
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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will generally receive little or no rain this week. Western Cape will still have a few opportunities for precipitation that will maintain a good outlook for the winter wheat. Free State would benefit from a boost in rain late this month into September to support good wheat prospects. South Africa will generally trend drier than normal this week o A frontal boundary will still promote rain in Western Cape and neighboring areas Tuesday ® Coastal Eastern Cape and Natal will have a few opportunities for light rain as well ® Portions of southwestern Western Cape will receive 0.25-1.00" of rain with local amounts up to 2.00" by next Monday morning ® Other locations in South Africa will either be dry or not receive enough rain to counter evaporation ® South Africa will be drier biased August 20 – 26 o Light rain will still be possible in southern and eastern South Africa










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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A timely period of wetter weather today through Friday will restore some of the soil moisture and improve conditions for crop development in the drier areas across the Midwest while keeping soil moisture favorable and yield potentials high elsewhere. O Rain will be most important from eastern Nebraska into western lowa where precipitation is expected Tuesday into Wednesday while eastern Kansas into Missouri benefitted from rain Sunday into this morning and will benefit from additional rain during the next few days.

U.S. DELTA: Rain will be infrequent and often light during the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast and flood conditions will steadily improve in areas impacted by Hurricane Debby while crop stress increases and expands in the drier areas from the Delta into western Alabama. O Some rain is expected and the rain will be important in areas where crop stress has begun to increase, but is not yet serious, with the rain likely to buy crops more time before greater stress evolves while the rain may not be great enough to significantly improve crop conditions in the driest areas.










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
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South America - Weather


BRAZIL. Harvesting of Safrinha corn and other fieldwork will advance well during the next two weeks with some interruptions to fieldwork resulting from rain from southern Paraguay into far southern Brazil Aug. 19-21. o Parts of southern Rio Grande do Sul will see light showers Friday into Sunday. o Rain will return to southern Paraguay and far southern Brazil Aug. 19-21 when most of the region receives 0.25-1.25" of rain and locally more. o Scattered showers will continue in southern Paraguay and southern Brazil Aug. 22-24.
ARGENTINA: Mostly dry weather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will occur through much of


ANGEN INA: Mostly ory weather and ravorable conditions for neidwork will occur through much of the next two weeks leaving winter wheat in western parts of the country in need of greater rain with temporary interruptions to fieldwork resulting from rain Sunday into Tuesday of next week in southern, central, and eastern Argentina. o Rain will increase Sunday into Tuesday of next week when much of southern, central, and eastern Argentina receives 0.15-1.0" and locally more.











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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Conditions in the next seven days will still be warmer and drier than preferred in southern production areas leading to some more crop and livestock stress, mainly in fields that did not receive much rain this past weekend. Romania should receive some more beneficial rainfall though. Also, portions of the Balkan Countries will be doing better for a while due torecent rainfall; however, evaporation rates will be high. Northern production areas of Europewill still be mostly favorable.

AUSTRALIA: Conditions in the next seven days will be mostly favorable. Some needed rain will occur in Queensland and South Australia; though, more will be needed in South Australia for use in spring. The rain will likely lead to minor fieldwork delays. Rain will be particularly significant along and near the coast of Queensland which will mainly impact some sugarcane areas.
