
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
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
South Africa - Weather

SOUTH AFRICA: Periods of erratic rain are still slated for portions of southern and eastern South Africa through the middle of next week. The main winter wheat areas will miss out in much of the rain, though wheat prospects will remain generally good. A good shot of rain would still be welcome in the dryland areas of Free State later this month before crops start maturing. South Africa will have a few opportunities for rainfall through the middle of next week o A disturbance will initially help promote mostly light rain in eastern and southern South Africa through Thursday o Another round of rain is stated for southern and eastern South Africa this weekend and early next week o Several areas in Eastern Cape, Natal, and Mpumalanga will receive 0.10-1.00" of rain by next Wednesday morning with coastal sections of Natal and Eastern Cape 2.00" of rain or slightly more @ Other locations will be dry o not receive enough rain to counter evaporation @ South Africa will again have opportunities for rain September 19 – 25 o Rainfall will likely be greatest in the eastern half of the country









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
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
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Starting with the remnants of Hurricane Francine in the lower Midwest Thursday, the Midwest will see a wetter weather pattern through Sep. 21 with the rain beneficial for winter crops while the rain should be too light and infrequent in most areas to cause more than temporary interruptions to harvesting, o The remnants of Hurricane Francine will bring significant rain to areas from southeastern Missouri to west-central and southern Indiana and interior eastern Kentucky Thursday into Friday. ® The soil is dry enough that lasting delays to fieldwork should not occur while the moisture will be beneficial for winter crops.

U.S. DELTA: Hurricane Francine will bring heavy rain and some flooding to the Delta through western Georgia and the Florida Panhandle today into Friday with moderate to heavy rain extending into the remainder of Georgia and northern Florida. o Some cotton will be discolored by the rain and some cotton may be strung from the boll where rain is heaviest while some sugarcane in Louisiana should be damaged by the storm's winds with little significant crop damage likely elsewhere outside of crops damaged by flooding.







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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Conditions will trend drier in central Europe this week which will be good for better fieldwork advancement and crop maturation. There will be some more shower and thunderstorm activity today before the drier trend occurs. Heat and dryness concerns will continue for the eastern Balkan Countries. The western Balkan Countries will receive some needed rainfall today through Tuesday.

AUSTRALIA: Greater rainfall is still needed, particularly in South Australia, Queensland, and northern New South Wales where soil moisture is lowest. There will be some occasional rain shower activity in Queensland and New South Wales in the first week of the outlook which will be beneficial, but much more will be needed.









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
