
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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: Drier biased conditions are slated for much of South Africa through the middle of next week. Winter wheat prospects will remain favorable for much of Western Cape and Northern Cape despite the lack of rain. Free State's wheat areas would still welcome a boost in rain in September. Be South Africa will generally trend drier than normal through the middle of next week o However, a frontal boundary will promote mostly light rain for western, southern, and eventually eastern South Africa today into Friday B Portions of Western Cape, Natal, and neighboring locations will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain with locally greater amounts by next Wednesday morning B Most other locations will either be dry not receive enough rain to counter evaporation B South Africa will remain drier biased September 5 – 11 o Light rain will still be possible in southern and eastern South Africa









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Nearly all of the Midwest will receive at least some rain by Saturday that will be beneficial for late crop development before dry weather and favorable conditions for crop maturation are most common Sunday through Sep. 11 while most crops that are still limmature have enough soil moisture to support crops to maturity. o The southwestern Corn Belt and southeastern Ohio will benefit most from rain this week and the moisture may induce some minor increases in crop yields. o Another round of rain will occur Sep. 5-6.

U.S. DELTA: Little to no rain today will lead to increasing and expanding crop stress from the Delta through into western, central, and northern Georgia and the Florida Panhandle as the soil continues tdry out while in areas where crops are more advanced, maturation and harvesting should occur favorably. o The remainder of the Southeast has enough soil moisture in place to favorably support crop development this week with







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
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
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South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Fieldwork will advance well during the next two weeks around occasional rounds of mostly light showers in northeastern and southern Brazil and southern Paraguay and better-organized rain in southern Paraguay and far southern Brazil Saturday into Sunday. o Rain will increase in the south Saturday into Sunday when most areas from central Paraguay to Rio Grande do Sul and Santa Catarina receive up to 0.35" of fain and locally more.


ARGENTINA: Winter wheat in the driest areas of Cordoba, San Luis, southern Santiago del Estero, and parts of northeastern La Pampa will benefit from rain Thursday into Saturday while winter wheat from that region to east-central and southeastern Argentina benefits from rain as well. o Southern Santa Fe to southern Entre Rios and the northern and eastern halves of Buenos Aires will be wettest Thursday into Saturday and much of the region will receive 0.75-2.0" of rain and locally more.











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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Conditions will trend drier in central Europe this week which will be good for better fieldwork advancement and crop maturation. There will be some more shower and thunderstorm activity today before the drier trend occurs. Heat and dryness concerns will continue for the eastern Balkan Countries. The western Balkan Countries will receive some needed rainfall today through Tuesday.

AUSTRALIA: Dry and unusually warm weather will still occur across a majority of the region through the first week of the outlook. This will cause more stress for unirrigated winter crops, which will be reproducing soon if they have not already begun. Dryness concerns remain greatest in South Australia and Queensland where soil moisture is lowest. Any rain will occur mainly in southwestern Western Australia and part of Victoria.









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
