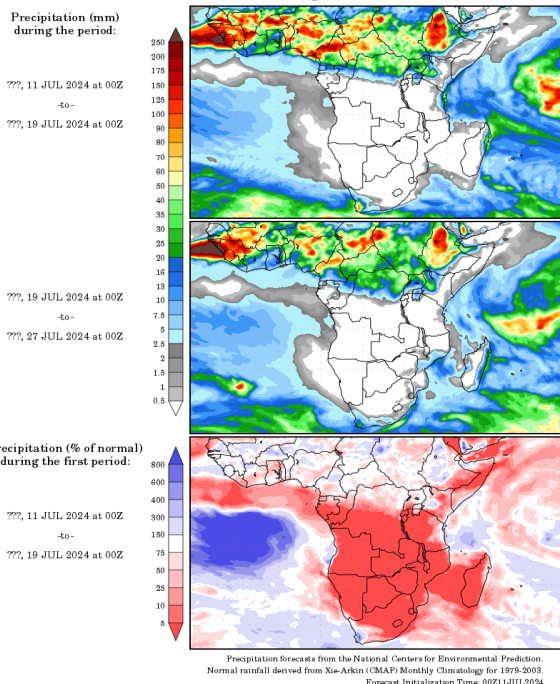
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Western Cape and neighboring areas will continue to have several opportunities for rain through the middle of next week. Rainfall will support favorable long-term winter wheat conditions. Dry or mostly dry weather is slated for the remaining production areas. Harvesting and general fieldwork will continue with few disruptions. South Africa will receive varying amounts of rain through the middle of next week. Disturbances will often promote rain in Western Cape and neighboring areas in Northern Cape through the end of the weekend. Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.50-4.00" with local amounts of 7.00" or more in the western half of Western Cape. Other areas in Western Cape and neighboring areas in southern and western Northern Cape will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts. The remaining production areas will be dry or mostly dry. Southern and western South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain July 18 - 24. The remaining production areas will receive little to no rain.

June 30 - July 6, 2024

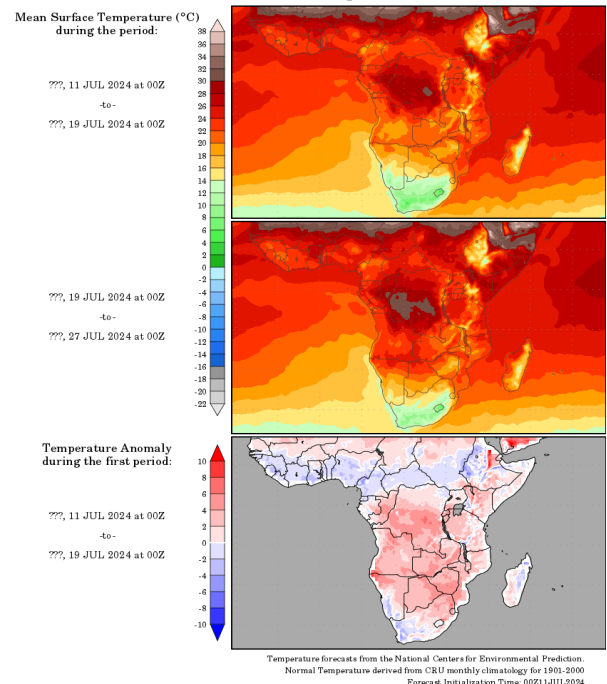


Precipitation Forecasts

Temperature Forecasts



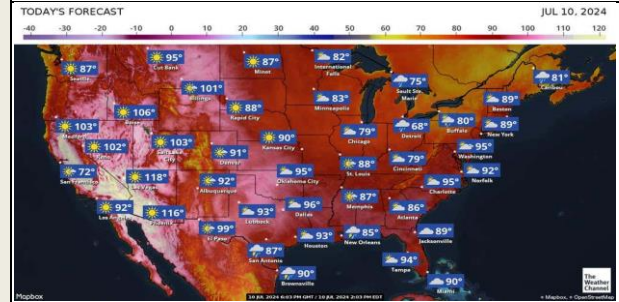
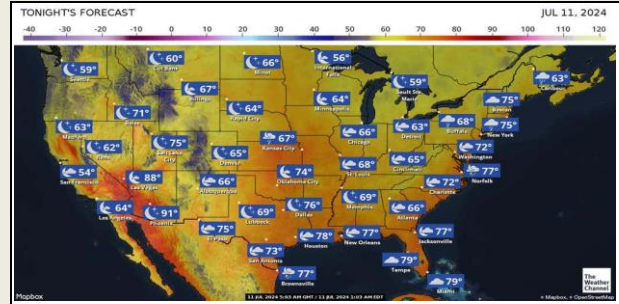

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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Crops in the driest areas in Illinois and Indiana benefitted from much colder than normal temperatures and soaking rain from the remnants of Hurricane Beryl Tuesday while rain extended to the west into central Missouri and elsewhere into Kentucky, western Ohio, and Michigan. Favorable soil moisture in place today along with mostly mild temperatures through Friday and a lack of widespread heat through the next week will keep crop conditions mostly favorable during a drier weather pattern expected during next two weeks that will leave many areas much drier in two weeks than today

U.S. DELTA : Welcome rain fell on the northern Delta and several locations in the Southeast Tuesday while much of the rain was too light to induce a lasting increase in soil moisture. The Delta and the Southeast will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the next two weeks with significant and highly beneficial rain expected in the driest areas in the Carolinas and southern Virginia today into Friday while rain elsewhere through Tuesday is not likely to be great enough to prevent many areas from drying down. Follow-up showers advertised for July 21-24 will be important in maintaining improvements in crop and soil conditions that result from rain July 17-20.



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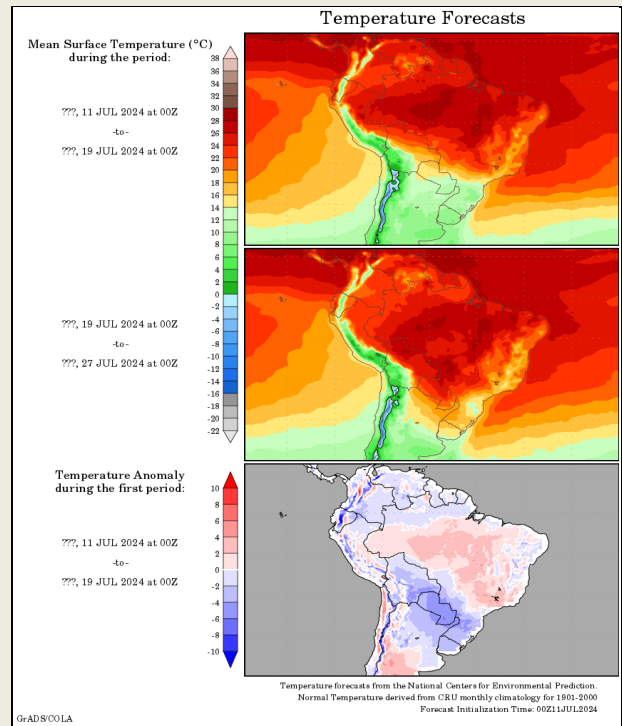
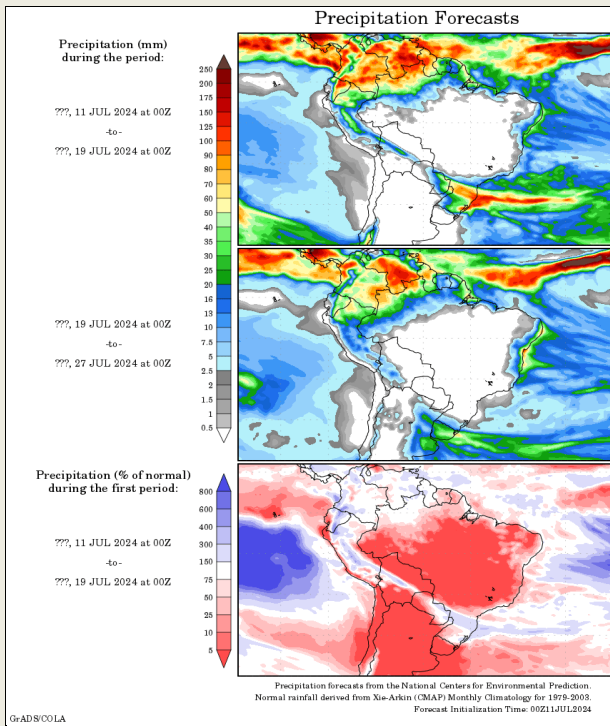
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Another round of rain and interruptions to Safrinha corn harvesting occurred from central and southern Mato Grosso do Sul to central and eastern Sao Paulo and nearby Minas Gerais to northern, central, and most of eastern Rio Grande do Sul Tuesday while most other areas were dry. Central and southern Mato Grosso do Sul and central Paraguay to eastern Sao Paulo and Parana to Santa Catarina and northeastern Rio Grande do Sul will see regular rounds of rain through Tuesday that will temporarily slow Safrinha corn harvesting before drier weather July 17-24 allows harvesting to resume.

ARGENTINA : Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through much the next two weeks with a few light showers that should not bring enough rain to have a significant impact on crops or soil conditions.

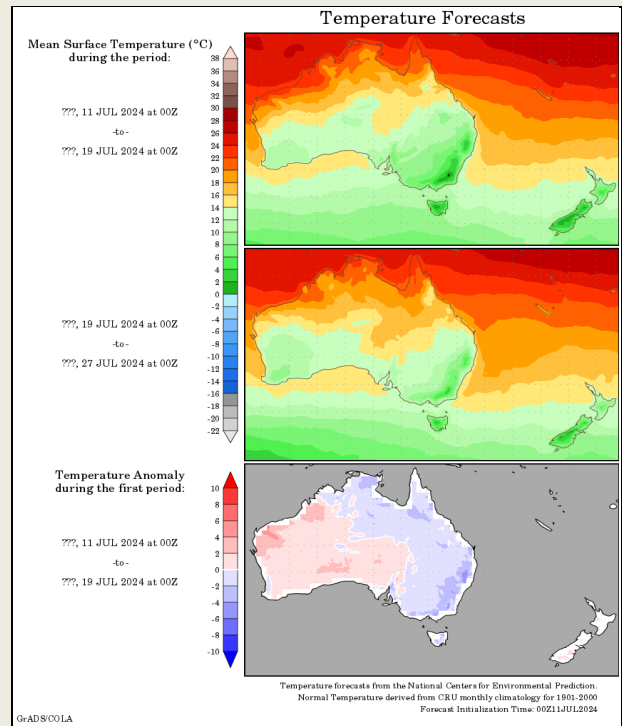
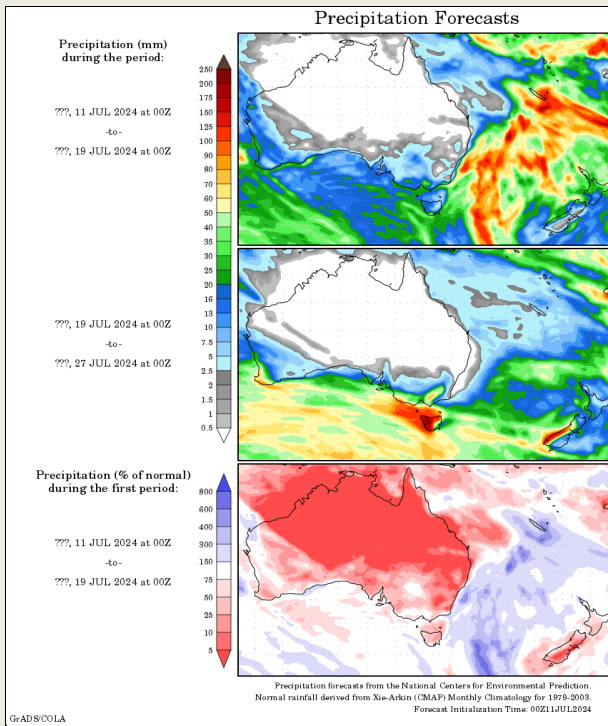
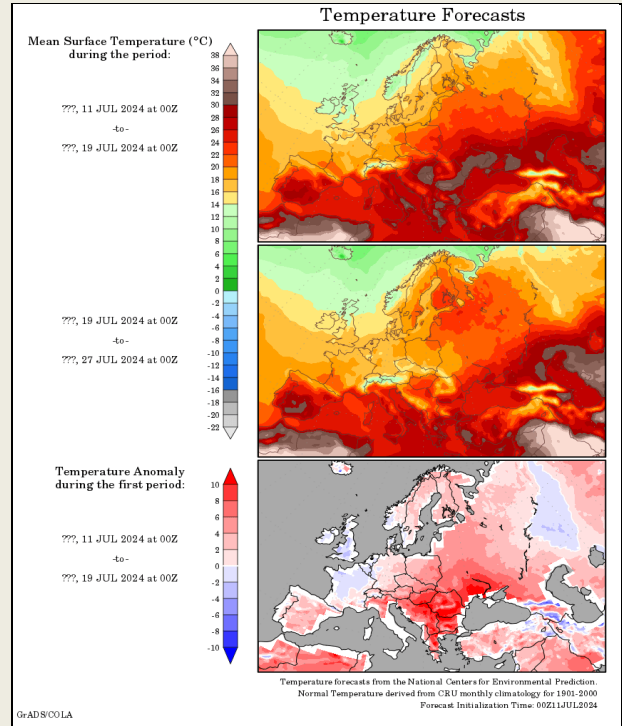
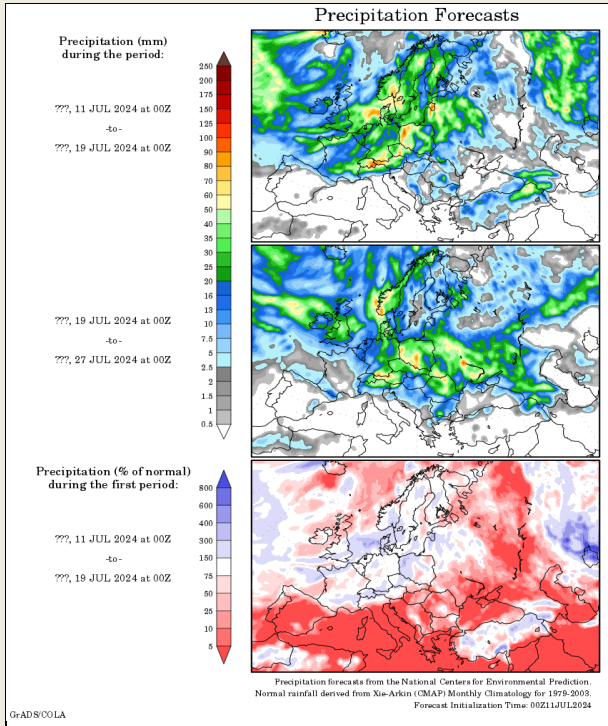


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days is still expected to be limited mainly to the northern half of the region where some pockets may receive a little too much leading to fieldwork delays and localized flooding. Southern production areas from Portugal through the Balkan Countries will have net drying with a rising need for more moisture. Extreme heat is expected in Italy and the Balkan Countries where livestock and crop stress is most likely. Shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in the region daily through Tuesday o Totals moisture will vary from: ☐ Little to none in the area from Portugal through the Balkan Countries ☐ 0.35 to 2.00 inches in much of the area farther to the north, some local amounts of 2.50 to 4.00 inches

AUSTRALIA : Conditions in the next seven days will be mostly favorable for the region with a mix of rain and sunshine; though, some pockets of the region could still use greater rainfall, especially in South Australia and in northeastern production areas of Western Australia. Occasional rain shower activity will occur through Tuesday o Total moisture is expected to vary from: ☐ 0.10 to 0.50 inch in South Australia, Victoria, and southern New South Wales ☐ Locally more mainly in Victoria



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
