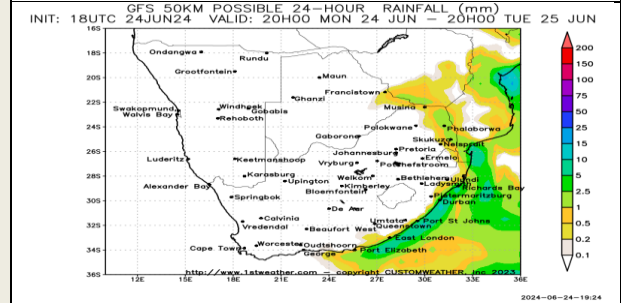
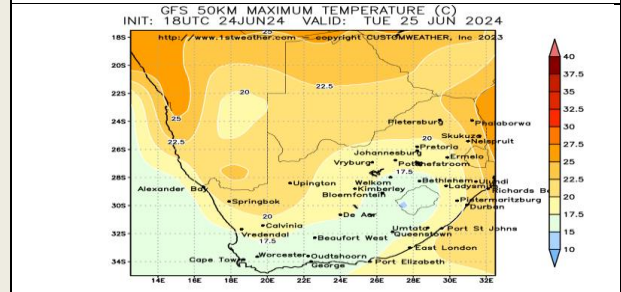
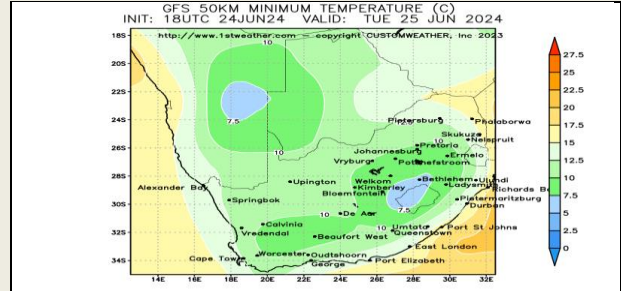


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : South Africa will receive little to no rain this week. The lack of rain and warm weather will continue to support good harvest and winter wheat conditions. Timely rain will be needed in Free State later this winter to support good long-term wheat prospects. South Africa will be mostly dry this week o Light rain will be scattered across eastern South Africa through the end of the work week ☐ Much of the rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation ☐ Dry or mostly dry weather will persist for much of South Africa July 2 – 8 o Light rain will still be possible in the south and east

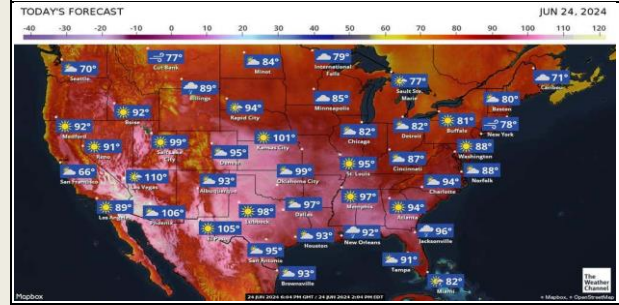
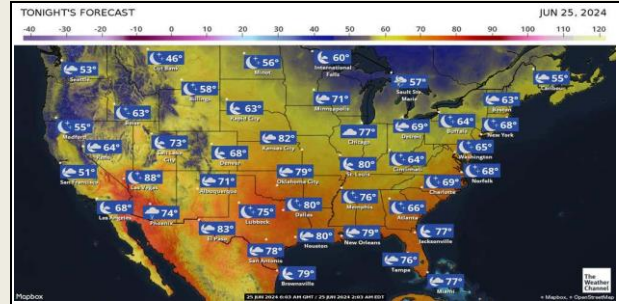

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Rain fell on much of the Midwest outside of some southwestern locations during the weekend and temporary relief from dryness occurred in the driest areas from northcentral and eastern Missouri to Ohio and Kentucky where much of the rain was light and the moisture will be quickly lost to evaporation. Hot and dry weather today from the southwestern to the eastern Corn Belt will stress crops, and especially crops in the many areas with short topsoil moisture, before a wetter and cooler weather pattern occurs Tuesday into Wednesday, July 3. Enough rain is expected to induce at least temporary improvements in soil moisture while improving conditions for crops and especially newly-planted crops with shallow root systems in need of greater topsoil moisture to become well-established.

U.S. DELTA : Warm to hot and dry weather and some stress to crops continued in much of the Delta and the Southeast during the weekend while an area of rain noted from northeastern Florida to southeastern Georgia to the central South Carolina coast. The Delta and the Southeast will see warm to hot temperatures and limited rain during the next ten days to two weeks and stress to crops should rise in some areas as topsoil moisture is short in much of the region and the adequate to marginal subsoil moisture in most areas declines and likely becomes short in a large part of the region.

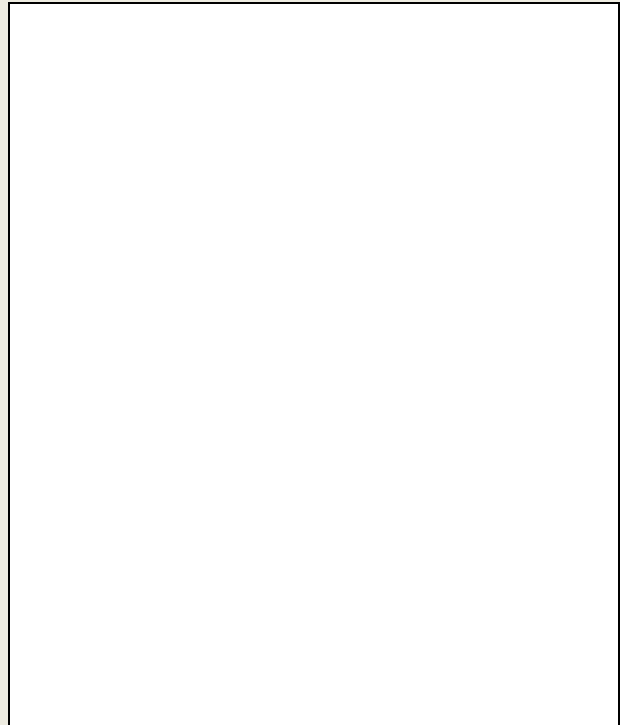
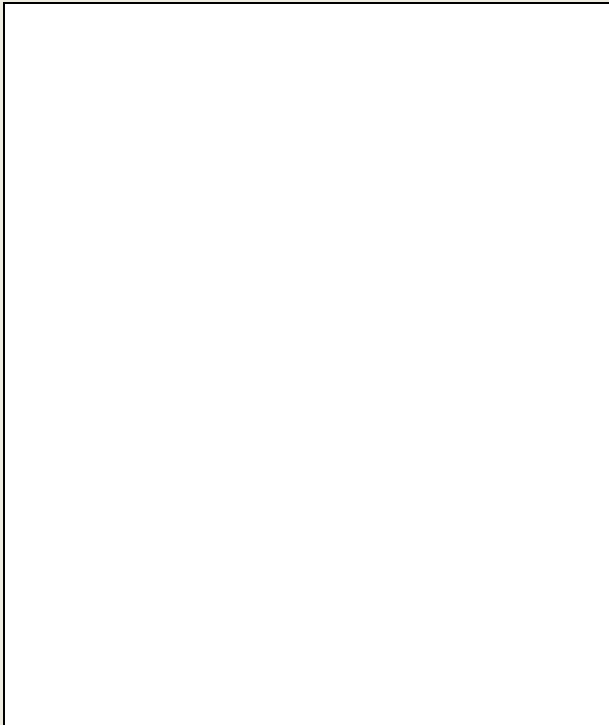
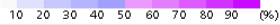
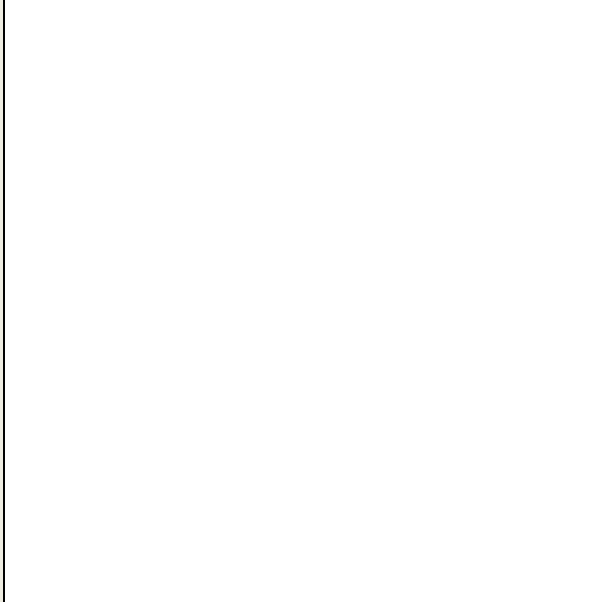

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain continued in far southern Brazil and southern into portions of central Paraguay during the weekend where winter wheat planting delays were extended while portions of northeastern Brazil also received rain with mostly dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork elsewhere. Northern Rio Grande do Sul into Santa Catarina will see moderate to heavy rain into Wednesday and further delays to winter wheat planting will result while some local flooding may occur as well with southern Paraguay also expected to receive significant rain.

ARGENTINA: Rain and temporary interruptions to fieldwork occurred in much of southern and a few central and northern Argentina locations during the weekend with the rain beneficial for winter wheat while most other areas were dry. Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through the next two weeks with a few rounds of light showers that will favor eastern areas.

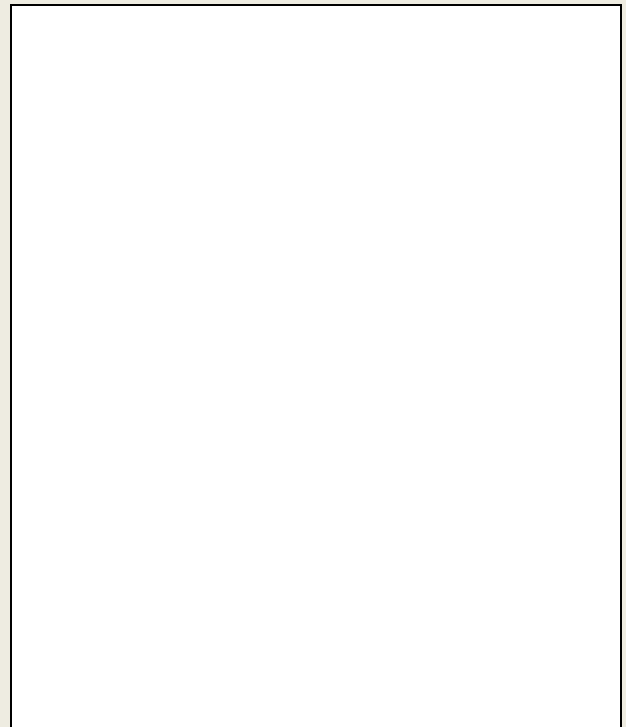
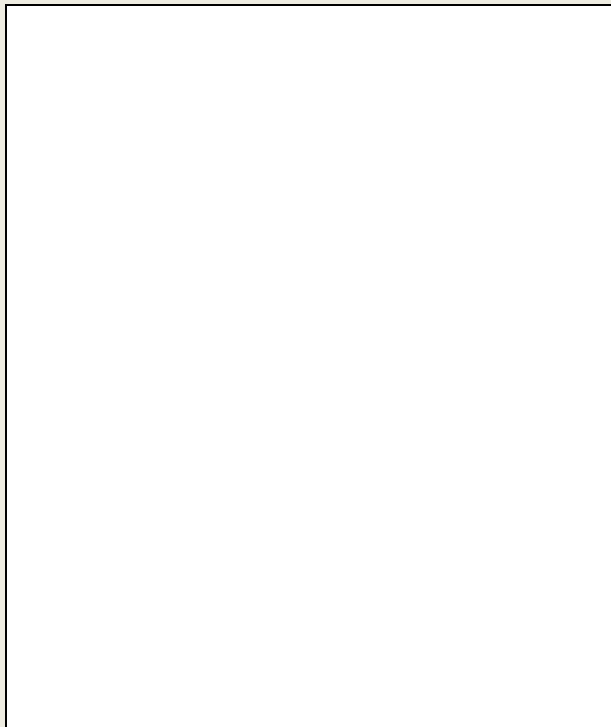
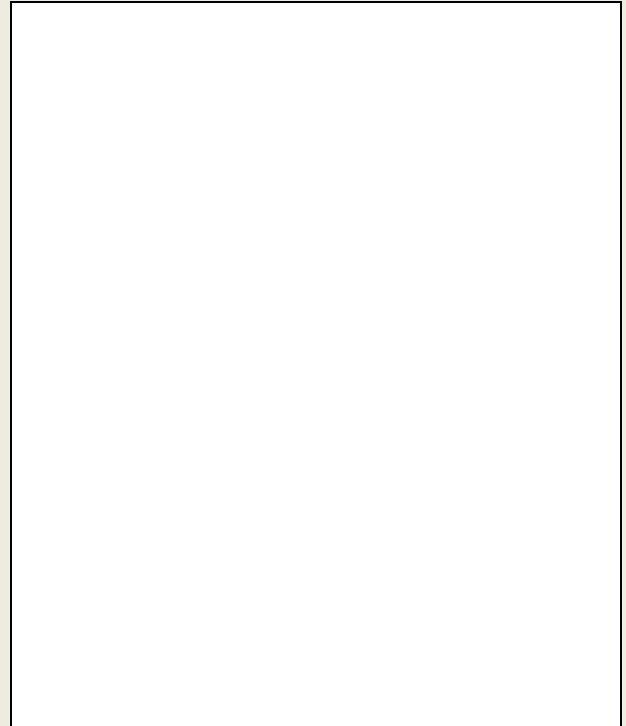
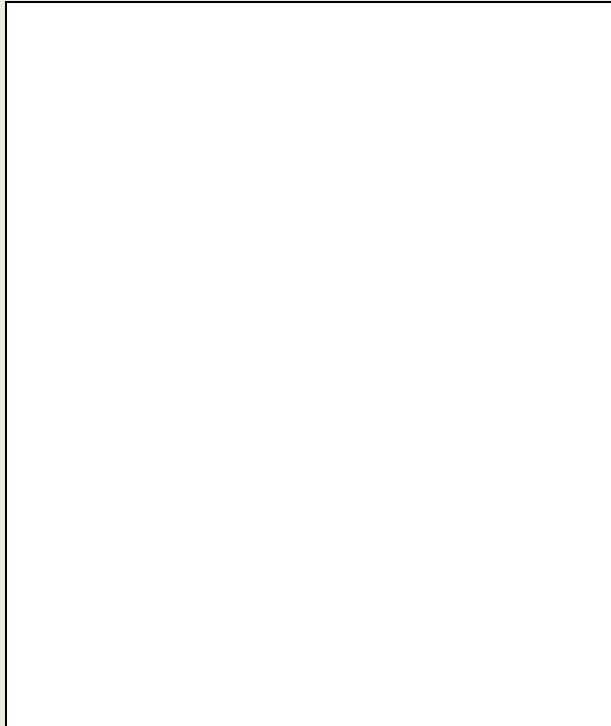

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will be significant in central production areas with fieldwork delays and localized flooding. Conditions in most other areas will be more favorable. The Balkan Countries should receive some needed rain. Daily shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in the region through Sunday o Totals moisture will vary from 0.75 to 2.50 inches in around 70% of the region @ Locally more than 3.50 inches, especially in central production areas near the Alps

AUSTRALIA : Some increase in shower activity in the first week of the outlook will be beneficial for the region. There will be areas that will still be in need of greater rainfall, mainly in Queensland and South Australia, but the rain that does occur will be good. Rain shower activity will occur in parts of the region most days through Sunday o Total moisture will vary from 0.20 to 0.80 inch, locally more than 1.00 inch @ Occasional rain shower activity is likely in the second week, July 1 – 8
