



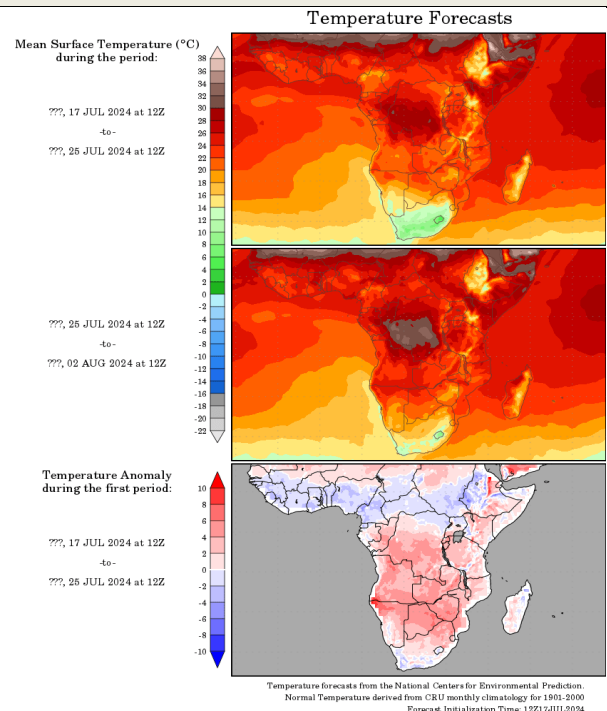
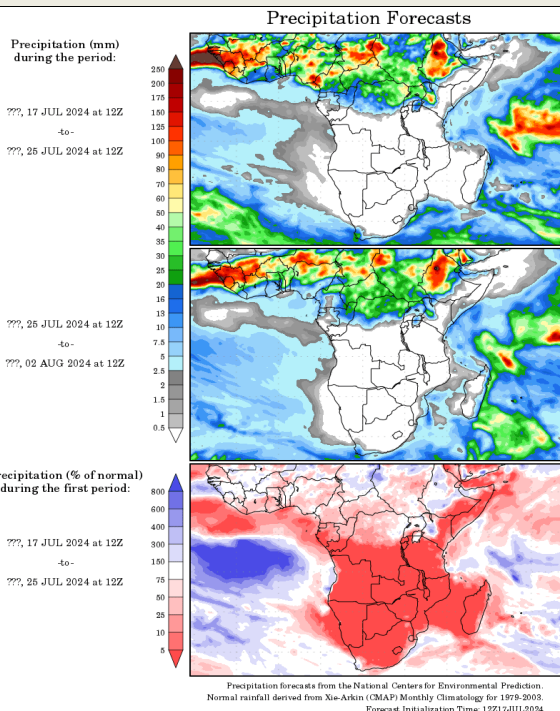
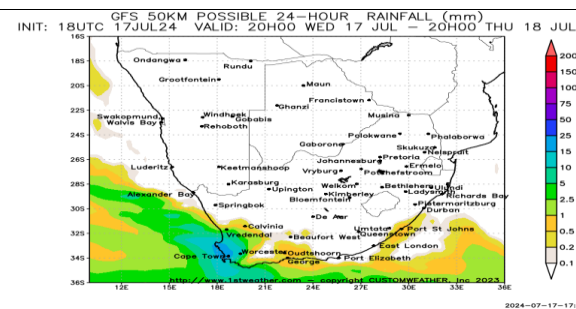
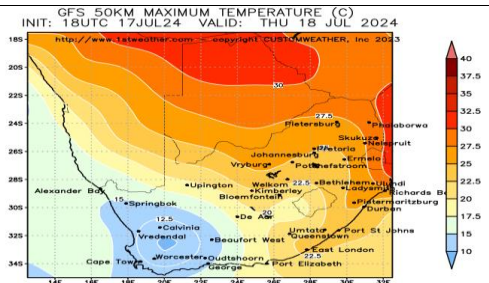
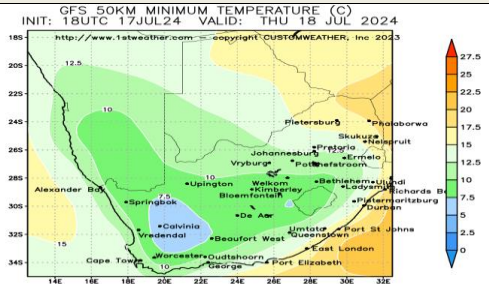
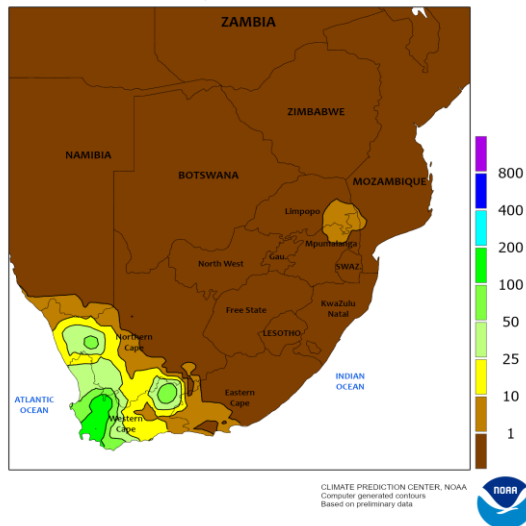
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA : Drier biased conditions will persist for much of South Africa through the middle of next week. Western Cape will still see periods of rain that will maintain good winter wheat prospects. The lack of rain in the main summer crop areas will maintain a good environment for harvesting. South Africa will generally be drier than normal through the middle of next week. However, Western Cape will see periods of light rain through early this weekend. Moisture totals by next Wednesday morning will range from 0.10-0.75" with local amounts of 1.50" or more in southwestern Western Cape. The remaining production areas will be dry or mostly dry. A few light showers will be possible in Natal and neighboring locations, though resulting rainfall will be lost to evaporation. Southern and western South Africa will have a few opportunities for light rain July 25 – 31. The remaining production areas will receive little to no rain.

July 7 - 13, 2024

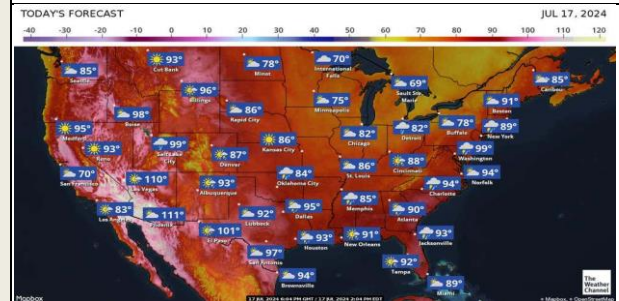
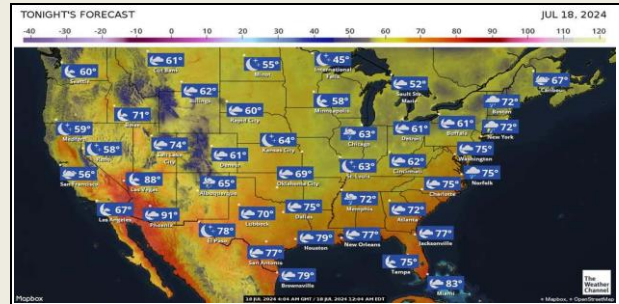


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST : A combination of favorable soil moisture in place today, mild temperatures through much of the next ten days, and multiple rounds of rain in much of the region during the next two weeks will keep conditions for corn pollination and other crop development favorable and production potentials will remain high. o The next week will be colder than normal in much of the region with much colder than normal temperatures at times in western and central areas and today into Thursday coldest overall when highs in the middle 70s to the lower 80s are most common.

U.S. Delta : The Delta and the Southeast will see a highly beneficial increase in showers and thunderstorms today through next Wednesday that will result in increases in soil moisture and improvements in crop conditions across the region. Additional showers July 25-31 will slow drying rates and perpetuate favorable crop conditions into at least early August. Rain July 25-31 will not be evenly distributed, but all areas will receive rain at one time or another and as long as timely rain returns in early August crop conditions should be mostly favorable.



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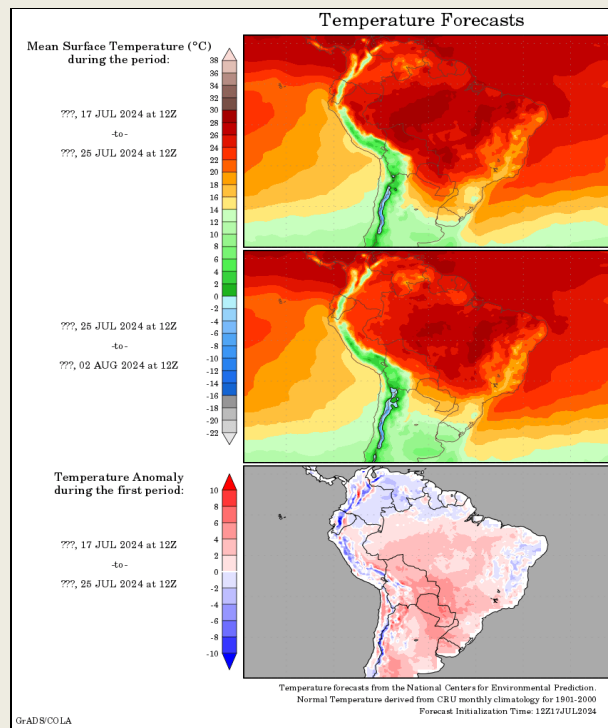
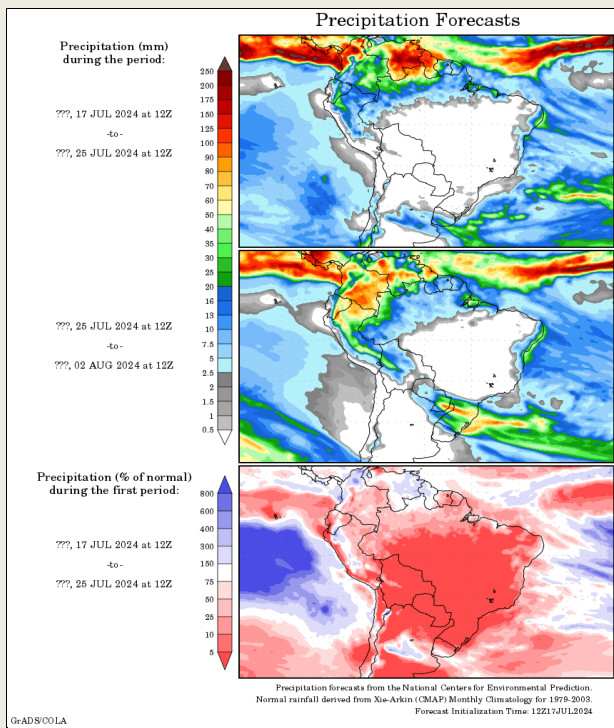
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A restricted rainfall pattern will occur during the next two weeks in Brazil and Paraguay and Safrinha corn harvesting and other fieldwork will advance well around regular rounds of light showers in northeastern Brazil and infrequent rounds of light showers in southern Brazil.

ARGENTINA: A large part of Argentina will receive rain Thursday into Sunday and most winter wheat in the driest areas in the west as well as wheat in central and east-central areas will benefit from the moisture while most other days are dry during the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well around a few showers on occasion. o Rain Thursday into Sunday will be greatest from northern Cordoba and southern Santiago del Estero to southern Entre Rios where totals will be 0.30-1.30" and locally more.

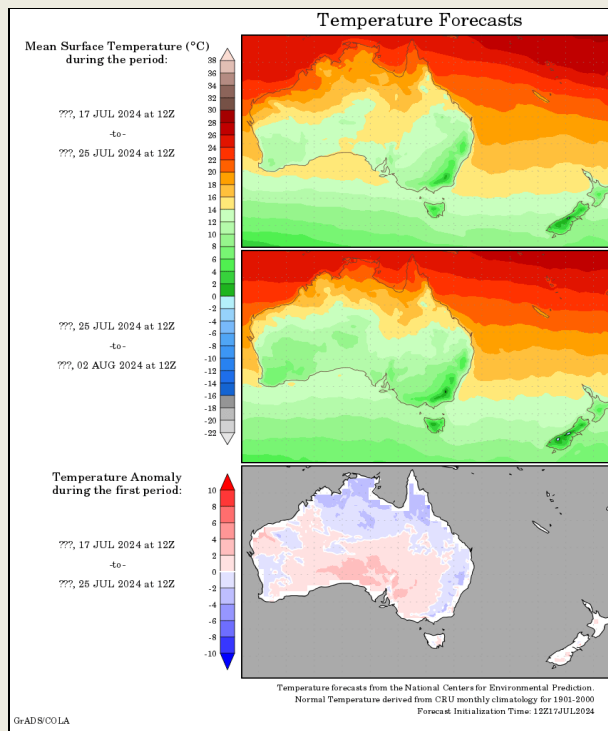
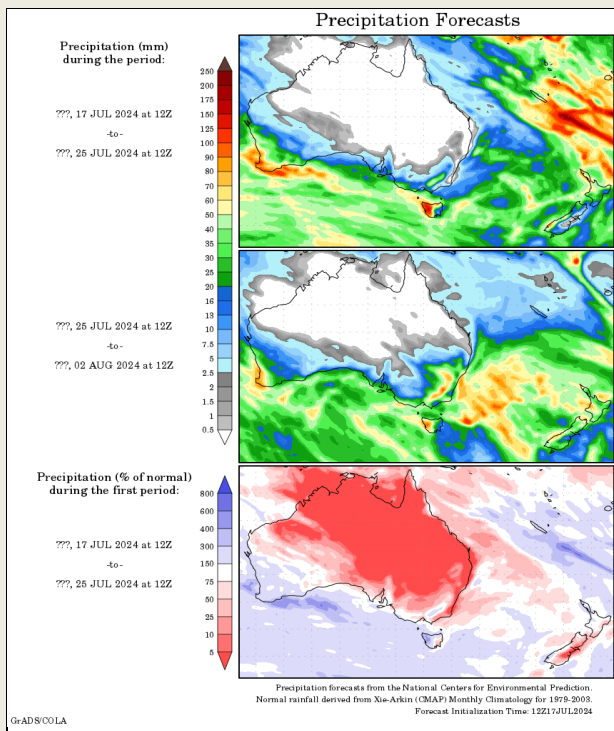
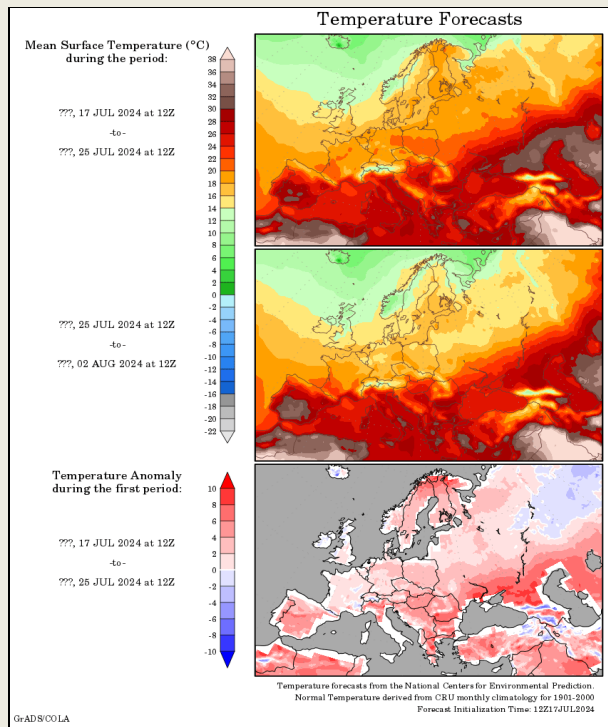
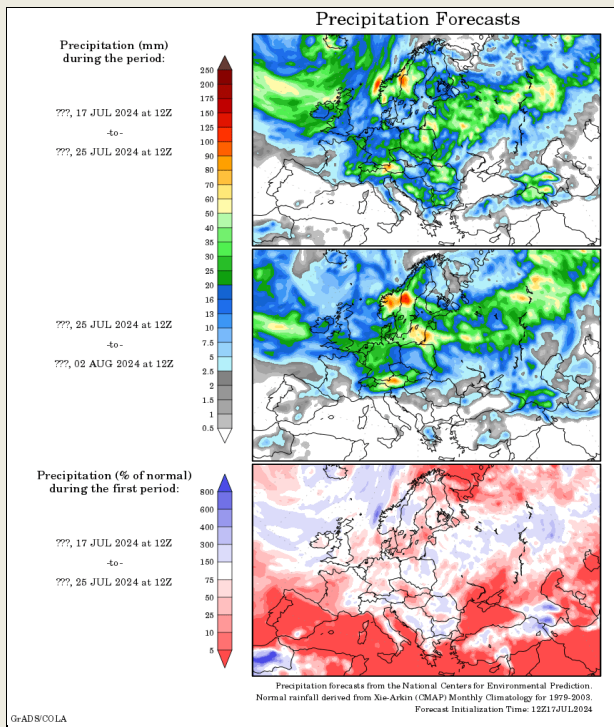


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Conditions in the first week of the outlook will be favorable with some exceptions. Extreme heat in the Balkan Countries will further stress crops; though, some erratic rain is expected and will provide a little topsoil moisture improvement, at least temporarily. Spain and Portugal will still be the driest; though, this area does not typically get much rain at this time of year. Conditions in northern Europe will be nearly ideal with a favorable mix of rain and sunshine.

AUSTRALIA : Conditions in the first week of the outlook will continue to be mostly favorable. Some needed rain is expected in South Australia and especially southwestern Western Australia, which will help support winter crops. Queensland will continue to be drier than preferred. Winter crops are still establishing in some areas, although most of the crop is gradually becoming semi-dormant which is a perfect opportunity for soil moisture to be fully restored before spring growth begins in late August and September.



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
