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



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
## **United States of America - Weather**

U.S. MIDWEST : Mostly dry and favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting will continue before a wetter weather pattern affects portions of the central and southern Midwest Thursday into Sep. 20 with many western and some eastern parts of the Midwest likely to remain in drier-biased weather pattern through much of the next two weeks. o The remnants of Potential Tropical Cyclone Six will bring significant rain to areas from east-central and southeastern Missouri to west-central and southern Indiana and Kentucky Thursday into Friday before southern Wisconsin to Kentucky sees rain Friday through next Monday.

U.S. DELTA : Potential Tropical Cyclone Six will bring heavy rain and some flooding to the Delta Wednesday into Thursday with moderate to heavy rain extending to the east into Georgia and northern Florida Wednesday into Friday. O Some cotton will be discolored by the rain while some cotton is likely to be strung from the boll, especially in the Delta while most other crops outside of areas that are flooded, should not be seriously threatened by the storm.







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


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# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE : Conditions will trend drier in central Europe this week which will be good for better fieldwork advancement and crop maturation. There will be some more shower and thunderstorm activity today before the drier trend occurs. Heat and dryness concerns will continue for the eastern Balkan Countries will receive some needed rainfall today through Tuesday. AUSTRALLA : Rainfall will be limited in key production areas through Saturday before a stronger storm system impacts mainly the eastern half of Australia. Rain from this system will be important for Queensland and the drier areas of New South Wales; however, a majority of the rain may be east of South Australia leaving that state too dry and in need of greater rainfall.



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
