


# Weather Report 06 August 2024


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
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
## South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: South Africa will generally receive little to no rain this week. Periods of erratic precipitation will still occur in Western Cape, which will maintain favorable winter wheat prospects. Wheat prospects will remain good in Northern Cape as well while Free State would welcome a boost ir rain. B' South Africa will generally trend drier than normal this week o A frontal boundary will promote rain in Western Cape and neighboring areas Friday and Saturday B Light rain will also be possible in Western Cape later this weekend B Dry or mostly dry weather will occur most other days B Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 0.10-0.75° in Western Cape with local amounts over 1.50° in the southwest corner B Other locations will either be dry or not receive enough rain to counter evaporation B South Africa will be drier biased August 13 – 19 o Light rain will still be possible in southern and eastern South Africa









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
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
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
## **United States of America - Weather**

U.S. MIDWEST: A large part of the Midwest will dry down during the next two weeks, but most crops will not see serious crops stress as outside of some heat today in the west, temperatures through the next ten days will often be mild while subsoil moisture is still adequate to support the needs of most crops. o Some crop stress is likely in the drier areas in the west as topsoil moisture has become short is some areas and as the subsoil dries down it should eventually become dry enough that crop stress increases and yield potentials decline.

U.S. DELTA: Hurricane Debby made landfall on the Big Bend region of Florida earlier this morning and will bring flooding rain to areas from the state's northern Peninsula and south-central and southesstern Georgia to southern Virginia today into Friday causing damage to lowlying crops and personal property. o The storm's winds should not be strong enough to produce cropthreatening winds in Florida or southern Georgia with a few small exceptions where stronger gusts occur.







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
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
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## **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: Harvesting of Safrinha corn and other fieldwork will advance well during the next two weeks with some additional interruptions to fieldwork resulting from rain into Thursday from Paraguay into outhern Brazil with Rio Grande do Sul seeing most of the significant rain. o Rain into Thursday will be greatest from west-central to southern Rio Grande do Sul where totals will be 1.0-2.50" of rain and ocally more while the remainder of Rio Grande do Sul receives 0.30-1.0" and locally more with much of the rain falling today into Wednesday.


ARGENTINA: Outside of rain into Wednesday in northeastern and southeastern Argentina, mostly dry veather and favorable conditions for fieldwork will occur through much of the next two weeks leaving winter wheat in western parts of the country in need of greater rain. o Rain into Wednesday will be greatest from northeastern Santa Fe into southeastern Chaco and Corrientes receive 0.75-2.0" and locally more while much of Buenos Aires receives up to 0.75" and locally more. 2 Light showers will urround these areas while most other locations are dry.











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
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
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
## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Conditions in the next seven days will still be warmer and drier than preferred in southern production areas leading to some more crop and livestock stress, mainly in fields that did not receive much rain this past weekend. Romania should receive some more beneficial rainfall though. Also, portions of the Balkan Countries will be doing better for a while due to recent rainfall; however, evaporation rates will be high. Northern production areas of Europe will still be mostly favorable.

AUSTRALIA: Rainfall in the next ten days will be limited. This won't be an issue for now since winter crops are likely semi-dormant with a low demand of precipitation; however, the need for greater rainfall will increase in some areas, especially Queensland, South Australia and eastern portions of Western Australia crop country. Queensland will need the moisture soonest since crops there will reproduce in early September.









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
