



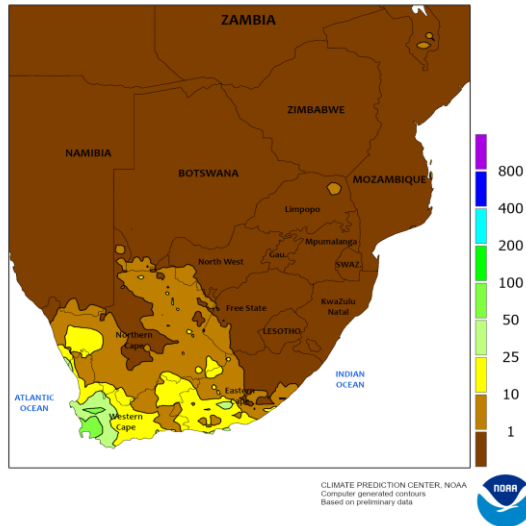

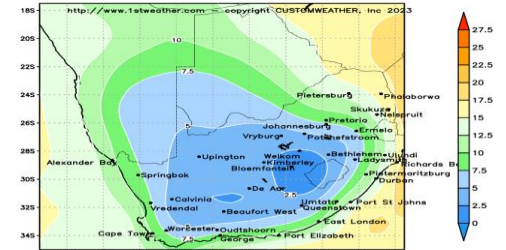
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Waves of rain will persist for Western Cape and neighboring areas during the coming week. The rain will continue to support favorable long-term winter wheat prospects. The remaining production areas will be dry which will be beneficial for harvesting and fieldwork. South Africa will receive varying amounts of rain during the coming week. Disturbances will often promote rain in Western Cape and neighboring areas in Northern Cape through to a few light showers will also be possible at the beginning and middle of next week. Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from 0.50-4.00" with local amounts of 6.00" or more in the western half of Western Cape. Other areas in Western Cape and neighboring areas in southern and western Northern Cape will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally greater amounts. The remaining production areas will be dry or mostly dry. Southern and western South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain July 19 – 25. The remaining production areas will receive little to no rain by the end of the weekend.

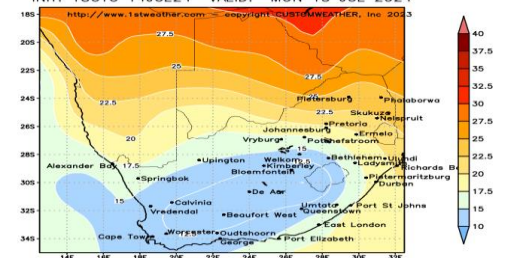
SOUTH AFRICA

June 30 - July 6, 2024



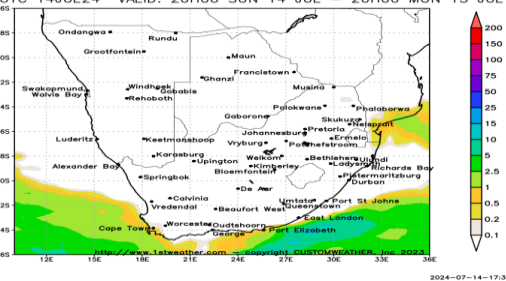
GFS 50KM MINIMUM TEMPERATURE (C)
INIT: 18UTC 14JUL24 VALID: MON 15 JUL 2024



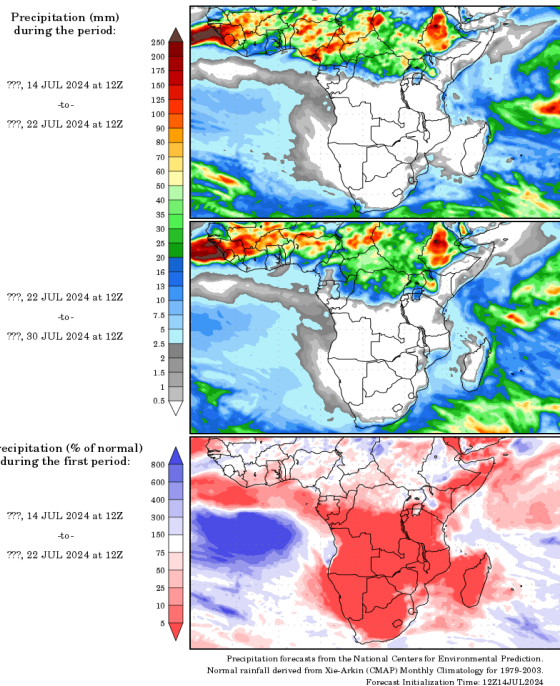
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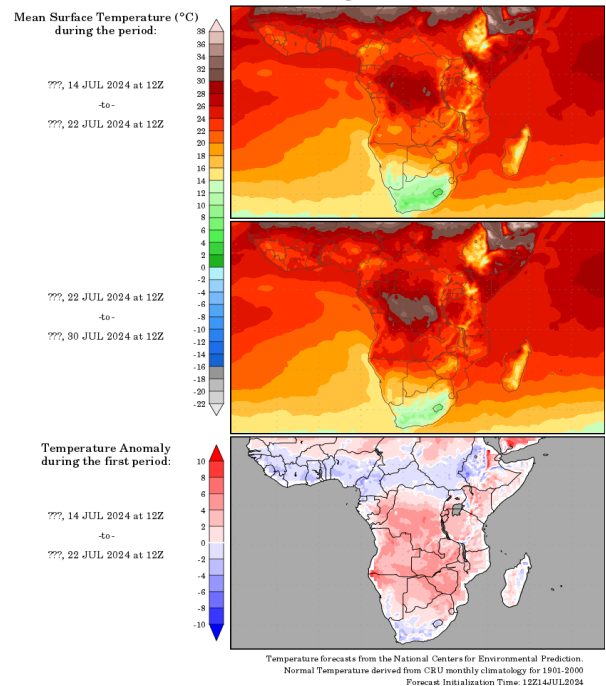
GFS 50KM POSSIBLE 24-HOUR RAINFALL (mm)

Temperature Forecasts

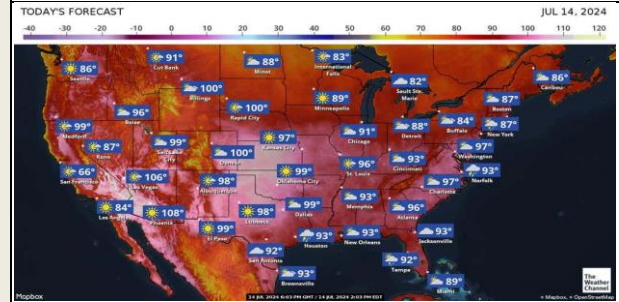
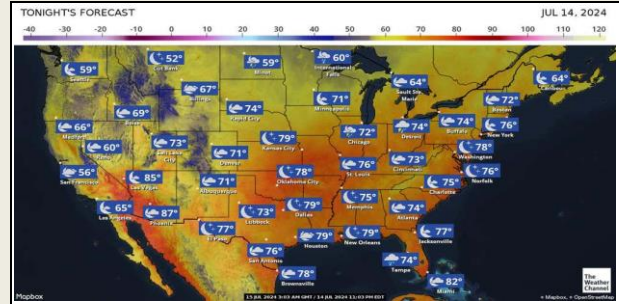


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : Wednesday was a favorable day for crop development in much of the Midwest as temperature were mild and the soil is moist in much of the region while rain fell on many areas from central to southern Minnesota to north-central to eastern Iowa and northern Missouri to east-central Illinois to Michigan and northern Ohio. Favorable soil moisture in place today along with mostly mild temperatures through Friday and a lack of widespread heat through the next week will keep crop conditions mostly favorable during a drier weather pattern expected during next two weeks that will leave many areas much drier in two weeks than today.

U.S. DELTA : Beneficial rain fell on a few of the drier areas in central and eastern North Carolina Wednesday while rain also fell on portions of northern Florida and south-central Georgia while most other areas were dry. The Delta and the Southeast will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the next two weeks with significant and highly beneficial rain expected in many of the driest areas in Carolinas and southern Virginia today into Saturday while rain elsewhere through Tuesday is not likely to be great enough to prevent many areas from drying down.



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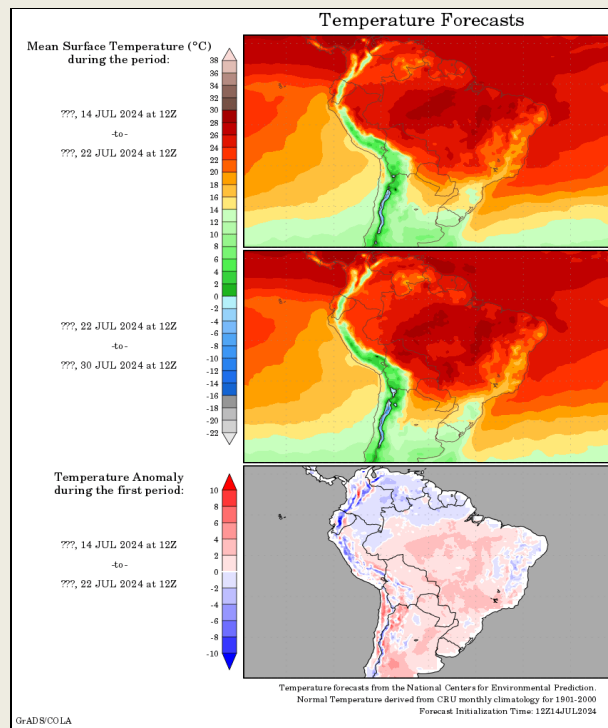
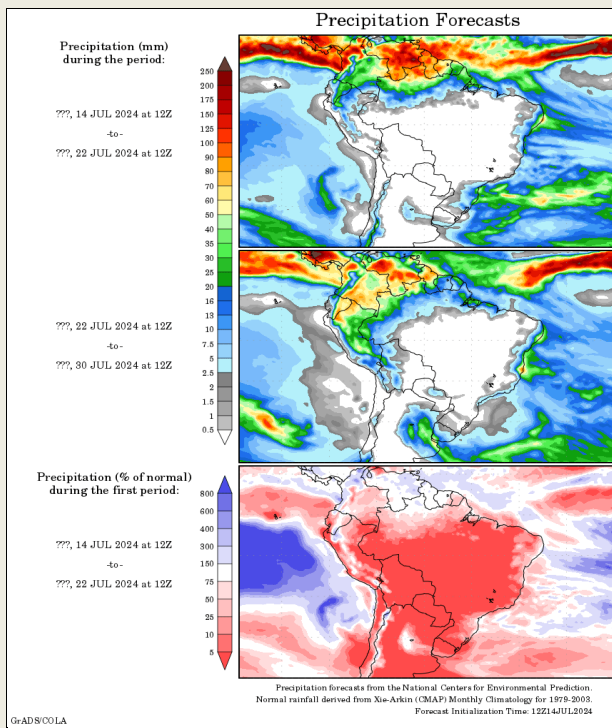
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Additional rain and interruptions to Safrinha corn harvesting occurred from central Paraguay and central and southern Mato Grosso do Sul to Parana and east-central Sao Paulo to the eastern half and portions of southwestern Rio Grande do Sul Wednesday while most other area were dry. Central and southern Mato Grosso do Sul and central Paraguay to eastern Sao Paulo and Parana to Santa Catarina and northeastern Rio Grande do Sul will see regular rounds of rain through Sunday that will temporarily slow Safrinha corn harvesting before drier weather Monday through July 25 allows harvesting to resume.

ARGENTINA : Argentina was mostly dry and saw favorable conditions for fieldwork Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through much the next two weeks with a few light showers that should not bring enough rain to have a significant impact on crops or soil conditions. Wednesday. Winter wheat in west-central and northwestern Argentina would benefit from greater rain. o One round of organized rain may occur July 18-20 with confidence for this event low and early indications suggesting much of the rain will be light.

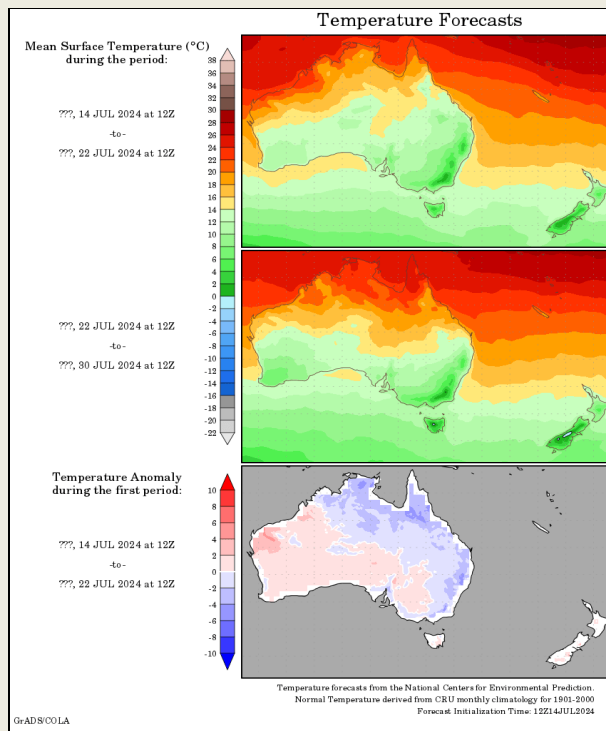
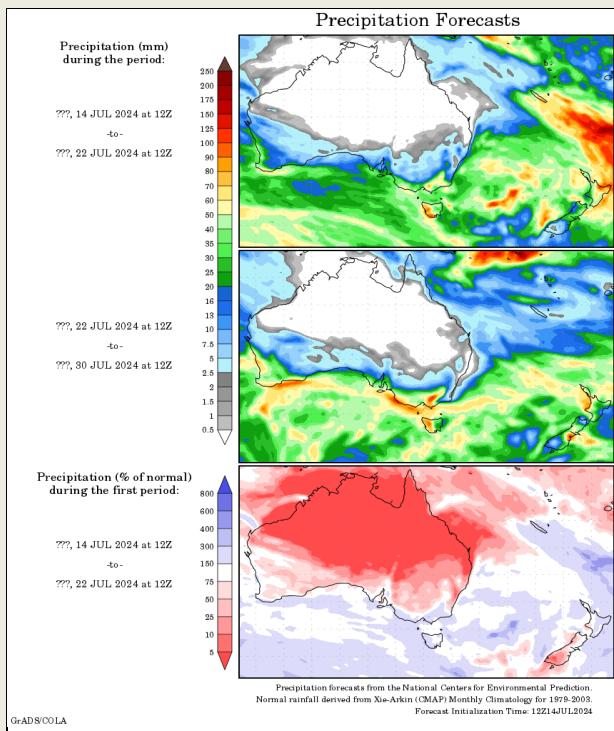
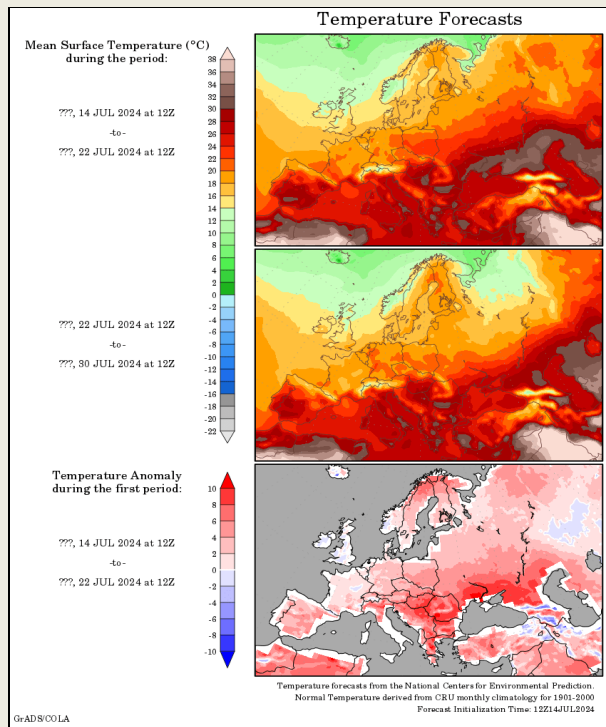
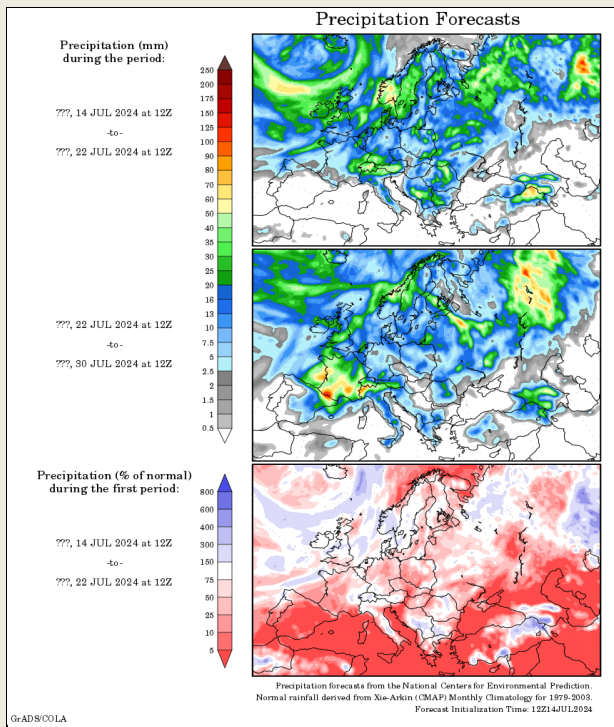


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Rainfall in the next seven days will be limited mainly to the northern half of the region where some pockets may receive a little too much leading to fieldwork delays and localized flooding. Southern production areas from Portugal through the Balkan Countries will still have net drying with a rising need for more moisture. Extreme heat will occur in Italy and the Balkan Countries where livestock and crop stress is most likely. Temperatures may reach 110 Fahrenheit in the Balkan Countries next week.

AUSTRALIA : Conditions in the next seven days will be mostly favorable for the region with a mix of rain shower activity and sunshine; though, some pockets of the region could still use greater rainfall, especially in South Australia and in northeastern production areas of Western Australia. There is also a growing need for more rain in Queensland, which will receive the least rainfall in the first week of the outlook. Occasional rain shower activity will occur through Wednesday. Total moisture is expected to vary from: □ None in Queensland □ A trace to 0.35 inch elsewhere □ Locally more than 0.50 inch, especially in Victoria and Western Australia



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
