


# Weather Report 22 July 2024


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
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
## South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will generally receive little to no rain through the end of next week. Western Cape will still see periods of rain that will maintain favorable winter wheat conditions. Harvesting of the summer crops will advance swiftly in the remaining production areas. Southwestern Western Cape received 0.32-1.26" of rain Thursday. A few other locations in Western Cape and western Northern Cape received up to 0.16" of rain. The remaining locations were dry. High temperatures peaked into the 50s and 60s in Western Cape and western Northern Cape. Highs elsewhere were in the 70s and 80s with pockets in eastern South Africa warming to the lower 90s. Low temperatures this morning were in the 30s and 40s with many areas in eastern South Africa only cooling to the 50s and 60s. Pockets in Free State, North West, and Eastern Cape also cooled to the 20s









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## **United States of America - Weather**

U.S. MIDWEST: Temperatures were well below normal in much of the Midwest Thursday while much of the region was dry. Temperatures were well below normal in much of the Midwest Thursday while nuch of the region was dry. Colder than normal temperatures will continue through Thursday in mucl of the region with much colder than normal temperatures during the next several days in the southwest and highs through Monday across the Midwest in the upper 70s and lower 80s most often. U.S. DELTA: Many of the driest areas from Georgia through the Carolinas and southern Virginia received welcome rain Thursday while beneficial rain also fell on parts of the central and southern Delta and a few other areas. The Delta and the Southeast will frequent rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next week that will bring enough rain to result in increases in soil moisture nd improvements in crop conditions across the region.

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
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
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## **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: Brazil and Paraguay were mostly dry and saw favorable conditions for fieldwork Thursday. o High temperatures were in the middle 70s to the lower 90s Fahrenheit with some middle and a few upper 90s in the west and some 60s and lower 70s in the south. A restricted rainfall pattern will occur during the next two weeks in Brazil and Paraguay and Safrinha corn harvesting and other fieldwork wil advance well around regular rounds of light showers in northeastern Brazil and infrequent rounds of light showers in southern Brazil.


ARGENTINA: Rain increased Thursday and fell from west-central Entre Rios and nearby Santa Fe to reas just south of east-central Entre Rios temporarily interrupting fieldwork while the moisture was beneficial to winter crops. Two rounds of rain by Wednesday will bring rain to most areas from ordoba and Santiago del Estero to southern Entre Rios and Buenos Aires and most winter wheat in the driest areas in the west as well as wheat in other parts of the region will see temporary benefits from the moisture.











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
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
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
## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Condition in the first week of the outlook will improve in the Balkan Countries and some of Italy due to greater rain and cooler-trending temperatures. This will help to reduce crop and livestock stress. Conditions in northern Europe will continue to be nearly ideal. Shower and thunderstorm activity will occur in the region daily through Thursday o Total moisture will vary from 0.35 to 2.00 inches in around 45% to 60% of the region with some local amounts of more than 2.50 inches Eless rain is likely in the second week, July 26 – Aug. 2, compared to the first week

AUSTRALIA: Conditions in the first week of the outlook will be favorable in most of the region. Some needed rain will occur in production areas of the south, especially in Western Australia. Winter crops continue to establish in some areas; though, most of the crop is gradually becoming semi-dormant with the recent cool temperatures. Occasional rain shower activity will occur in southern areas through Thursday o Total moisture will vary from: © 0.35 to 1.50 inches from southwestern Western Australia through southern Victoria © 0.10 to 0.35 inch in New South Wales © Little to none in Queensland









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
