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
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
South Africa - Weather


SOUTH AFRICA: Rainfall will remain limited for much of South Africa through the end of next week. Light rain will be possible in southern and eastern South Africa, though most locations will not receive enough rain to significantly impact long-term soil conditions. Winter wheat prospects will remain generally good despite the lack of rain. South Africa will remain drier than normal through the middle of next week o However, frontal boundaries will promote periods of light rain in southern and eastern South Africa today into early next week o A few locations along the Eastern Cape and Natal coastlines will receive 0.50 - 2.00" of rain by next Wednesday morning


Many rain that occurs elsewhere will generally be too light to impact longterm soil conditions

South Africa will remain drier biased September 12 – 18 o Light rain will still be possible in southern and eastern South Africa









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Dry and favorable conditions for crop maturation and early harvesting will occur through much of the next two weeks with most northern and eastern parts of the Midwest seeing at least some rain today into Friday. o Temperatures will be mostly seasonable this week with a notable period of colder than normal temperatures arriving in the far northwest Thursday and spreading into the remainder of the Midwest this weekend when highs in the middle 60s to the middle 70s are most common.

U.S. DELTA: Moderate to heavy rain will fall today into Saturday from the southern third of the Delta to central and eastern South Carolina, southern Georgia, and northern Florida where immature crops will benefit from the rain while harvesting will be interrupted and some cotton should be discolored. o A much drier weather pattern will resume in most areas Saturday and will continue through much of the remainder of the next two weeks and conditions for crop maturation and harvesting will quickly improve while some cotton that is discolored should be bleached white.







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
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
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rio Grande do Sul will see several rounds of rain during the next two weeks with fieldwork likely to advance between rounds of precipitation while rain is infrequent and light elsewhere where fieldwork should advance swiftly. o Much of Rio Grande do Sul, Santa Catarina, and parts of southern Paraguay will receive 0.10-0.75" of rain and locally more today. Elighter rain will fall on some nearby areas while most other locations are dry. o A large part of southern Rio Grande do Sul will receive 0.15 0.90" of rain and locally more Saturday into Sunday.


ARGENTINA: Dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common through the next two


ARGENTINA: Dry and favorable conditions for fieldwork will be most common through the next two weeks with a few light showers on occasion and rain in parts of northeastern Argentina today while winter wheat in western Argentina that missed out on significant rain during the past weekend will remain in need of greater rain. o Most areas from southeastern Chaco to Corrientes will receive up to 0.75" of rain and locally more today while most other areas are dry.











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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Conditions will trend drier in central Europe this week which will be good for better fieldwork advancement and crop maturation. There will be some more shower and thunderstorm activity today before the drier trend occurs. Heat and dryness concerns will continue for the eastern Balkan Countries. The western Balkan Countries will receive some needed rainfall today through Tuesday.

AUSTRALIA: Concern about heat and dryness will prevail in Queensland and northern New South Wales during the next ten days. Reproduction of wheat and barley is under way and the lack of moisture in unirrigated areas is a threat to production. Southern Australia crop areas are in much better condition and expected to receive additional showers periodically to maintain a very good outlook for spring cereal and canola development









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
