


# Weather Report 23 July 2024


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
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
## South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will receive little to no rain this week. However, Western Cape and neighboring areas will occasionally receive light rain that will limit drying at times. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable for western South Africa while timely rain would be welcome in Free State. Late-season harvesting of the summer crops will otherwise advance swiftly. Much of South Africa will receive little to no rain this week o However, Western Cape and coastal sections of Eastern Cape and Natal will see periods of light rain as disturbances track nearby @ Western Cape will receive 0.10-0.50" of rain with local amounts of 1.00" or more in the southwest corner by next Monday morning @ Any rain that occurs elsewhere will be lost to evaporation • Southern and eastern South Africa will have a few opportunities for light rain July 30 – August 5 o The remaining production areas will receive little to no rain









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## **United States of America - Weather**

U.S. MIDWEST: A favorable mix of rain and sunshine is expected across most of the Midwes naintaining a very good summer crop development environment. Some routine fieldwork will also advance normally. There is potential for a few pockets of moisture stress in the far western production areas as time moves along the ground begins to firm up. Winter wheat harvesting should advance favorable, as well, although it will have to work around some periodic rainfall U.S. DELTA: Portions of the southeastern states will trend too wet in the coming ten days. Most of the moisture deficits that have built up in recent weeks will slowly be whittled down or completely eliminated. Fieldwork will be slowed, although most crops will benefit from the rain for a while. Eventually, the need for drying will develop. Frequent bouts of rain and thunderstorms are expected through the next two weeks o Ten day rain totals in the Delta should vary from 1.00 to 3.50 inches with the north driest and the south wettest

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



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
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
## **South America - Weather**

BRAZIL: Dry weather during the weekend and that which is expected most of this workweek will be ideal in speeding along Safrinha crop maturation and harvest progress. Drier weather in some of the heat areas will also be welcome especially in Rio Grande do Sul where planting is still incomplete. Rain that evolves in the south late this weekend into early next week will set back fieldwork once again ARGENTINA: Weekend precipitation was a little lighter than expected leaving many wheat and barley areas in need of greater moisture to induce better crop establishment. The dry biased conditions were good for late season summer crop harvesting and a little late season winter crop planting. Warmer emperatures will induce greater evaporation and drying which may eventually lead to some crop noisture stress without greater rain.









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
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
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
## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Very warm temperatures during the weekend stressed some livestock and crops with poor soil moisture; however, some much needed relief from dryness occurred in Romania, Serbia and Bulgaria. Other areas in southeastern Europe still need more rain; including portions of Ukraine. Temperatures will trend cooler this week and additional rain will occur briefly between periods of sunshine to support crops throughout the continent. Late season winter crop harvesting will advance around showers in the north.

AUSTRALIA: Weather and soil conditions will continue to be favorable in most of the region during the next two weeks. Rainfall will be greatest in Western Australia which will maintain improved soil moisture for this part of the region. Some rain shower activity will occur in Queensland which will be beneficial; though, more will be needed in the winter for spring crop development.









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
