

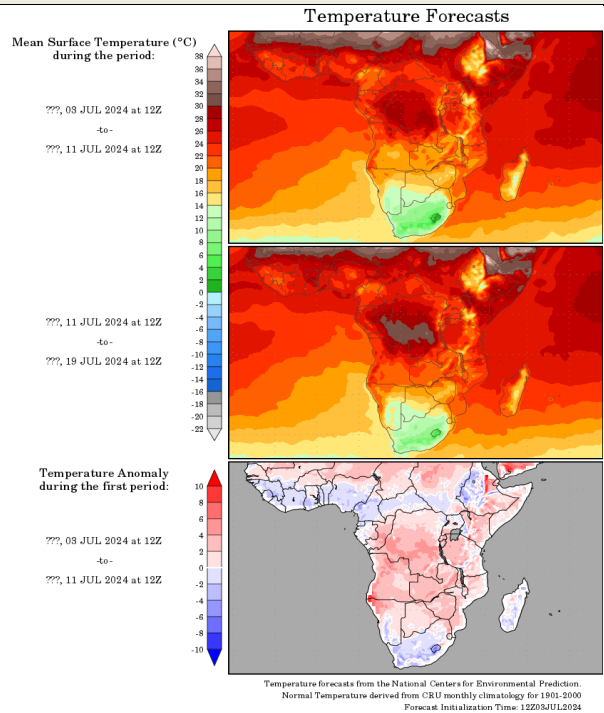
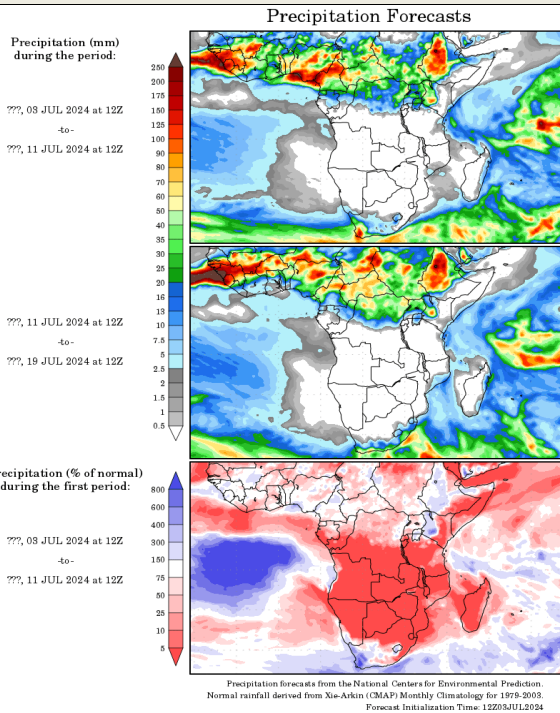
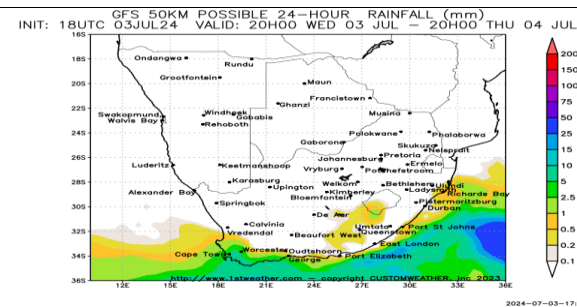
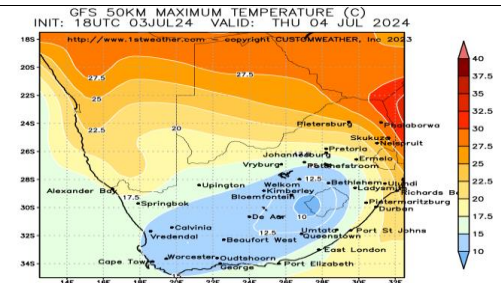
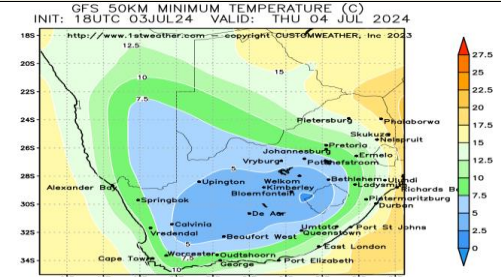
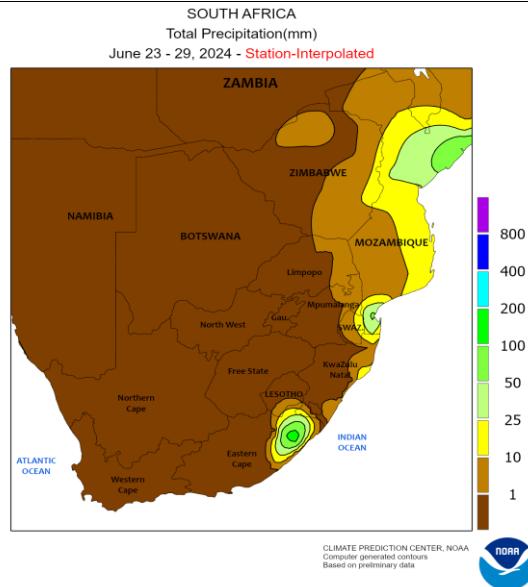


# **Weather Report**

## **04 July 2024**

## South Africa - Weather

**SOUTH AFRICA :** Western Cape and neighboring areas will have several opportunities for rain through the middle of next week. The precipitation will maintain a good outlook for the winter wheat. The main summer crop areas will otherwise remain mostly dry and harvesting will continue with few disruptions. South Africa will have a few opportunities for rain through the middle of next week. Frontal boundaries will often generate rain in southern and western South Africa on a near daily basis. Southwestern Western Cape will receive 2.00-6.00" of rain by next Wednesday morning. Other locations in Western Cape into western Northern Cape will receive 0.25-1.50" of rain with local amounts over 2.00". Eastern Cape and southern Northern Cape will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain. Most other production areas will be dry or not receive enough rain to counter evaporation. Western and southern South Africa will again have a few opportunities for rain July 11 – 17. Rainfall will be greatest in Western Cape. The remaining production areas will receive little to no rain.

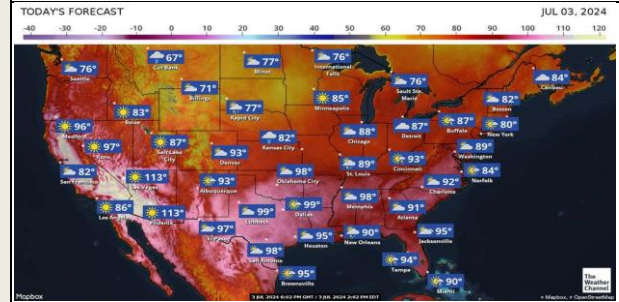
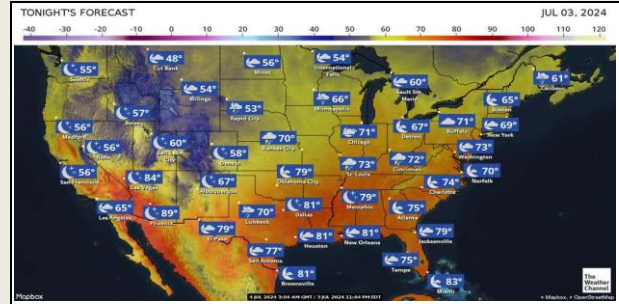

## United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST :** The Ohio River Basin has missed much of the significant rain and increases in soil moisture seen in the remainder of the Midwest recently and multiple rounds of rain and through Monday along with mostly mild temperatures through the next week will improve conditions for crops and induce some increases in soil moisture. o The remainder of the Corn Belt will also see multiple rounds of rain through Monday that will keep the soil moist and maintain high yield potentials.

**U.S. DELTA :** After limited rain into Thursday an important period of increased shower and thunderstorm activity will occur Thursday night into Wednesday, July 11 when nearly all of the Delta and the Southeast receive multiple rounds of rain. o Enough rain should fall to improve soil moisture and crop conditions, but widespread soakings of rain are not expected and with warm to hot temperatures in place during much of the period lasting improvements in crop and soil conditions are not likely without follow-up rain.

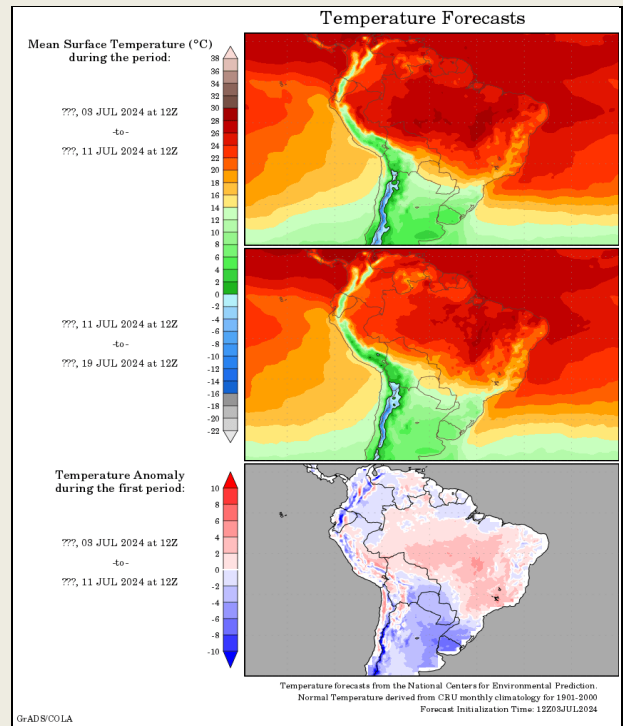
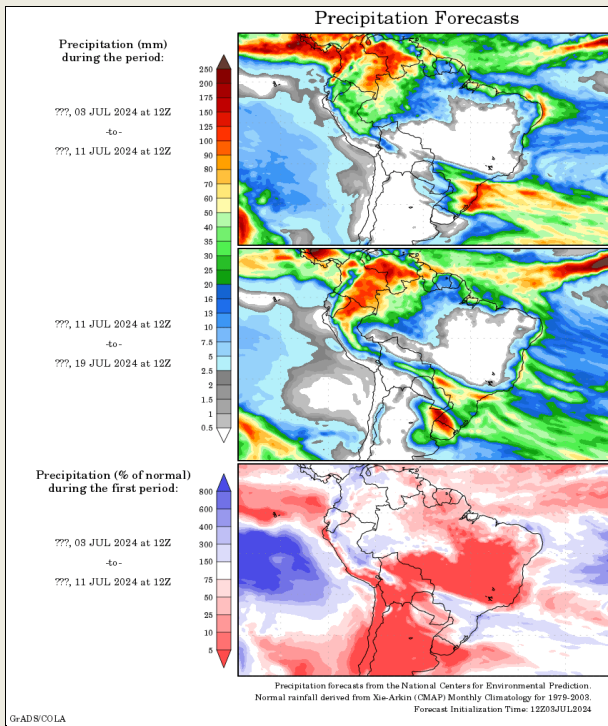
## South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Southern Brazil and Paraguay will see regular rounds of showers through the next two weeks that will slow planting of winter wheat once again in Rio Grande do Sul and Santa Catarina, but rain will not be focused on the region through the period and some fieldwork will advance. o Areas from central and southern Paraguay and central and southern Mato Grosso do Sul to Parana will see regular rounds of showers that will slow fieldwork at times, but some fieldwork should advance between rounds of rain.

**ARGENTINA :** Argentina will see dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork most often through the next two weeks with a few rounds of light showers that will favor northeastern areas. o Winter wheat planting should advance well and although much of the country has enough soil moisture for the crop to germinate, many areas would benefit from greater rain to ensure the crop becomes well-established. ☐ The greatest need for rain is in west-central and northwestern Argentina where the soil is dry enough that the crop may struggle to germinate in some areas.

## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE** : Rainfall in the next seven days will be more than preferred for some areas, leading to some fieldwork delays and localized flooding. This will be mainly an issue for central parts of the region, especially near the Alps and in France where topsoil moisture is already excessive. The rain will be beneficial and needed in the Balkan Countries.

**AUSTRALIA** : Recent rain and that which is expected through the next ten days will support wheat, barley and canola emergence and establishment. Sufficient rain will fall in New South Wales and South Australia to bolster soil moisture significantly beginning Thursday night in South Australia and shifting to Queensland and northern New South Wales Saturday into Monday. Victoria, Queensland and southern New South Wales as well as a few eastern Western Australia crop areas will be driest during the next two weeks.
