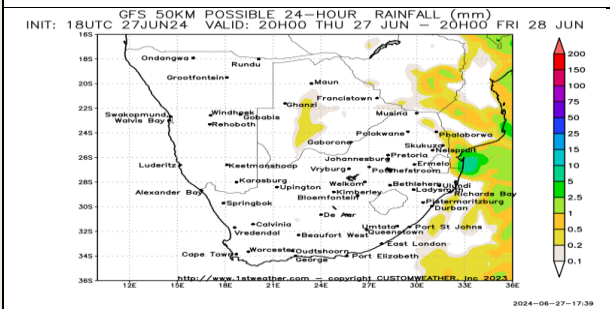
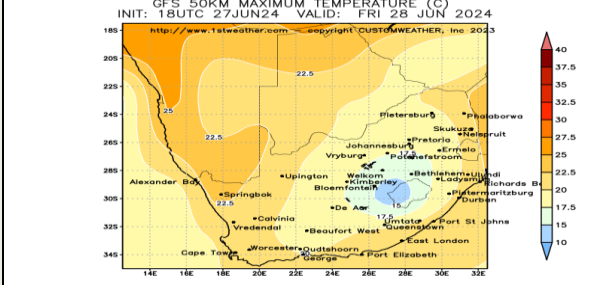
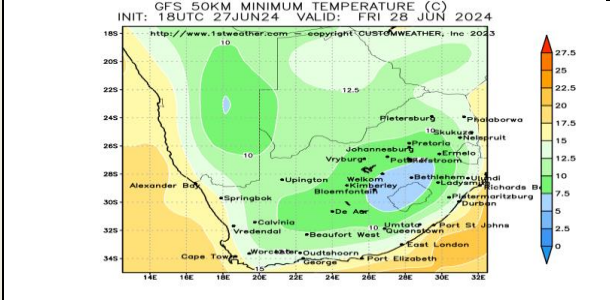
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Dry and mostly dry weather will persist for much of South Africa during the coming week. Harvesting and general fieldwork will continue with few disruptions. Winter wheat prospects will remain generally favorable as well. South Africa will be mostly dry during the coming week. Light rain will still be scattered across eastern South Africa through the end of the work week. Much of the rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation. Dry or mostly dry weather will persist for much of South Africa July 3 – 9. Light rain will still be possible in the south and east.

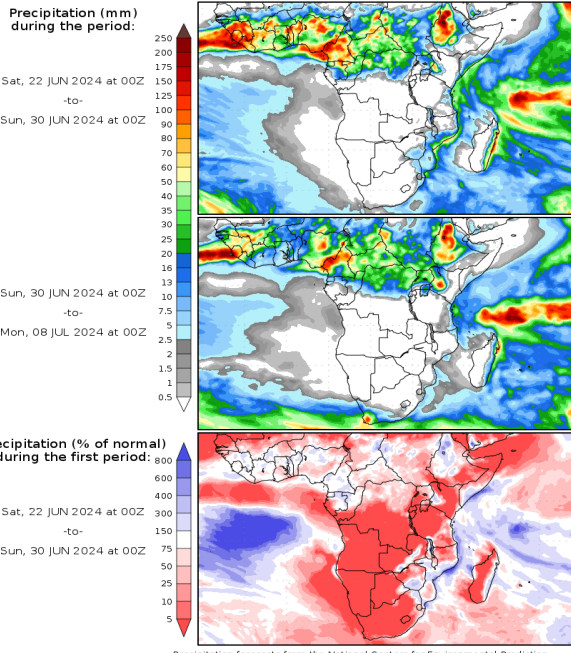
SOUTH AFRICA

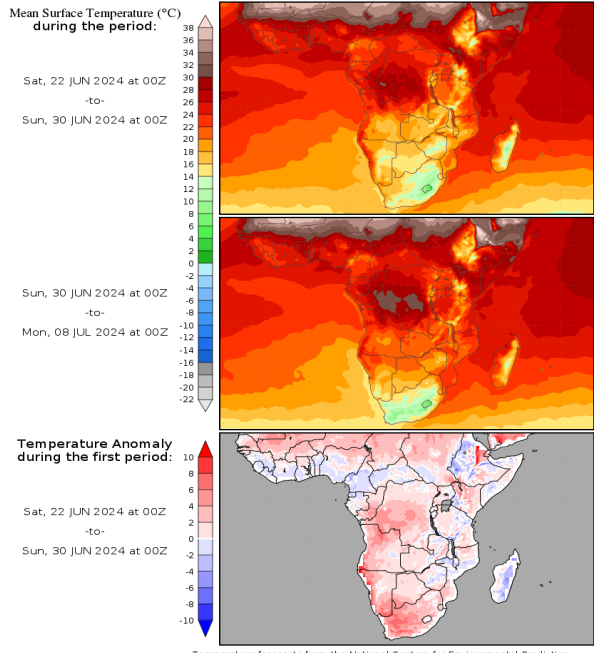
Precipitation Forecasts

Forecast Initialization Time: 00Z22JUN2024

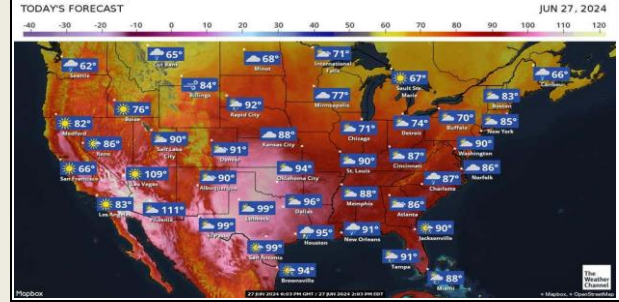
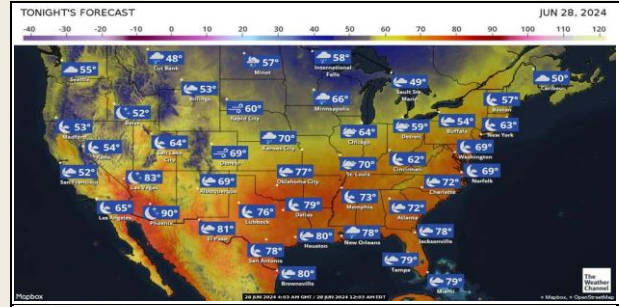

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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Much of the lower Midwest will see another hot day today while rain increases from the southwestern to the eastern Corn Belt today into Wednesday and much of the region sees multiple rounds of rain by Wednesday of next week while temperatures become cooler Wednesday through Monday. Enough rain is expected to induce at least temporary improvements in topsoil moisture and improve conditions for crops, especially newly-planted crops with shallow root systems that are in need of greater topsoil moisture to become well-established.

U.S. DELTA : The Delta and the Southeast will see warm to hot temperatures and limited rain during the next ten days to two weeks and stress to crops should rise in some areas as topsoil moisture is short in much of the region and the adequate to marginal subsoil moisture in most areas declines and likely becomes short in a large part of the region. Showers tonight through Monday will be important in slowing drying rates and buying crops more time before greater crop stress evolves.

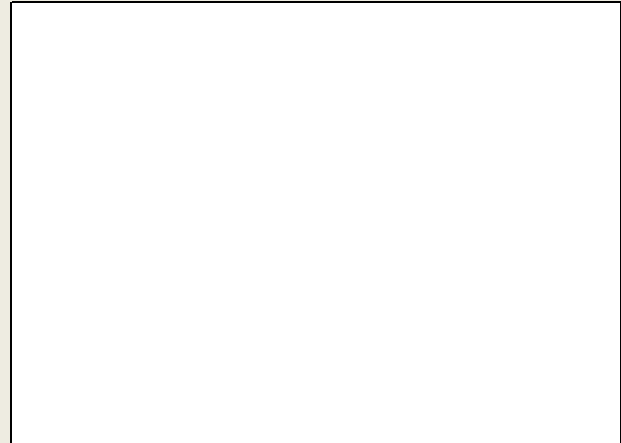


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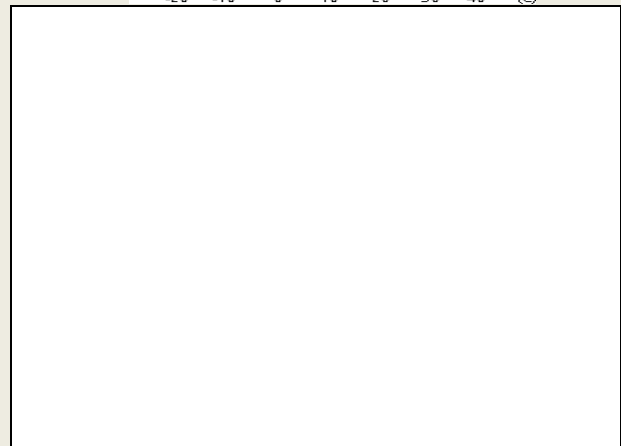
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Northern Rio Grande do Sul into Santa Catarina will see additional rain into Wednesday and further delays to winter wheat planting will result with southern Paraguay also expected to receive additional rain. o Much of the same region will see additional showers Friday into Saturday causing further delays to winter wheat planting while showers extend further to the north into central Mato Grosso do Sul, Parana, and portions of Sao Paulo and southern Minas Gerais Saturday into Monday.

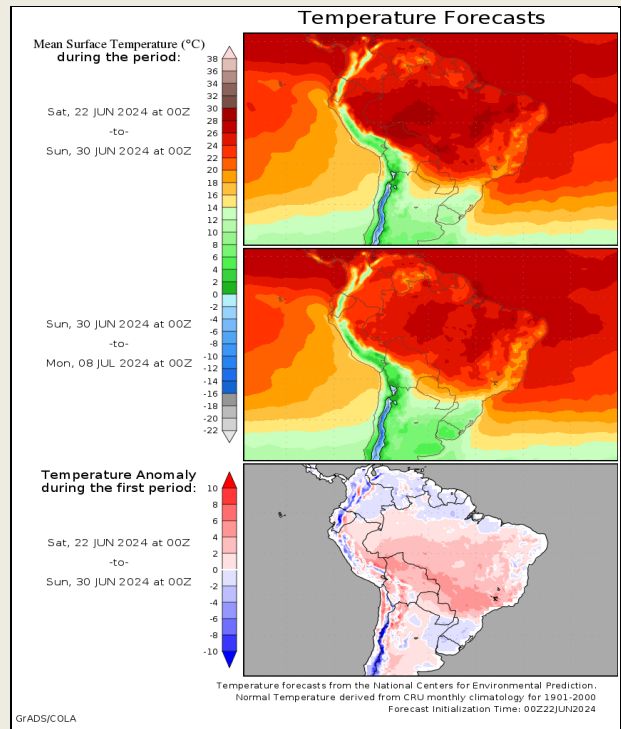
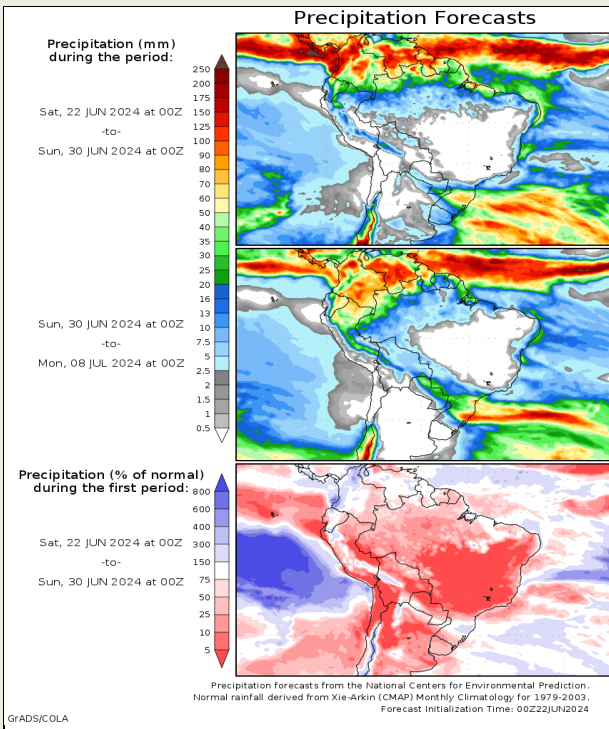
ARGENTINA : Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through the next two weeks with a few rounds of light showers that will favor eastern areas. o Winter wheat planting should advance well and although much of the country has enough soil moisture for the crop to germinate, many areas would benefit from greater rain to ensure the crop becomes well-established.

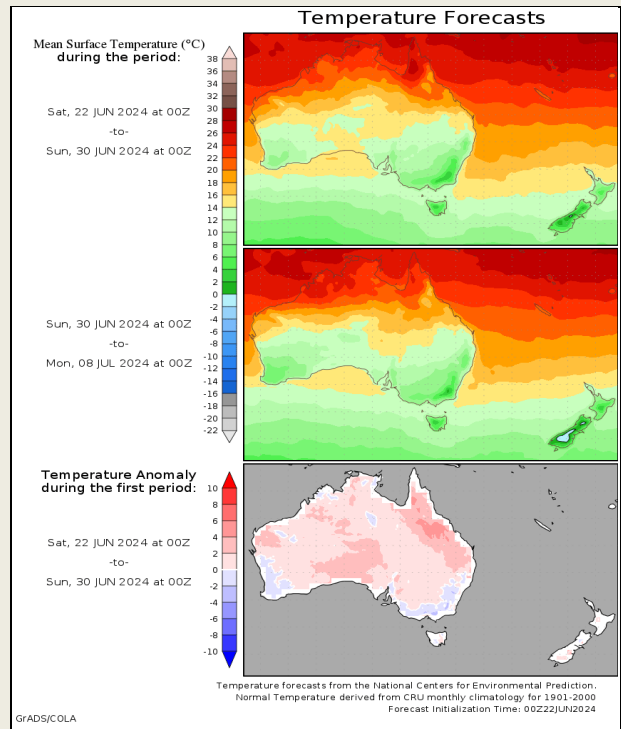
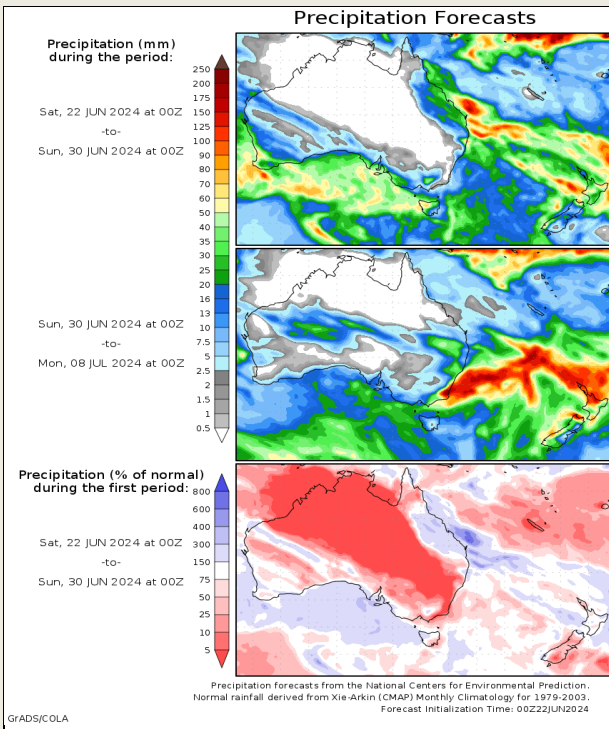
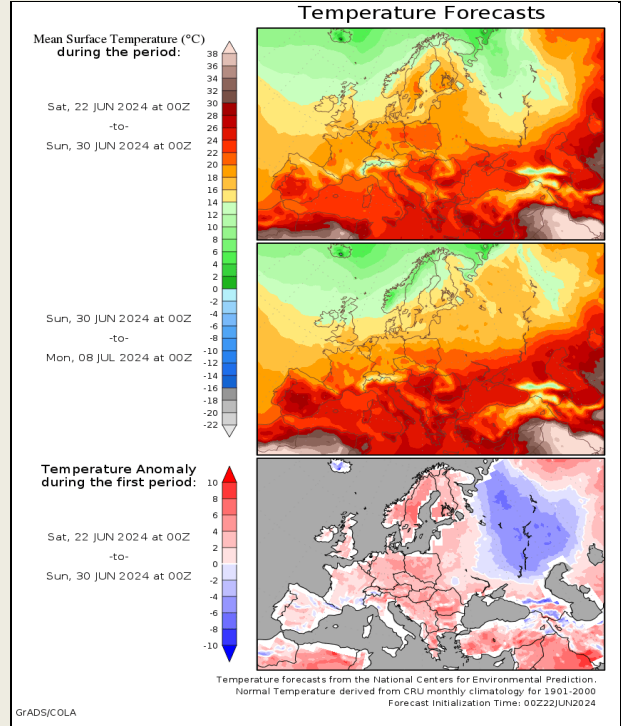
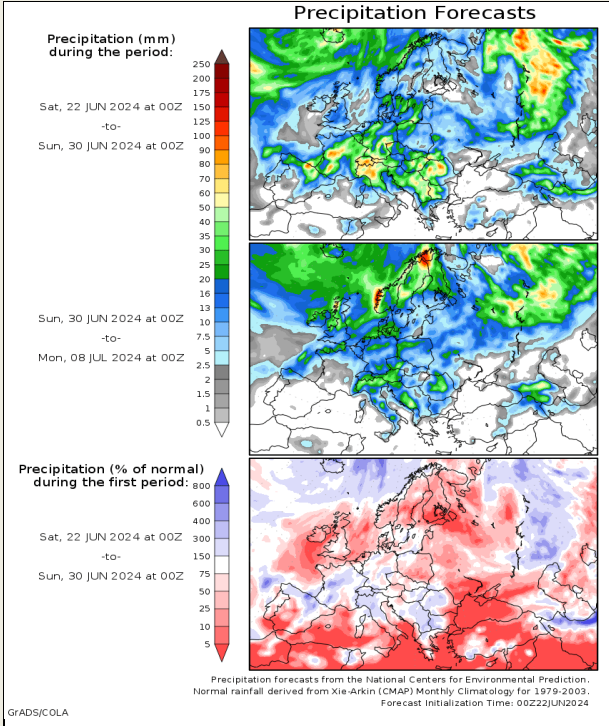


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will be more than preferred for some areas, leading to some fieldwork delays and localized flooding. This will be mainly an issue for central parts of the region, especially near the Alps and in France where topsoil moisture is already excessive. The rain will be beneficial and needed in the Balkan Countries.

AUSTRALIA : Some increase in shower activity in the first week of the outlook will be beneficial for the region. There will be areas that will still be in need of greater rainfall, mainly in Queensland and South Australia, but the rain that does occur will be good. Rain shower activity will occur in parts of the region most days through Sunday. Total moisture will vary from 0.20 to 0.80 inch, locally more than 1.00 inch. Occasional rain shower activity is likely in the second week, July 1 – 8



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
